

# A Message from the Coordinator of Family Ministry...



It was just about one year ago that I accepted the position as Coordinator of Family Ministry here at St. John's, and I can honestly say that it has been an absolutely wonderful year. The blessings have been too many to count. I have had the privilege of working with the children and families of our parish through our Faith Formation program, Children's Liturgy of the Word, Vacation Bible Camp, Moms on the Journey and through a wonderful variety of Family Life Ministry prayer services, activities and events.

I have worked alongside faith-filled and dedicated staff members and volunteers, all of whom have witnessed to the power of the Holy Spirit at work in our parish. I have also had the privilege of being part of an amazing pastoral team, the members of which have

welcomed me, taught me, supported me and loved me. They have become my extended family. I have been blessed by the brilliant, compassionate and nurturing leadership of two wonderful pastors. For all of this...I am so very grateful.

Now if you know me, you know that I am rarely at a loss for words. And truth be told...I often have too many words to share. But I wanted to find ONE word to summarize my experiences over the course of this past year. So many words came to mind...but I have chosen the word HOPE!

Merriam-Webster defines <u>HOPE</u> as: "cherish a desire with anticipation: to want something to happen or be true. To expect with confidence: Trust!" In the Catechism of the Catholic Church, HOPE is explained as "the theological virtue by which we desire and expect from God both eternal life and the grace we need to attain it."

When I reflect on this past year, I see both definitions of HOPE alive and well here at SJE. My work here allows me to focus on the most important things in my life: God, children, family and faith! When I work with the children I see their anticipation of good things. I see it in their smiling faces and their little hands wildly waving in the air to volunteer an answer. They are expecting, with confidence, that good things will happen. When we teach them about different components of our beautiful faith, they trust in the scriptures...they want it to be true. Our parish kids are an AWESOME source of HOPE! When I work with the parents and families, I see the desire to grow closer to Jesus and to grow in the faith. There is a yearning...a willingness to learn...a desire to be connected... to seek God's guidance and to rely on His grace to keep us moving forward along our journey to Heaven. They are filled with HOPE!

And isn't HOPE the message in today's readings? We are reminded that our God is a just God who hears our prayers....all our prayers... and the prayers of all. We have a God who stands by us, gives us strength and rescues us from every evil. We have a Merciful, Loving God who invites us over and over and over again to encounter Him here in this holy place; to come into communion with Him. We need only to put our burdens, our failings, our needs, and our dreams before Him and open our hearts to receive His grace and mercy. We have a God who created us to be with Him forever. We have many reasons to hope!

So in a world that, all too often, spreads negativity and despair, let us continue to be a people of hope. Let's journey together as a parish family... loving our God and one another.... willingly using our gifts to serve wherever needed...and like the tax collector, coming to this holy place ready to humble ourselves and accept God's mercy and grace. Let's pray for each other. It's the last week of October-let's pray a rosary and ask our Blessed Mother to intercede for our parish family!



# Month of Remembrance...

### Special All Souls Parish Mass of Remembrance

We will celebrate a special All Souls Parish Mass of Remembrance on All Souls Day, Tuesday, November 2 at 7:00 p.m. At this Mass we will pray by name for all who have died in our parish community over the past year. All families who have celebrated a funeral Mass at SJE in the past year are being specially invited, and all parishioners, whether or not they have experienced a loss, are invited to come and join in prayer. Following the Mass, all are welcome for hospitality. Please consider participating in this Mass to join together in prayerful solidarity with our brothers and sisters who have lost a loved one in the past year.

### Altar of Remembrance

During the month of November, we remember in a special way our loved ones who have died. This year, we will be preparing a special Altar of Remembrance in the Seton Chapel. *Beginning November 1st, you are invited to place a picture on the altar so that we may remember your loved ones and pray for each other.* Please limit the size of your photo (perhaps no larger than 4 x 6) so that there is room for everyone who wishes to participate. You may place the picture in a small frame. Please remember to write your name and phone number on the back of the picture. Pictures may be dropped off at the rectory or at the sacristy. *We ask that you pick up your picture no later than Wednesday, November 30.* 

#### All Souls Day Novena



# St. John the Evangelist Parish

# Did you know...





A long-time parishioner of St John the Evangelist, Armond Stanzoni, was thoughtful enough to share his memories & photographs, to recount what it was like growing up in this parish in the 1940's.

I came to Center Moriches when I was five years old and started first grade at SJR in 1941. My dad, Ernie Stanzoni, owned the Mastic Supply Store, which specialized in concrete products and services. He also started the Mastic Sports Club which had about 40 kids. If any child needed cleats, baseball gloves, bats or any other equipment he would buy it for them. Every summer, he would take the kids to Ebbets Field for a ball game.

I attended St. John's Catholic School which at the time was at the corner of Brookfield Avenue and Main Street. It was a big schoolhouse, with four large classrooms, with one nun teaching two grades in each classroom. My dad built the grotto for the Blessed Mother, which was located on the east side of the property, along the fence. Dad wasn't particularly religious, but he made sure I got a good Catholic education. I remember three of the nuns that taught there, Sr. Rose Adelie, who taught 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> grades.

Sr. Miriam Bernard who was the principal and Sr. Stella Vincent who taught 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> grades. I remember the beautiful convent on the north side of Main Street, next to the Firehouse. It was eventually replaced by the 'new Bohack's supermarket'. Today, the CVS drug store is there. All of the students were expected to attend the 9am Sunday Mass each week, and your attendance was noted by one of the nuns.

The class picture featured is the graduating class of St John the Evangelist,  $8^{\text{th}}$  graders in June of 1948. Armond is in the back row, third from the right.

## Readings for Next Sunday— 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### First Reading + Wisdom 11:22-12:2

"For you love all things that are and loathe nothing that you have made." What things do we think of when we hear this? If God's attitude toward every created thing is love, what is your attitude? Do you show reverence for creation? For your neighbor?

#### Second Reading + 2 Thessalonians 1:11-2:2

When you are "shaken out of your mind suddenly" on your spiritual journey, do you think God can use your fellow believers or even non-believers to help you out? Give some examples of how this might work.

#### **Gospel** + Luke 19:1-10

A man climbs a tree in order to see. A holy man goes to a "sinner's" house for dinner. A repenting person gives half of all his possessions to the poor. How do you explain these events? Does knowing Jesus Christ elicit extraordinary behavior from you? What?




