# Did you know...





A long-time parishioner of St John the Evangelist, Armond Stanzoni, was thoughtful enough to share his memories & photographs, to recount what it was like growing up in this parish in the 1940's.

I came to Center Moriches when I was five years old and started first grade at SJR in 1941. My dad, Ernie Stanzoni, owned the Mastic Supply Store, which specialized in concrete products and services. He also started the Mastic Sports Club which had about 40 kids. If any child needed cleats, baseball gloves, bats or any other equipment he would buy it for them. Every summer, he would take the kids to Ebbets Field for a ball game.

I attended St. John's Catholic School which at the time was at the corner of Brookfield Avenue and Main Street. It was a big schoolhouse, with four large classrooms, with one nun teaching two grades in each classroom. My dad built the grotto for the Blessed Mother, which was located on the east side of the property, along the fence. Dad wasn't particularly religious, but he made sure I got a good Catholic education. I remember three of the nuns that taught there, Sr. Rose Adelie, who taught 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> grades.

Sr. Miriam Bernard who was the principal and Sr. Stella Vincent who taught 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> grades. I remember the beautiful convent on the north side of Main Street, next to the Firehouse. It was eventually replaced by the 'new Bohack's supermarket'. Today, the CVS drug store is there. All of the students were expected to attend the 9am Sunday Mass each week, and your attendance was noted by one of the nuns.

The class picture featured is the graduating class of St John the Evangelist,  $8^{\text{th}}$  graders in June of 1948. Armond is in the back row, third from the right.

Our SJE community of families will be joining together in several service and faith filled events this November!



Please look over these readings and consider these reflection questions before coming to Mass next Sunday.

### First Reading + Exodus 17:8-13

In this reading some people were at battle and some—Moses, Aaron and Hur—were at intercessory prayer and action. The outcome of the battle was determined by the prayer. How important do you think prayer is to the success of your ministry? How important is prayer to anything you do?

### Second Reading + 2 Timothy 3:14-4:2

What task does Paul lay on you in this reading? What instruction book does he give you to carry out the task? Is it "inconvenient" sometimes to proclaim the word of God by being patient and encouraging?

### <u>Gospel</u> + <u>Luke 18:1-8</u>

What does Jesus' injunction, "Pray always ... " mean to you? Do you think Jesus means only prayers of petition? What does Jesus want to make clear to you about petitioning God? Discuss this statement: "When you pray for rain, take an umbrella."

Tomorrow's Hope Foundation releases first-ever Impact Report for the Morning Star Initiative Report highlights academic growth and major investments in Catholic education

Uniondale, NY-Tomorrow's Hope Foundation (THF) has released an impact Report highlighting two years of investment and growth in Catholic elementary education on Long Island through the Morning Star Initiative (MSI), a joint effort between THF, the Marianists, and the Diocese of Rockville Centre, Department of Education, to revitalize the region's Catholic grade schools.

Guided by MSI's Four Pillars of Academic Excellence, a Robustly Catholic Culture, Safe and Supportive Communities, and Fiscally Sustainable Schools, Tomorrow's Hope Foundation has raised more than \$3.5 million from Long Island's top Catholic education funders, including a \$1 million leadership gift from Michael Pascucci, a Long Island-based businessman and philanthropist who credits his success to his Catholic education. Philanthropic support has provided the resources needed to fund scholarships, academic programs, local school needs, and other initiatives that yielded sharp improvements in math and reading levels, technology infrastructure, and enrollment in the 2021-22 academic year.

"Since MSI first launched, we have strengthened the academic rigor in our schools and stabilized enrollment despite the challenges that COVID-19 and the economy have presented. Without donor support, our success to date would never have been possible," said Bro. Tom Cleary, Chief Revitalization Officer, MSI.

Enrollment continued to rebound in the 2022-23 academic year at MSI pilot school, Our Lady of Guadalupe (OLG) with campuses in Deer Park and Central Islip, Long Island. Pilot initiatives at OLG include dual-language and free after-care programs, attracting an additional 100 students this year. With continued donor support, the MSI Team aims to build on this successful model by bringing these programs to other schools across Long Island to help increase Catholic elementary enrollment over the coming years.




