## **FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK**

## You have need of only one thing.... CLOSER THAN YOU THINK?

#### Dear Parish Family:

I always feel bad for the rich young man, regardless of the Gospel. He wants to do the right thing. He wants to be "all in". He's held back. In his case, his possessions hold him back.

In praying with this week's Gospel, I have a different feeling than I have in other times of preaching and preparing. He's probably in a better place than I am. Read the beginning of this Sunday's Gospel. He's done everything else. He follows the commandments, puts God first, loves his neighbor. Jesus sees this and looks at him with great love. He is close. (I always imagine he left at this point but came back at another time having done the "one" thing.)

I think we all have that "one thing" that can get hold of us. It might be a place of darkness and sin. Maybe it an attachment to a particular person or relationship. Perhaps an overreliance on technology or a certain group. Maybe a certain political movement or conspiracy theory or opinion or value. Perhaps an ongoing distraction or struggle. Maybe a sports team or some other organization you belong to. It might be even something in the spiritual life that is leading you further away from Christ and the Church. It might be something all-consuming or not so much.

I know in my spiritual life I can let the "perfect be the enemy of the good" and then the enemy usually wins. You know the lines, right? Statements like, "I'll never get over this", "it's never going to change", "not worth trying" or even "fuggedaboutit". Then, we generally stop trying and slide pretty far back.

Maybe this is where the rich young man has something to teach us. He is making progress. Listen to his encounter with Jesus. Look what I am trying to do. Look I am getting there. Now he has only one more thing to do. It very well may be the hardest thing for him but he's getting closer to be able to make this change.

I know I'm probably not ready to let go of it all. I likely have more than "one thing" to work on. For now, though, maybe working on that "one thing" is not where we need to start. Maybe we need to start smaller or in a different place. We need to build the foundation so that significant change can happen. Let's go back to that rich young man. Can we work where he has been working? Loving God



with everything we have and trying to remove whatever distractions there may be.

As you know, I'm a huge St. Ignatius of Loyola fan. *The Spiritual Exercises* have changed my life forever. I'm ruined—in the best sense of that word. Here is part of the text of the First Principle and Foundation,

"God created human beings to praise, reverence, and serve God, and by doing this, to save their souls. God created all other things on the face of the earth to help fulfill this purpose. From this it follows that we are to use the things of this world only to the extent that they help us to this end, and we ought to rid ourselves of the things of this world to the extent that they get in the way of this end. For this it is neces-

sary to make ourselves of the things of this work to the extent that they get in the way of this cha. To this it is necessary to make ourselves indifferent to all created things as much as we are able, so that we do not necessarily want health rather than sickness, riches rather than poverty, honor rather than dishonor, a long rather than a short life, and so in all the rest, so that we ultimately desire and choose only what is most conducive for us to the end for which God created us."

The work of detachment is spoken of by Jesus throughout the Gospels. Get rid of whatever your "riches" may be so that you are not too attached to the things of this world. If you can't do it all, maybe that's OK for now. Start to create some space. This way, when we pray words like we do in the psalm this weekend - "Fill us with your love Lord…" - there will be room for that love to fill and help us with the "one thing"!

If you can, please say a prayer for me.

#### October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month

What's the difference between normal conflict and domestic violence? Conflict is part of every intimate relationship–that's why conflict resolution skills are important. Domestic violence, however, has no place in a healthy relationship, whether the couple is dating, cohabiting, engaged, or married.

#### What is domestic violence?

Domestic violence is any kind of behavior that a person uses, or threatens to use, to control an intimate partner. The two key elements are threat and control. Domestic violence can take various forms:

*Physical* – Violent actions such as hitting, beating, pushing, and kicking. In many cases physical abuse becomes more frequent and severe over time.

Sexual - Includes any sexual acts that are forced on one partner by the other

*Psychological* – Includes a wide range of behaviors such as intimidation, isolating the victim from friends and family, controlling where the victim goes, making the victim feel guilty or crazy, and making unreasonable demands

*Emotional* – Undermining an individual's self-esteem, constant criticism, insults, put-downs, and name-calling

*Economic* – Examples include limiting the victim's access to family income, preventing the victim from working or forcing the victim to work, destroying the victim's property, and making all the financial decisions

Both women and men can be victims of domestic abuse. According to the National Domestic Violence Hotline statistics, approximately 1 in 4 women and 1 in 7 men over the age of 18 have been the victim of physical domestic violence, and almost 50% of both sexes have experienced some form of domestic psychological aggression.









SJE offers a number of ways to remember loved ones, or honor someone living.


#### Altar Bread and Wine
