A Reflection on the Gospel: Mark 10:35-45

"To sit at my right or at my left is not mine to give but is for those for whom it has been prepared."

James and John (along with Peter) had become the 'inner core' of Jesus' group of disciples. They were the ones in the room when Jesus raised a little girl from the dead; and they were the ones who (on Mount Tabor) witnessed the Transfiguration. James and John had

such a close relationship with Jesus that they weren't afraid to ask to be where all souls long to be: as close to Jesus in Heaven as possible. Which one of us wouldn't want to be at Jesus' right, or at His left? In a way, James' and John's request had a childlike innocence to it.

As little children, the closer we were to our

parents, the safer we felt, because we knew they loved us beyond measure. It's only natural for us to seek that kind of closeness to Jesus.

Jesus said, "Rather, whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant."

Who is the greatest person in a child's life? The child would likely say that person is his or her parent; and who on Earth serves a child more than that child's mother and father? A good portion of a parent's love for his or her child is portrayed in the act of service; and the love of a parent is only a glimpse of the type of love God has for each of us. God, who is the greatest of all, came Himself not to be served "but to serve and to give His life as a ransom for many."

In this gospel, Jesus is trying to help the Apostles (and all of us) understand that everyone is connected through the love of God; and through Jesus we have all become brothers and sisters.

> A very wise man once told me that those who seek to serve never struggle to find a job. This is because there is always someone in need; and at any point, any one of us could become that someone. To serve is more than an opportunity; it is a privilege. Service brings people closer to one another

and, in turn, closer to God. The closest we can get to Jesus (outside of receiving the Eucharist) is to actually 'become His hands and feet' in service to others.

As far as our placement in Heaven, even if we were to see God from the furthest corner, our joy would be indescribable.

Jesus says to each one of us, "I have prepared a place for you." Every step we take in humble service on Earth is an upward step we take toward our place in Heaven.

CMA Frequently Asked Questions

WHAT ARE SOME OF THE WAYS MY GIFT MAY BE USED?

Gifts are used to live and share our faith, care for God's people and help to build God's Kingdom. For example, a gift of:

- \$25 helps pay the gas for a Meals-On-Wheels van to deliver food for a day.
- \$50 helps pay for evangelizing and teaching materials for a Campus Ministry participant.
- \$100 helps a low-income pregnant and parenting mother seek job training and life skills to support her family provided by Catholic Charities Regina Maternity Case Management Program.
- \$250 helps subsidize housing for a senior citizen or a developmentally disabled adult.
- \$1,000 helps support the formation of our Seminarians and Deacons.

HOW IS OUR PARISH GOAL SET?

An advisory committee of Pastors recommends the CMA goal formula by which parish goals are set. The formula for each parish is based on recent average offertory figures and the Consumer Price Index.

WHY SHOULD I GIVE TO THE APPEAL?

There are many important ministries and services that are beyond the resources of any one parish. It would be impossible for an individual parish to duplicate the scope of ministries and services provided by the Diocese. In the same way as our own households require steady income, our Diocese needs funds to keep vital programs open and operating and to create new ministries and services. Essential to our Church and diocese is the education and formation of our priests and deacons. The Catholic Ministries Appeal funds programs that support and expand vocations to the priesthood and diaconate. Respect Life initiates have been strengthened through prayer, education, witness and support services, which are essential in our culture.

Many families in our community are in need because of the lack of equitable wages, high cost of housing and the surge in food and energy costs. These conditions do not allow them to be economically self-sufficient and many families do not qualify for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program benefits. Programs supported by the Catholic Ministries Appeal are valuable resources to these families and individuals. Every gift counts no matter the amount!

HOW MUCH SHOULD I GIVE?

Every gift, no matter the size, helps make a difference. Only you can decide your gift size. Prayerfully consider an amount that you can afford to give each month. Pledging allows you to make a larger-sized gift without stretching your monthly budget. Whatever your gift, we appreciate your contribution. In 2021 the average gift to the Catholic Ministries Appeal was \$330.

