A Lenten message from Fr. Patrick...

A New Lent...A New Beginning

Not too long ago a parishioner came up to me and said, "Father, I want to do something different for Lent so I can feel more connected to God." For me, this is exactly what Lent is all about, being drawn closer to God! It is all about starting over. Lent is a new beginning for all of us. It is a time to refresh our souls. It is another opportunity to encounter God more fully in our lives. Moreover, it is a season of growth and spiritual conversion, conversion of heart. It is another opportunity for us to get our lives back in order and grow in our awareness and appreciation of the importance of God in our lives.

Lent is a time for us to be renewed in the Spirit. It is time to renew our baptismal promises. Lent is a



time for personal evaluation, to trust more in God and to see where we need to grow in our relationship with the Lord. It gives us another opportunity to get things right again, to prioritize our lives accordingly, and to open our hearts once again to the loving presence and mercy of God. Lent is a time for renewal! It is a time to seek the Lord's forgiveness again and to render our lives over to Him!

The big question for us during this new season of Lent is: What do we have to do differently to turn our lives over to God?


The disciplines of Lent found in today's gospel help us to do this. They reassure us the pathway to God, through prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Maybe we need to spend more time in prayer this Lent. Prayer allows us to listen more closely to God. It gives us time to be still and alone in the silence of our hearts. Prayer draws us closer to God if we enter prayer with an openness of heart. The challenge here is making the time and effort each day to be alone with God.

The discipline of fasting is so essential. The big question here is: What do we need to fast from that disconnects us from God? For me, I try to watch less TV/News in the evening and spend more time doing some spiritual reading. Yes, it is important to give something up for Lent because making sacrifices is good. It makes us appreciate the many sacrifices that Jesus made for our eternal redemption. But better we fast from the things that prevent us from spending more time with the Lord, than fasting from our favorite foods per se; that only make us more bitter in the end or dreadful to be with. Better we do not fast from certain foods if it is only going to make us look gloomier in the end and be less happy. Better we feast instead. Feast on God's love and mercy in service to one another.

Moreover, Lent affords us to be more charitable with our resources and more mindful and sensitive to those who have less than we do. When it comes to charity, the scriptures remind us to give from our hearts, not from our surpluses. When giving, we need to give sacrificially. As long as we have the poor among us, there will always be more we can do. We always feel good when we give from our hearts. I am always grateful to see how generous we are in support of our church and parish outreach. It is also encouraging to see how generous we are in support of the Catholic Ministries Appeal each year. Perhaps even in these areas, is there more that we can do to help keep the Mission of the Church alive in our community today?

For me, when growing up, Lent was my least favorite season. But as I advance in years and grow in my own spirituality, I desire and look forward to Lent more and more each year for the reasons I stated above. As I grow older, I desire God more and more each day. Lent is another opportunity for us to wind down a bit and redirect our attention back to God, to see the world as God sees it. It is a time for us to reconnect with God and do something different. For me, I am going to try to find more time to pray before the Blessed Sacrament, something I need to do more often and to be extra grateful for the many blessings in my life.

I pray that we will all take this season, this new season of Lent more seriously than in years past, and grow in our own spirituality, with appreciation of God's love and mercy in our lives. This prepares us to celebrate the Easter Mysteries. I hope you can join us for our Annual Lenten Mission, which will take place in the church on Monday, March 18th, Tuesday, March 19th and Wednesday, March 20th at 7:30 PM. What a beautiful way for us to prepare for the Easter celebration! Fr. Gary George will lead us in prayer and reflection during these three evenings and speak at all the masses the weekend before. Hope to see you there!



LENTEN BAG CHALLENGE

During Lent, we are called to the spiritual practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Rest assured, you can do all of those things here!

Please take one reusable shopping bag. You'll find at each exit of the church.

Each bag has a list of needed items for Ernie's Place and Street Ministry. Please return the bag filled with the requested items to Ernie's Place or Fellowship Hall of the Church throughout the weeks of Lent.



LENTEN LITURGICAL NOTES

How we pray changes a bit during Lent so we may better enter more deeply into this season of conversion and transformation.

