## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

I can do all things in Him who strengthens me...

### **BANKRUPT... but not!**

Dear Parish Family:

On Thursday, October 1, 2020, the Diocese of Rockville Centre filed for Chapter 11 Bankruptcy Reorganization. You may have read about this in bulletin last week and I spoke about it at the Masses I presided at last weekend. Permit to share a few thoughts and ideas. You know I am not a lawyer. I understand very little about legal issues related to bankruptcy or financial law. Any thoughts or ideas I am sharing are from a priest who is trying his best to put all of this together.

So, first, the parish of St. John the Evangelist did not file for Chapter 11 bankruptcy; the Diocese of Rockville Centre filed. This filing has no impact on our present functioning as a parish. Fortunately, because of your generosity, we do not rely on the diocese for any debt relief, loan, financial support, etc. We do not owe any money to the diocese (or to anyone for that matter). Our mission continues and it continues to need your support spiritually, physically, and yes, financially.

Each parish and most diocesan institutions are corporately separate from a diocese. For example, I serve as the secretary-treasurer of the corporation of St. John the Evangelist supported by our two parish trustees, Angelo Rollo and Elizabeth Harrington-Dyer. Bishop Barres and Bishop Coyle (vicar for the eastern vicariate) serve as the President and Vice-President of the corporation of St. John the Evangelist respectively. It would be the same for any other parish in our diocese and probably other dioceses as well.

Second, each parish has been encouraged to pursue legal counsel. In the process of a bankruptcy filing and reorganization, there are times where the parish may need to be represented separate from the diocese. After consultation with the Pastoral Council, the Finance Council, and members of the Pastoral Team, we contracted with a law office that specializes in these types of situations. Our hope is that our need will be minimal or non-existent. If it is, we are prepared.

Third, we need to take a deep breath. When I learned of the bankruptcy filing late last week, I thought, "Here we go, another challenge we will have to work through." (Go back to my letter from last week.) As we face this challenge and others in these days and times, we need to pray with the words of Scripture this week. Listen to the words of the prophet Isaiah, to the beloved 23rd psalm and to the words of St. Paul. Our strength does not come from this world or time. Our strength comes from the Lord. I believe one of the graces (or benefits) that may come from these times is a deeper awareness of this. So many of the things we have or can attach ourselves to – financial security, status, comfort, perceived confidence – are the things of this world. They are not the things of Christ. The things of this world, by themselves, are dead ends. They rob us of our hope. They blind us to the possibility of what our faith assures each one of us.

Last Saturday, Pope Francis released his latest encyclical, *Fratelli Tutti*. This latest teaching which we are called to discern and to follow offers a great deal for our prayer and consideration. I encourage you to read through it carefully. I'm only midway through the second chapter. (Please read the encyclical entirely before making a judgment.) I want to share an excerpt from the end of the first chapter which reminds us that we come through the most challenging times and moments together. He writes:

*For God continues to sow abundant seeds of goodness in our human family. The recent pandemic enabled us to recognize and appreciate once more all those around us who, in the midst of fear, responded by putting their lives on the line. We began to realize that our lives are interwoven with and sustained by ordinary people valiantly shaping the decisive events of our shared history: doctors, nurses, pharmacists, storekeepers and supermarket workers, cleaning personnel, caretakers, transport workers, men and women working to provide essential services and public safety, volunteers, priests and religious... They understood that no one is saved alone. (55)*

We can do all things – and come through all things – with Him who strengthens us. If so, we are far from bankrupt. We will be richer than we can ever imagine.

Please, if you can, say a prayer for me.

## **VIGIL OF ALL SAINTS**

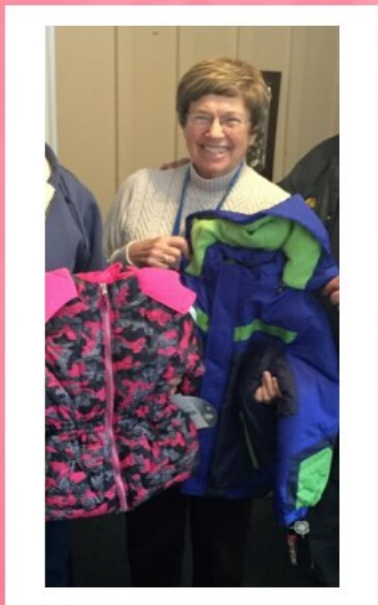


Come join us for our first annual ***VIGIL OF ALL SAINTS*** on Saturday, **OCTOBER 31st at 6PM** on our convent front porch.

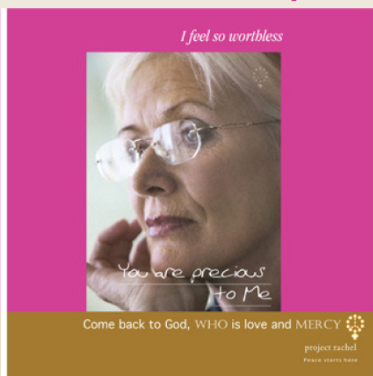

## Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship

The upcoming election – as each election should – calls us to deep discernment regarding the choices we make. The bishops of the United States of America wrote *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship* in 2015. They have published an updated Introductory Letter for our consideration. I ask that you read it and the entire document carefully before voting this year. ### *This week's excerpt -*

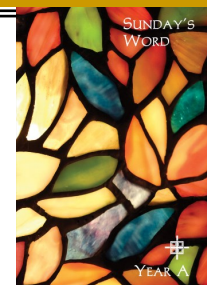
Our approach to contemporary issues is first and foremost rooted in our identity as followers of Christ and as brothers and sisters to all who are made in God's image. For all Catholics, including those seeking public office, our participation in political parties or other groups to which we may belong should be influenced by our faith, not the other way around. Our 2015 statement, *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*, sought to help Catholics form their consciences, apply a consistent moral framework to issues facing the nation and world, and shape their choices in elections in the light of Catholic Social Teaching. In choosing to re-issue this statement, we recognize that the thrust of the document and the challenges it addresses remain relevant today. At the same time, some challenges have become even more pronounced. Pope Francis has continued to draw attention to important issues such as migration, xenophobia, racism, abortion, global conflict, and care for creation.

*Merciful Father, Thank you for inviting each of us to join in your work of building the kingdom of love, justice, and peace. Draw us close to you in prayer as we discern your call in our families and communities. Send us forth to encounter all whom you love: those not yet born, those in poverty, those in need of welcome. Inspire us to respond to the call to faithful citizenship, during election season and beyond. Help us to imitate your charity and compassion and to serve as models of loving dialogue. Teach us to treat others with respect, even when we disagree, and seek to share your love and mercy. We ask this through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God forever and ever. Amen*

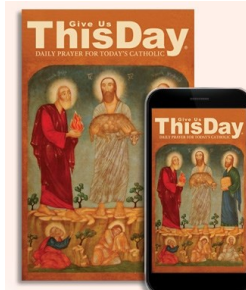
### SUNDAY'S WORD
