

Meet Father Abin,,,

Saint John the Evangelist welcomes Father Abin Panicker, a priest of the Order of the Imitation of Christ (Bethany Navajyothy Province), who has been appointed as Parochial Vicar of our parish by Bishop John O. Barres, effective June 26, 2024.

Father Abin, born on August 4, 1985 (in Mavelikara, Kerala, India) was born to James Panicker and Lucy J. Panicker. From as far back as he can remember, Abin became interested in Oriental Liturgy, and as time went on, he became involved with various missions. He has a tremendous admiration for his grandfather's uncle, Venerable Archbishop Mar Ivanios OIC (founder of the Reunion Movement), who was a bishop in the Syro-Malankara Catholic Church.

Abin realized his call to be a priest when he was ordained on January 12, 2015. One aspect of his personal mission is to make whole-life disciples, while enriching the Church and its families with a love for Christ.

Father Abin has extensive experience in education as a student-centric instructor, academic facilitator and instructional coach. He has earned Bachelor's Degrees in Communicative English, Philosophy, Theology, and Education, and has a Master's Degree in Mass Communication and Journalism.

He has held positions such as director, superior, procurator, and parish priest in various locations, and he became Founder Director of the Bethany Book Centre in Sultan Bathery (a town in the mountainous Wayanad region of Kerala, South India). He was also Principal of Girideepam Bethany Central School (CBSE) in Kottayam, Kerala, inspiring students as a companion and mentor, allowing them to learn according to their creativity, and by doing so, shaping their future. He has conducted stage shows and competitions according to various themes and events, even writing lyrics for some of the songs.

Before his current appointment in our church, Father Abin served as the administrator

and academic head of Navajyothy Bethany Vidhyapeeth School in Mumbai, and as Parish Priest of St. Thomas Syro -Malankara Catholic



Church in Thane, Mumbai, India. He is fluent in the English language, as well as Malayalam, Hindi, Tamil, and Syriac.

As a member of Bethany Ashram, also known as the Order of the Imitation of Christ (OIC), Father Abin came to America as part of the Pastoral Ministry. OIC is the first indigenous religious congregation started in the Malankara Church, prompted by divine inspiration to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ throughout India, through the spiritual renewal of the Church. The charism of the Order of the Imitation of Christ is following Jesus Christ in his life of prayer and action. It was founded by the late Archbishop Venerable Geevarghese Mar Ivanios OIC (the younger brother of Father Abin's great-grandfather) on August 15, 1919, at Perunadu, in Kerala, India. Bethany beautifully blends the spirit of both Oriental monastic tradition and Indian sanyasa.

As the very name indicates, Bethany Ashram has been a house of consolation for all those who enter its threshold. It became the cradle of the Reunion Movement when Mar Ivanios and others embraced the unity of the true Catholic communion, thus giving rise to the Malankara Catholic Church on September 20, 1930.

The Diocese of Rockville Centre has entrusted the OIC with the parishes of St. Ignatius Loyola, and Our Lady of Mercy, both in Hicksville.

Father Jose Kuruvila, who has served in our parish twice during the month of August (last year and this year) is also a member of the OIC.

Next time you have the chance, walk up and introduce yourself to Father Abin. I'm sure it will make his day.







A Message from Msgr. Walden...

There are many questions and issues that catch our attention everyday. How would you answer this question: "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" That is the question we hear Jesus being asked in today's Gospel by a young man who seems to think he has it all together because he has kept all the commandments. They are very basic and straightforward as Jesus starts to make His response: "You know commandments: You shall not kill; you shall not commit adultery; you shall not steal; you shall not bear false witness; you shall not defraud; honor your father and your mother." Other than the last commandment cited by Jesus, the others all speak about what we should not do, the evil that is to be avoided. But getting to heaven is much more than just avoiding obvious evil, it is about sharing our treasure, and that treasure much more than material: it is the time, attention, love, and concern that is ever present in our hearts.

In a meditation book I am reading from every morning, I was struck by a thought expressed by the author who began a reflection on heaven with this thought from St. Paul, Philippians 3:20: "But our citizenship is in heaven, and from there we also await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ!" This is the thought: "There was a delightful Baptist minister in Newark who "Yes, my true home is in would say, heaven. But right now I am not homesick." Yes all too often we lose our focus on who we are, where we are going, and how we are going to get there. How do we get a taste of the kingdom of heaven? Who or what is foundation of that hope? We do not go through our lives focused on how we are going to get to heaven, but everyday presents us with opportunities to stay on the path as well as temptations to go off on our own. Disappointments, anger, confusion, and spite all too often cloud our mental vision. When we are hard hearted, spiteful, and vengeful, there is no real peace. We have all experienced them as the victim and conveyer of those thoughts and ensuing actions. One of clearest examples of not being derailed or consumed with anger in such situations are these words of Jesus on the cross: "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do." (Luke 23:34) While His enemies were gloating, He was praying for their eternal salvation and oneness with Him.


God does not give us answers step by step

everyday. He is the answer that leads us from protecting ourselves and winning to giving of ourselves without the cost. He is the way to reconciliation and union with Him and only through, with, and in Him to reconciliation, peace, and unity with one another. We will probably not be "homesick for heaven" but we can certainly make our journey through life a gift to God, ourselves, and one another, by living in the very image and likeness in which we have been created, the image and likeness of God Himself: "God created mankind in his image; in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them. 