- The General Instruction of the Roman Missal reminds us, "In Lent the playing of the organ and musical instruments is allowed only in order to support the singing. Exceptions, however, are Laetare Sunday (Fourth Sunday of Lent), Solemnities, and Feasts." Therefore, you may hear a little less of the organ and piano throughout this season. We will have silence during the time of the Preparation of the Altar and the Presentation of the Gifts, except on the 4th Sunday of Lent.
- The <u>Gloria (Glory to God) is not said or sung</u> <u>during Lent</u>, some feast days. We will sing the Gloria again at the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper and then again at the Easter Vigil.
- The <u>Alleluia is omitted</u> from all hymns and as the Gospel Acclamation during Masses. We will chant a different verse during the season of Lent until the Easter Vigil.
- We will use the <u>Apostles' Creed</u> instead of the Nicene Creed. The Roman Missal (#19) clearly encourages the use of the Apostles' Creed during the seasons of Lent and Easter. The text can be found on the inside cover of the red *Ritual* Song hymnal.
- We will be using a Missal Chant during the season of Lent.
- During weekday (Daily Mass), we will not sing the Immaculate Mary after Mass has ended. This will return on the Monday of the Octave of Easter.

ABSTINENCE & FASTING

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth (14th) year are bound to abstain entirely from meat on all the Fridays of Lent.

All Catholics between the ages of eighteen (18) and fifty-nine (59) are also bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day. Those whose work or health would be impaired are excused from fast and abstinence. Individual conscience should decide proper cause for excuse. A more serious reason is required to excuse oneself from the Ash Wednesday and Good Friday fast and abstinence.

THE LITTLE BLACK BOOK

This Lent, St. John's is once again offering everyone a little black book. These books are available at the doors of the Church.

You can carry it with you, leave it in your car or keep it in a place at home where you will see it every day. It's a nice, simple way to bring the spirit of the season to each day of your Lenten journey. **The books are free of charge.** If you'd like to make a donation, please place it in the Poor Box to support the work of Parish Social Ministry.

Family Life Ministry



PASCHAL CANDLE

The Paschal Candle we have now has served as an incredible reminder of the light that shines through the darkness. At the Easter Vigil this year, we will prepare a new Paschal Candle. Because of our increased use of Seton Chapel we also purchase a smaller Paschal Candle for this space.

Both candles will burn throughout the Easter season and for all baptisms and funerals throughout the remainder of the year. It is a sign of the "Light of Christ" that shatters the darkness of our world. Our new candles are handmade from beeswax and will be a beautiful sign of Easter light and hope. Because it is beeswax and handmade, it is expensive.

A nice tradition has developed over the years at SJE. Members of the parish who had lost family members in

the past year made an offering in memory of their loved one to assist with the costs related to the candles. If you and/or your family would like to do that, we would be most grateful and appreciative. You can send a donation to the Parish Office. Please note clearly that it is for the new Paschal Candles and list the name of who you wish to remember.

Journey to the Foot of the Cross

10 Things to Remember For Lent

- Remember the formula. The Church does a good job capturing certain truths with easy-to-remember lists and formulas: 10 Commandments, 7 sacraments, 3 persons in the Trinity. For Lent, the Church gives us almost a slogan—Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving—as the three things we need to work on during the season
- It's a time of prayer. Lent is essentially an act of prayer spread out over 40 days. As we pray, we go on a journey, one that hopefully brings us closer to Christ and leaves us changed by the encounter with him.
- It's a time to fast. With the fasts of Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, meatless Fridays, and our personal disciplines interspersed, Lent is the only time many Catholics these days actually fast. And maybe that's why it gets all the attention. "What are you giving up for Lent? Hotdogs? Beer? Jelly beans?" It's almost a game for some of us, but fasting is actually a form of penance, which helps us turn away from sin and toward Christ.
- It's a time to work on discipline. The 40

days of Lent are also a good, set time to work on personal discipline in general. Instead of giving something up, it can be doing something positive. "I'm going to exercise more. I'm going to pray more. I'm going to be nicer to my family, friends and coworkers."

It's about dying to yourself. The more serious side of Lenten discipline is that it's about more than selfcontrol – it's about finding aspects of yourself that are less than Christ-like and letting them die. The suffering and death of Christ are foremost on our minds during Lent, and we join in these mysteries by suffering, dying with Christ and being resurrected in a purified form.



