# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

# Ash Wednesday 2018 A Day for Lovers

Dear Parish Family and those returning to Church today:

The headline might have caught you off guard. Yet, we celebrate Ash Wednesday and the beginning of the Lenten season on Valentine's Day. The image of the heart comes to mind particularly today. In the midst of the world, we see images of hearts everywhere with phrases like, "Happy Valentine's Day" or "Be My Valentine" and the like. It seems a contrast to come our services today when we are being imposed with ashes and acknowledging our brokenness and sinfulness. Then again, maybe not!



Today, on Ash Wednesday, we are called to look at our own hearts and allow the works of the Lenten journey draw us closer to God and to another. For in these 40 days, we are not necessarily called to darkness with awareness of light. We are not called to acknowledge places of despair without hope. We are not called to acknowledge death without awareness of new life. What does it require?



It requires letting our hearts be opened to the Lord. This is not easy. For some of us have developed cold hearts. Pope Francis writes about this for Lent as he says, "Love can also grow cold in our own communities... selfishness and spiritual sloth, sterile pessimism, the temptation to self-absorption, constant warring among ourselves, and the worldly mentality that makes us concerned only for appearances, and thus lessens our missionary zeal." For others of us we have developed broken hearts. We've been hurt or are mourning or feel abandoned. For others, we have overly secured hearts. There is a wall around us preventing us from fully loving and being loved. No one gets past the wall or blockade we have put up. For others our hearts are tainted by sin and poor decision and selfish acts. We wind up so caught up in ourselves we fail to remember God or those he has placed in our lives.

Some us have sleepy hearts. We are going through the motions, i.e. getting ashes, and showing up when we have to but we've lost our drive.

If any of these descriptions sound like you—you're in the right place! For here, we bring the Lord everything we have by opening our hearts to him. We open our hearts to Him so he might bring us his warmth, his mending, his sledgehammer (to knock down the wall), his cleansing spirit to purify and renew us or his alarm and concern to wake us up.

Like any good relationship, though, it's going to take some "heart" work and Lent gives us pretty good tools. Here, I am referring to the traditional practices of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. And if you need some help with using these "heart" tools, just read through the bulletin. For here you will learn about more times for prayer—praying at Daily Mass, Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, our Parish Mission and more. Here you will learn more about how you can give alms—by donating your time to outreach or the street ministry, by offering items to Ernie's Place or the Thrift Shop or even by filling up one of our shopping bags and bringing it back in Lent. And we are called to fast, to go without something or things. We don't do this for any other reason but to unite with our brothers and sisters who are suffering and create a place for God. Maybe we can clear a space by getting rid of some of our technology or attachments or unhealthy habits. What does fasting do? Pope Francis tells us, "Fasting wakes us up. It makes us more attentive to God and our neighbor. It revives our desire to obey God, who alone is capable of satisfying our hunger."

So, today at Church it is a day for lovers—a day for us and God and for us and our neighbors. Let's pray we'll love well allowing God to transform our hearts.

Let's pray for and with one another. Please pray for me.

# <u>LENT 2018</u>

# **LENTEN LITURGICAL NOTES**

The season of Lent calls us to a time of deeper reflection and repentance. We are called to do this in our own lives (see the pages of this bulletin for about that!) but also in how we pray liturgically. Read below and learn more: • The Gloria (Glory to God) is not said or sung during Lent, except on the Solemnity of St. Joseph (March 19th). We will sing the Gloria again at the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper and then again at the Easter Vigil.

• The Alleluia is omitted from all hymns and as the Gospel Acclamation during Masses. That is one of the reasons why we are singing the Alleluia as the Concluding Hymn at all of our Masses this weekend.

• We will use the Apostles' Creed instead of the Nicene Creed. The Roman Missal (#19) clearly encourage the use of the Apostles' Creed during the seasons of Lent and Easter. It is a good practice to get used to. We will try to have these on those cards but the Apostles' Creed can also be found inside the covers of *Breaking Bread*.

 $\cdot$  We will use simple Mass settings during the season of Lent. We are working to have cards in the Breaking Bread hymnals that will have the music for these settings. (We learned from the last time we changed Mass settings in Advent.)

During the time when the gifts of bread and wine are brought forward and the altar prepared, there will be no music—instrumental or otherwise.
(We'll make an exception for Laetare Sunday, the 4th Sunday of Lent.) It is our hope this will help us to reflect more on what has been proclaimed and preached during the Liturgy of the Word and enter more fully into the sense of the Lenten season.
During Weekday (Daily Mass), we will not sing an Entrance Hymn or a Closing Hymn as is our custom here.

# ABSTINENCE AND FASTING

All Catholics between the ages of 14 and 59 are bound to abstain entirely from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. All Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are also bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day. Those whose work or health would be impaired are excused from fast and abstinence. *Individual conscience should decide proper cause for excuse. A more serious reason is required to excuse oneself from Ash Wednesday and Good Friday fast and abstinence.*

A free will offering of \$5.00 is requested but not required. These books contain all of the Sunday readings as well as the psalm and antiphons for Daily Mass.

