# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Shine like lights in the world...

# **VOTE!**

Dear Parish Family:

Each year, when an election comes around we can easily feel the tension increase. When it is a presidential election, it is all that much more intense. When it is 2020 and we reflect on all that we have gone through, it is overwhelming.

I want to share a few thoughts with you about voting. While the ideas are relevant to the upcoming election, they are applicable to any time we are asked to vote.

**First, VOTE**. Period. End of sentence. It is our moral obligation to vote after a time of prayer, discernment and formation. Make sure you are registered. If you are uncomfortable going out on November 3rd, you can still apply for an absentee ballot or you can vote early. The listing of places to vote early in our county (and maybe avoid lines or a wait on Election Day) can be found at the Suffolk County Board of Elections - https://suffolkcountyny.gov/Departments/BOE.

Second, listen to the Church, not to those who say they represent the Church or who say they represent the Church's teaching. Go to the sources. I recently received a mailing from an organization that had "Catholic" in its name. The mailing was designed as a voter registration packet and, when opened, not representative of the Truth of the Catholic faith or filled with information about how to vote. Because an organization or a commentator or even a member of the clergy uses or belongs to an organization containing words like "life", "Catholic", "peace", or "social justice" or others does not mean it is **Forming** representative of the Truth of the Catholic Church. Unfortunately, many take advantage of these terms. For Catholics, we rely on the teaching body of the Church – Consciences the Magisterium. This means we consider the entire Truth, not only areas we are passionate about or comfortable with and those that challenge our way of thinking and move us out of our comfort zone. I have purchased copies of Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. (They should be here by the weekend.) It was published in 2015 with an updated introduction in 2019. We have been posting excerpts from the introduction and a prayer each week. Copies are available at the doors of the Church and you can read it online here - Faithful https://www.usccb.org/issues-and-action/faithful-citizenship/forming-consciences-Citizenship

Third, Catholics are not single issue voters. Without a doubt, some issues are imminently more important than others. We begin and end with human life and dignity. It always kind of made sense to me that if one doesn't see the value of a life in the womb, at the beginning, and the importance of that life being born into the world, the rest of one's positions regarding important issues are sort of a like a house of cards that would quickly fall. At the same time, it makes sense to me that my advocacy for life would not end at birth. We must fully consider the Church's teaching on marriage, family life and the poor as well as its teaching on immigration and issues at the end of life (euthanasia, suicide, the death penalty, etc.) and everything in between in forming conscience to vote for the common good.

In their Introductory Note to *Faithful Citizenship*, the bishops state,

"In the United States and around the world, many challenges demand our attention. The threat of abortion remains our preeminent priority because it directly attacks life itself, because it takes place within the sanctuary of the family, and because of the number of lives destroyed. At the same time, we cannot dismiss or ignore other serious threats to human life and dignity such as racism, the environmental crisis, poverty and the death penalty."

This is not an easy time on so many levels. Please take time in these weeks to review the teaching of the Catholic Church, to pray for the gift of discernment to make the most informed choice you can make for the common good, and please vote!

Let's pray that, like our Gospel acclamation calls us, we will "Shine like lights in the world" by how we witness to others in these days and times.

#### Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship

The upcoming election – as each election should – calls us to deep discernment regarding the choices we make. The bishops of the United States of America wrote Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship in 2015. They have published an updated Introductory Letter for our consideration. I ask that you read it and the entire document carefully before voting this year. This week's excerpt -

In the United States and around the world, many challenges demand our attention. The threat of abortion remains our preeminent priority because it directly attacks life itself, because it takes place within the sanctuary of the family, and because of the number of lives destroyed. At the same time, we cannot dismiss or ignore other serioust hreats to human life and dignity such as racism, the environmental crisis, poverty and the death penalty. Our efforts to protect the unborn remain as important as ever, for just as the Supreme Court may allow greater latitude for state laws restricting abortion, state legislators have passed statutes not only keeping abortion legal through all nine months of pregnancy but opening the door to infanticide. Additionally, abortion contaminates many other important issues by being inserted into legislation regarding immigration, care for the poor, and health care reform. At our border, many arriving families endure separation, inhumane treatment, and lack of due process, while those fleeing persecution and violence face heightened barriers to seeking refuge and asylum. Within our borders, Dreamers, Temporary Protected Status (TPS) holders, and mixed-status and undocumented families face continued fear and anxiety as political solutions fail to materialize. Lawmakers' inability to pass comprehensive immigration reform which acknowledges the family as the basic unit of society has contributed to the deterioration of conditions at the border. As we seek solutions, we must ensure that we receive refugees, asylum seekers, and other migrants in light of the teachings of Christ and the Church while assuring the security of our citizens.

Merciful Father, Thank you for inviting each of us to join in your work of building the kingdom of love, justice, and peace. Draw us close to you in prayer as we discern your call in our families and communities. Send us forth to encounter all whom you love: those not yet born, those in poverty, those in need of welcome. Inspire us to respond to the call to faithful citizenship, during election season and beyond. Help us to imitate your charity and compassion and to serve as models of loving dialogue. Teach us to treat others with respect, even when we disagree, and seek to share your love and mercy. We ask this through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God forever and ever. Amen