- Don't do too much. It's tempting to make Lent some ambitious period of personal reinvention, but it's best to keep it simple and focused. There's a reason the Church works on these mysteries year after year. We spend our entire lives growing closer to God. Don't try to cram it all in one Lent. That's a recipe for failure.
- Lent reminds us of our weakness. Of course, even when we set simple goals for ourselves during Lent, we still have trouble keeping them. When we fast, we realize we're all just one meal away from hunger. In both cases, Lent shows us our

weakness. This can be painful, but recognizing how helpless we are makes us seek God's help with renewed urgency and sincerity.

Be patient with yourself. When we're confronted with our own weakness during Lent, the temptation is to get angry and frustrated. "What a bad person I am!" But that's the wrong lesson. God is calling us to be patient and to see ourselves as he does, with unconditional love.

Reach out in charity. As we experience weakness and suffering during Lent, we

should be renewed in our compassion for those who are hungry, suffering or otherwise in need. The third part of the Lenten formula is almsgiving. It's about more than throwing a few extra dollars in the collection plate; it's about reaching out to others and helping them without question as a way of sharing the experience of God's unconditional love.

Learn to love like Christ. Giving of ourselves in the midst of our suffering and self-denial brings us closer to loving like Christ, who suffered and poured himself out unconditionally on cross for all of us. Lent is a journey through the desert to the foot of the cross on Good Friday, as we seek him out, ask his help, join in his suffering, and learn to love like him.

SAINT JANUARIUS MINISTRY BLOOD DRIVE

At our parish, the Blood Drive Ministry is entering its 33rd year. Started by the late Marge Peters (at the urging of then pastor, Fr. McDonald), the ministry partners with the New York Blood Center by hosting three drives each calendar year. In 2023 we collected a total of 268 units of Whole Blood and Double Red Cell donations which can support up to 804 recipients. There is a never-ending need for blood; there is no substitute for human blood, no pharmaceutical company can provide what the human donor can and these local blood drives provide blood donations that are so vitally crucial to so many people in our community.

The Saint Januarius Ministry volunteers advertise the Blood Drive by hanging posters in our community prior to the drive and they work on the day of the event by welcoming our donors as part of the registration process, keeping the lines moving for our donors and providing hospitality to our donors when they are finished. By joining this ministry, you will help facilitate the overall effort to supply this desperately needed gift of life. It doesn't get much better than that! Our three blood drives in 2024 will be hosted on February 24th, June 22nd, and September 28th. Hope to see you there as a volunteer, a donor, or BOTH!

PS - And who is St. Januarius? Well, many know him as San Gennaro, who's feast day is celebrated every September 19th. Saint Januarius was born in the third century and became Bishop of Benevento, Italy. He was sentenced to death by the emperor and ordered to be torn to pieces by wild beasts. On the day of his execution, he was led to the amphitheater, but none of the animals touched them. He was later beheaded. St. Januarius is famous for the liquefaction of his blood which usually happens on September 16th, the first Sunday of May and again on December 16th. A dark solid mass of his blood in a sealed vial becomes liquid when held near one of his relics. Scientists have no natural explanation for this well-attested phenomenon.



SAFE ENVIRONMENT UPDATES VIRTUS TRAINING ON CAMPUS...

March 1, 2024 at 6:30pm and March 4, 2024 at 1pm Both will be held in the Barn

All volunteers and employees in our parish are required to participate a training course called "Protecting God's Children" and complete a background check as part of our VIRTUS® programs. The importance of the program is to

create safe environments for all, including those who work and minister in our parishes, schools, or other programs. VIRTUS is the brand name that identifies best practices and programs designed to help prevent wrongdoing and promote "right doing" within religious organizations. The VIRTUS programs empower organizations and people to better control risk and improve the lives of all those who interact with the Church.

Our volunteers are required to attend because they are a part of the solution to the problem of child sexual abuse in our homes, parishes, and communities. When caring adults have a "healthy suspicion" about something in their surroundings, they can identify the risks to children early enough to prevent child sexual abuse from occurring.

Although the program is primarily designed to address the issues of creating a safe environment for children and youth, it is also applicable to the vulnerable adult population.

Even if you do not believe that your ministry will have any contact with either vulnerable adults or children you will be covered if you should change or volunteer for additional ministries.
