A Reflection from the Music Ministry Director, Angela Werner...

A Reflection on the Gospel: Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

"The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest."

The above passage is often associated with the priesthood and consecrated vocations, but it's not solely about those roles. This gospel speaks of the seventy-two disciples whom Jesus sent out on a mission. It was a kind of 'internship,' a training time while Jesus was still with them. They are told to travel in pairs. We can assume that this directive was (in part) related to their safety. If one person is sent to do something that might be dangerous or risky, it would be wise to have another person go along. Traveling in pairs would also mean they would provide each other with mutual encouragement, and that one would be a witness for the other. But perhaps (most importantly) they were sent in pairs because of Jesus' own words: "Where two or

more are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them."

What is the mission of the priest? It is to proclaim the Gospel message, even when it is difficult. It is to be able to face rejection for the sake of the truth, to rely not on what this world can give, but what faith in God can do. It is to pursue a life of virtue as an example for others to follow, to offer peace in a world filled with chaos. It is to gather, feed, guide, and protect those entrusted to the Church, to be willing to give one's life to God, and to be ready to lay down

one's life for the flock which the world exposes to the prowling wolf (sin). It is so important that we pray for all priests, because the evil one sends the most vicious wolves for them. Why? It is because without priests, there would be no Eucharist (the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ here on Earth). This is also why we need to pray for more vocations to the priesthood. We can imagine the distress of a farmer when he sees his fields golden with harvest, but no servants to gather that harvest in. It must have been such an agony that filled the heart of Jesus as He looked out on His harvest field. He considered the multitude of humanity to be like a harvest field ready for gathering. No matter who we are, where we live, or what our status is, we each have the ability to spread the Word of God in our own unique way, from the seed, to the harvest, to the Kingdom.

Jesus told them, "Go on your way; behold, I am sending you like lambs among wolves." Jesus wanted them to go with a trusting heart, allowing God to work through them. There are times along the way that we will feel like lambs among wolves. But never forget that our Shepherd is always nearby, gently guiding our works. Often, it's not the quantity, but the quality of our works that matters.

Jesus said, "Carry no money bag, no sack, no sandals; and greet no one along the way." He did not want them to become distracted by material concerns or worldly possessions, and salutations would only cause a delay in their journey. The more we detach ourselves from earthly things, the more we seek to inherit that which has the greatest value: eternal life. In order for a few to reach many, there needs to be power at work, and the more we empty ourselves of 'ourselves,' the more room we make for the power of the Holy Spirit to work within us, helping us to offer the message, to live the message, and to be the message. this household." Whenever Jesus entered a place, His first words were, 'Peace be with you.' We also say it at every mass we attend. Peace entering any situation is likely to improve it. Peace is the perfect starting point, because it leads to the perfect ending point, which is eternal peace in Heaven. With all the chaos in the world today, a little peace would be a welcome relief. Sometimes, the best thing we can offer someone is peace. It comes from a quiet place, yet it speaks volumes.

Jesus told them, "Stay in the same house and eat and drink what is offered to you, for the laborer deserves his payment." Jesus wanted them to trust that God would provide for them through the

> generosity of others, which allowed them to thankfully receive what was offered by those who supported them in their mission.

> Jesus said, "Cure the sick and say to them, 'The kingdom of God is at hand for you." The healing was important because it was part of their preaching, and it showed that the Kingdom of God had come with the power that they had described from what Jesus had taught and shown them.

Jesus instructed them, "Whatever town you enter and they do not receive you, go out into the streets and say, 'The dust of your town that clings

to our feet, even that we shake off against you." Jesus warned the seventy-two to expect resistance and rejection, which we also face today. More Christians are being persecuted for their faith today than at any other time in human history, including the Roman persecutions of the first century. We mustn't let that stop us though. Ultimately, each of us has the choice to either accept the truth or reject it. But in order to have the chance to accept the truth, one must first hear it. Following Christ is not easy. We may be mocked, and we may suffer, but our sacrifice will lead to our victory, and we will be in good company. God didn't want us to feel alone in our human struggles. When He entered into our humanity, He allowed Himself to be exposed to temptation, hatred, and suffering, even to the point of death because He wanted us to understand that death doesn't have the last word. Whether we are met with kindness or ridicule, acceptance or scorn, hospitality or contempt, if the peace and love of Christ is what we have offered, then mission accomplished!

When the seventy-two returned rejoicing, Jesus said, "Do not rejoice because the spirits are subject to you, but rejoice because your names are written in heaven." This was a reminder from Jesus that it wasn't important for them to measure their own successes. Their main mission was the same as ours is today, which is to carry on the ministry that Jesus started. Outward signs are merely byproducts of the mission, which is getting ourselves (and others) to Heaven. More important than signs are souls. The value of all earthly harvests (from the beginning of time until now) is nothing in comparison to the worth of one soul. Every soul is meant for Heaven, and God wants us to help each other on that journey.