I'D RATHER GIVE DIRECTLY TO MY PARISH OR PASTOR THAN TO THE CMA.

Through the Catholic Ministries Appeal, all parishes unite and become the instruments of God's love as we support and sustain the essential programs and services which educate the young, care for our seniors, feed the hungry, and strengthen our Catholic faith in our homes, parishes and communities within our wider Long Island community.

Additionally, the CMA gives back a share of the donated funds to individual parishes. Parishes that meet their Appeal goals receive rebates that can be used at their discretion. Some parishes use the rebate for general operating expenses; others make special purchases, such as improving technology, altar linens, or capital improvements, such as doors, lighting and or making parish centers more accessible for people with disabilities. Last year parishes received back more than \$1.5 million in rebates. When giving to the Appeal, donors are simultaneously giving to their parish and to others in need in our shared faith community.

A Message from Msgr. Walden...

It is wonderful to feel good and look good. Many things make us look good but what really brings us joy? We see two of Jesus' Apostles, James and John, in today's Gospel (Mark 10:35-45) seeking to have places of honor in Jesus' Kingdom by sitting on His right and left in the Kingdom. At this point, they do not have the complete picture of who Jesus is and what His kingdom is all about. The description we hear of the Messiah, who Jesus obviously is, in the first reading today (Isaiah 53:10-11), is not one anyone would want to be associated with at first glance: "The LORD was pleased to crush him in infirmity. If he gives his life as an offering for sin, he shall see his descendants in a long life, and the will of the LORD shall be accomplished through him. Because of his affliction he shall see the light in fullness of days; through his suffering, my servant shall justify many, and their guilt he shall bear." Pain, suffering, and injustice are hard enough to deal with when we are inflicted with them, but to willingly embrace them for the good of others and with others is what Jesus' Kingdom is about. It is not that we get up each day and think, "How can I suffer today?", but how we embrace and deal with difficulties, problems, and suffering when we are confronted with them.

The older we get the more we see how good, inspiring, and courageous it is when we act graciously, humbly, generously, and mercifully. When we sincerely act in any of these ways in our lives we know the power, determination, and unconditional love of Jesus. When Jesus was dying on the cross, the thought of those who crucified Him was, "We lose!" What win, you was Jesus response? "Father, forgive them they know not what they do!" (Luke 23:34). As we reflect on today's Gospel it is quite clear that James and John had no idea that love, forgiveness, humility, and sacrifice are what the Kingdom of God is all about. It is not that God commands us to be humble, forgiving, and willingly to sacrifice. He invites us, as Jesus did to James and John in today's Gospel, to be a real and life

giving part of God's Kingdom. The more we who are believers accept that challenge the more present God's Kingdom is



in our world. It is not that we look to be honored and thanked, but that we are honored and thankful for all those opportunities that come our way everyday in small and big ways. How blessed we are as our family, friends, and acquaintances bless us with their presence and love, and offer us opportunities to do the same for them everyday. In an atmosphere where God is pushed into the background and not wanted, it is very challenging, a privilege and an honor to be part of His life, to encounter Him in the Sacraments, to open our hearts to Him in prayer everyday, and to know, experience, share and be His love.

Again I offer these encouraging and nourishing words from Psalm 63:

O God, you are my God, for you I long; for you my soul is thirsting. My body pines for you like a dry, weary land without water. So I gaze on you in the sanctuary to see your strength and your glory.

For your love is better than life, my lips will speak your praise. So I will bless you all my life, in your name I will lift up my hands. My soul shall be filled as with a banquet, my mouth shall praise you with joy.

On my bed I remember you. On you I muse through the night for you have been my help; in the shadow of your wings I rejoice. My soul clings to you; your right hand holds me fast. Glory...

Psalm Prayer: Father, creator of unfailing light, give that same light to those who call to you. May our lips praise you; our lives proclaim your goodness; our work give you honor, and our voices celebrate you for ever.