# Words of Wisdom By Sister Ann Berendes, Director of Parish Social Ministry

Why is it that so many people come for ashes on Ash Wednesday? Many don't come to receive them at a Mass but just at a service? It is wonderful to see so very many walking around that first day of Lent with the black cross on their foreheads but why come for a Sacramental and not THE Sacrament of the Eucharist?

We are encouraged during Lent to Pray, Fast, and Give Alms but I wonder how many of us think of the positive sides of those gestures. The best prayer we can offer, of course, is the prayer of the Mass. Have we considered attending at least one more Mass during the week? Or, if we haven't been attending Mass regularly, what about starting to do that this Lent to get back into the habit?

The Church gives us a very easy fast—only twice during the season—Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. That means just one full meal and two smaller ones and no eating between meals. Abstinence means NO meat on all Fridays and Ash Wednesday. That's not so tough.

Giving Alms does mean digging down into your pocket a bit more but what about giving more time to SJE activities? Giving of your time sometimes can be hard but it can also be a great gift to others. For instance, our Outreach office is still very short of receptionists. Can you afford to give two hours in the morning or two hours in the afternoon (10-12) or (1-3) to answer the phone, take messages, just be a friendly voice or face to great someone who may need help?

Can you come on Monday or Wednesday morning to help sort clothes for the Thrift Shop? If you can't do any of these things every week can you do one of them once or twice a week? We have a wonderful group of men and women who enjoy do this sort of work. What a gift of ALMS these activities can be.

I invite you to think of an activity to give to your Church this Lent. May God bless you for at least reading through this and thinking about it.

My former Pastor, Msgr. Joseph DeGrocco, a former professor of liturgy at the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception, prepared a brief article for my former parish's bulletin that runs during the winter months. With his permission, I have reprinted it here. As we are in the midst of the winter season, there are some good things to consider in our celebration of the Eucharist.

As we come to celebrate Mass together each week during these winter days, it's a good time to review some common-sense liturgical practices and issues, to help everyone stay healthy and to care for one another.

- <u>Holy Communion</u>: Priests, deacons and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion are especially encouraged to wash and sanitize their hands before Mass begins. If Communion ministers need to clean their hands during Mass, it must be done discreetly. The best way for extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion to clean their hands during Mass is to use a sanitizing liquid in the pew before coming into the sanctuary (sanitizing liquids have no place on the altar or among the Communion vessels and other sacred items on the credence table).
- **<u>Communion from the Chalice</u>**: The faithful should refrain from drinking from the chalice when one has a cold or is fearful of being infected.
- <u>Receiving on the Tongue:</u> Faithful who normally receive Holy Communion on the tongue should refrain from receiving on the tongue and instead receive in the hand when one has a cold or is otherwise contagious. Do not spread your saliva to the hand of the Communion minister if you are sick; receive Communion in the hand instead.
- <u>Greeting of Peace</u>: Use your own discretion and best judgment when invited to exchange the greeting of peace during the liturgy; limit physical contact with others if necessary. If a handshake is not advisable, a simple bow of the head is acceptable. Do not be insulted if someone prefers to avoid shaking your hand.
- <u>Mass Attendance</u>: MOST IMPORTANTLY, IF YOU ARE SICK, PLEASE DO NOT COME TO MASS! There is no obligation to attend Mass if you are sick; it is not a sin to miss Mass for this reason. (Also, there is no need to go to Confession if you miss Mass because you are sick.) Personal prayer and reflection on the Sunday Scripture readings is encouraged; many people also enjoy viewing the Mass on television.

# **SETON CHAPEL**

This summer, we did some extensive renovations in the convent that created a new meeting room and a large space for prayer. Daily Mass and confessions take place in Seton Chapel as does Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and our daily rosaries. Seton Chapel open at 6:30 a.m. and closes at approximately 7 p.m. In the early morning and at night, you may park in the school parking lot. During the day we ask that you park on St. John Place. Come and say a prayer in this beautiful space.



# EVENING EXPOSITION AND HOLY HOUR

Since the fire in the Church, we have not been able to have Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament during the evening hours.

Now, exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will be held at 5:00 p.m. and continue until Benediction at approximately 9:00 p.m.

During this time, we will pray the Miraculous Medal Novena, offer times of prayer for priests and pray Night Prayer at 8:45 p.m.

At our parent meetings, Fr. John kicked off the year with topics on social justice and morality. We also were blessed to have special guest speaker Michael Chiappone, LMSW, a social worker at St. Charles Hospital, who discussed various social issues facing our youth during our Level 8 parent meeting. Students in Levels 3-8 also had an opportunity to pray and learn more about the renovations in our church building. Catechists have been coming up with several great ways to engage our youth, including collecting clothing for our Street Ministry, writing "Thank You" notes to our Bishop John Barres and sending letters of encouragement to our troops.

In the months ahead, we will be having our Confirmation retreats for our nearly 220 candidates, as well as important parent meetings on the Sacramental grade-levels, and 1st Communions this Spring for our nearly 180 Level 2 students.