As St. Teresa of Avila reminds us: "Yours are the eyes through which the compassion of Christ looks out to the world. Yours are the feet with which He is to go about doing good. Yours are the hands with which he is to bless others now."


Remembering one who has passed away at Mass is a most noble practice calling us to pray for one who has died at the most powerful prayer we know the celebration of the Eucharist.

Moms on the Journey



To be a godparent (or a sponsor for someone who is receiving Confirmation) a Catholic must meet the following requirements. Thes are not "guidelines" here at St. John's. These are the requirements of the universal Catholic Church and are the same all over the world. Different parishes may choose to document these requirements differently. The role of sponsor is an important one!The godparent (sponsor) must be a fully initiated Catholic who supports the person receiving the sacrament through their own example of Catholic living and a desire to help the person learn more about the Catholic faith through prayer, discussion and instruction. has the following The Catholic Church requirements for godparents/sponsors:

- The sponsor must be a fully initiated member of the Catholic Church which means he or she has received the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist (Communion) and Confirmation.
- The godparent/sponsor must be at least 16 years of age (a person younger than 16 must be fully initiated in the Catholic Church)
- The godparent/sponsor must have an active life of faith in the Catholic Church and provide good example of Catholic Living.
- If the godparent/sponsor is married, he/she must be married in the Catholic Church
- The godparent/sponsor cannot be either parent of the person being Baptized or Confirmed.

Now that you know a little more about Baptism... spread the word! We have a wonderful parish at St John's and we are growing every day !

A Message from Msgr. Walden...

Whenever we go on a trip we try to take everything we think we will need. Sometimes overpack and sometimes we do not pack enough. There is a very interesting line in today's Gospel (Luke 10:1-12, 17-20) where Jesus sends His disciples ahead of Him to prepare the people for his coming: "Carry no money bag, no sack, no sandals; and greet no one along the way." That is certainly traveling light and being focused on the purpose for sending them ahead of Him.

Everyday we carry many thoughts and concerns in our minds and hearts. The negative ones weigh us include down and anger, spite, bitterness. disappointment, fear and guilt. The positive ones energize us and include love, joy, gratitude, wonder, and mercy. The negative baggage also includes temptations to do or say things that will only leave us feeling guilty, frustrated, and restless. The positive baggage cannot really be called baggage because it does not weigh us down, but inspires, encourages, and lifts us up and everyone whose lives we touch with all that is truly good and loving in us. We celebrate key and even everyday moments of our lives in those encounters or situations where good is done and experienced. Jesus sent out the seventy-two disciples to prepare those He would encounter to be touched, renewed, refreshed, encouraged, and inspired by His presence. How wonderful it is that the more we recognize God's goodness, love, and presence in our lives, the more energy, joy, hope, and gratitude we experience and share. Jesus was always energized by the people who came into His presence. At one point when Jesus was preaching about the need for us to eat his flesh and drink His blood which referred to the Sacrament of the Eucharist where we receive Him in the bread that is His body and the wine that is His blood, people started to give up on Him and walked away. He then addressed the twelve apostles: "Do you also want to leave?" Simon Peter answered him, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God." (John 6:67-69)

Jesus not only has the words of eternal life, He is the Word of God, the Word we need to hear, embrace, and be uplifted and nourished by everyday of our lives. All we have to do is take the time to see the blessings we have in each other and the blessing that we are truly united by when we allow Jesus to embrace us and recognize how He wants to embrace everyone we encounter. Jesus not only has the "words of eternal life", He is the Word spoken through our thoughts, words, and actions everyday.

I offer Psalm 139 for your prayerful reflection.

O Lord, you search me and you know me,

you discern my purpose from afar. You mark when I walk or lie down, all my ways lie open to you. Before ever a word is on my tongue you know it, O Lord, through and through. Behind and before you besiege me, your hand ever laid upon me. Too wonderful for me this knowledge, too high, beyond my reach. O where can I go from your spirit, or where can I flee from your face? If I climb the heavens, you are there. If I lie in the grave, you are there. If I take the wings of the dawn and dwell at the sea's furthest end, even there your hand would lead me, your right hand would hold me fast. If I say: "Let the darkness hide me and the light around me be night," even darkness is not dark for you and the night is as clear as the day. For it was you who created my being, knit me together in my mother's womb. I thank you for the wonder of my being, for the wonders of all your creation. Already you knew my soul my body held no secret from you when I was being fashioned in secret and molded in the depths of the earth. Your eyes saw all my actions, they were all of them written in your book; every one of my days was decreed before one of them came into being. To me, how mysterious your thoughts, the sum of them not to be numbered! If I count them, they are more than the sand: to finish, I must be eternal, like you. O search me, God, and know my heart. O test me and know my thoughts. See that I follow not the wrong path and lead me in the path of life eternal. Glory...

Psalm Prayer: You watch over heaven and earth, Lord Jesus. Your death brought light to the dead; your resurrection gave joy to the saints; your ascension made the angels rejoice. Your power exceeds all power. Lead us to life eternal, and watch over us with your love. May your friends be filled with honor and join you in heaven.


