A Gospel Reflection...

If you were invited to the wedding of a king or somebody rich and famous, why would you go? Might it be for the grand spectacle of the occasion, a day resplendent with pomp and ceremony, lavish decorations and rich ornamentation, a who's who of beautiful people dressed to the nines, your senses overwhelmed by the sheer splendor of the celebration? Eagerly you would look forward to a day of feasting and drinking, first tray after tray of tantalizing appetizers, then a sumptuous banquet at glistening tables of crystal, porcelain and silver, the wine flowing freely and the mirth and laughter overflowing. The band of course would be incredible, the music so good that no one could resist getting on their feet and dancing the whole evening long. When you know the host is wealthy and will spare no expenses for the celebration, wouldn't you clear your calendar and do everything to ensure that you would be there?

It is therefore rather surprising, shocking even, that the invited guests in the Gospel parable excuse themselves and refuse to go to the wedding feast their king has prepared for his son. They are not lured into attending by the promise of a great feast and celebration. And yet—if simply the promise of a good time was not enough for them to accept the invitation, then it ought to be said that their refusal is actually praiseworthy. For who decides to attend or not attend a wedding simply for the party? No, the reason one goes to a wedding is to celebrate the love of the groom and bride; the party, after all, is in honor of their nuptial union. Which means that the guests in the parable turned down the king's invitation because they did not care for him or his son. They had better things to do than honor their king and celebrate his son's wedding.

As the Gospel is a parable of the kingdom of heaven, the king represents God the Father, the son of the king is Jesus, and the wedding celebration symbolizes the union of Jesus the Bridegroom with his bride, the Church—i.e. all of us. The Christian faith is essentially an invitation to union with God. In Christ, God reveals his love for us and his desire that we come to know and love him. The divine love that Christ has for us is likened to that of a Bridegroom for his bride because Christ loves us completely and faithfully, giving his whole self to us by laying down his life in sacrifice. His sacrifice not only ended our separation from God by canceling out the debt of our sins, it also made our union with God possible by the outpouring of the Holy Spirit—divine love—from the pierced heart of the crucified Christ. This union is ours to have—if we respond to the wedding invitation, if we are willing to let God love us and let his love transform us.

As Christians, the wedding we are invited to attend in the kingdom of heaven is our own. We are the ones whom Christ loves with all his sacred heart. He died and rose for us to make us his bride so that we might be his forever. To refuse this invitation, therefore, is to run away from your own wedding! There are many in the world who have heard of Jesus Christ but do not really know him or his great love, and though they too are invited to the wedding, they have better things to do. Because they do not really know the King or his Son, they are quite content to turn down the invitation. Sadly, many Catholics fall into this category, for they never choose to live out their baptismal calling and enter a life of union and love with God.

A Gospel Reflection continued...

In this year of the Eucharistic Revival, let us relate what we have said to the Eucharist. Do you realize that the Eucharist is the feast of the heavenly wedding banquet between Christ and the Church? On the surface, a Mass can seem very different from a wedding banquet, and the Eucharist too plain and simple to be considered a feast. Yet beyond the external differences, the essential core of the wedding ceremony and banquet are present in the Mass and the Eucharist.

Like a wedding betrothal, the Mass is the act by which the Bridegroom and Bride pledge themselves completely to one another in love and union, and are made one flesh. The same act happens at every Mass, for the Eucharist is the memorial of Christ's death and Resurrection, making his act of dying and rising for our sakes present in our midst, which is how Christ gave—gives—himself completely to his Bride. Yet it would not be a true wedding if only the groom did this. The bride too gives herself to her husband, and thus at Mass we are all called to offer ourselves in love to Christ. We give ourselves by actively participating in the Mass, giving to Christ in the offering of bread and wine all that we are and all that we have done (including what needs to be forgiven and reconciled), all that we hope and pray for and all who are dear to us, so that Christ might take what we offer and, through the priest and by the power of the Holy Spirit, transform the bread and wine into His Body and Blood in offering pleasing to the Father. And in receiving the Body of Christ with faith, love and devotion, we, the Church, are united personally and communally with Christ. Indeed, by partaking of the Eucharist we become the Body of Christ, one flesh with our Savior.

Likewise, the Eucharist is truly the heavenly banquet of our union with God. The Eucharist is spiritual food, food for our souls, which 'feed' not on meat and drink but on truth and love. By Christ's wisdom the Eucharist is not food that delights the senses and pleases the body, for the Eucharist is meant to nourish our souls with Christ's truth and love, and thus strengthen supernatural faith, hope and charity, not please natural sight or taste. And yet as food the Eucharist surpasses the greatest of earthly wedding banquets, for fine food and drink prepared well contains only the good things of the earth, but the Eucharist contains the Creator and Savior of the world, God himself. At any earthly wedding banquet we are reminded that what God has created is good (Genesis 1), yet how infinitely greater in goodness is the God who creates what is good! Earthly foods please and nourish, but their effect is passing, and they cannot prevent death. The Eucharist delights the one who is in love with Christ, provides spiritual strength, and contains the eternal promise and power of Christ's Resurrection which has conquered death. In all other food and drink, God gives to us what He has made; only in the Eucharist, does God give himself, his very mystery.

Now just as it would be wrong to accept an invitation to a wedding simply to enjoy the party, not caring a whit about the couple and their union, so too it is mistaken to go to the wedding banquet of the Mass looking for a good time, for "what I can get out of it," rather than to go and celebrate the union of the bride and groom. Remember that at every Mass we are Christ's beloved bride, and as He gives his very self by giving us His very Body and Blood as our spiritual food, so too are we called to give ourselves in faith and love to him. The Eucharist is holy communion. If you are not there to seek union with your Savior who laid down his life in love for us, you might as well find something better to do instead.



New York Times best-selling author and international speaker, Immaculée Ilibagiza, is a survivor of the 1994 Rwandan genocide that took the lives of nearly one million Tutsis. Men, women and children, including her entire family except for one of her brothers, were massacred at the hands of Hutu marauders.



Immaculée found shelter at a

pastor's home, where she and seven other women hid from the deadly rebel mob in a 3-by-4-foot bathroom for 91 days. During those 91 days of unimaginable suffering, Immaculée found her faith, taught herself English, and most incredibly, committed herself to a life of peace, hope and forgiveness, even for those who had murdered her family. Immaculée has gone on to work at the United Nations, receive five honorary doctoral degrees, write seven books about her faith and her life journey, and is the recipient of the Mahatma Gandhi International Award for Reconciliation and Peace.




was a big believer in Catholic education. Her parents' unwavering faith and everlasting love for their children inspired them to support Catholic elementary school students in need.




