



# A Reflection from our Pastor, Fr. Patrick...

### 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Pharisee and the Tax Collector (Luke 18:9-14)

The purpose of a parable is to invoke a response! Jesus taught by way of parables, referring to images and situations that people can easily relate to and identify with. He used parables to help us find ways to seek His Kingdom first. The purpose of a parable is to help us to turn our lives around for the better and to see the world as God sees it. They help us grow in our spirituality. They motivate us to grow in our relationship with the Lord and to make the necessary changes that we need to make in order to allow God to have a more central part in our lives.

Although today's parable needs no real explanation, it still serves as a reality check for all of us to see where we need to grow in our personal relationship with God. The Pharisee in today's gospel represents all of those who are more concerned in just fulfilling one's religious obligations than seeking the Kingdom first. He is more concerned about looking out for himself and making sure that he looks good before others while fulfilling his religious obligations than seeking justice for others. Whereas the tax collector represents all of those who desire a change of heart. He represents every sinner who wants to start over again. He represents all of those who want to enter into a relationship with God.

At times, maybe we identify with the Pharisee who just wants to do what is expected when it comes to fulfilling religious obligations. We want to come to mass each week, say our daily prayers and give generously. All of this is good and important in advancing the Kingdom of God. We need to come to mass and participate in the celebration of the Eucharist because these rituals are our pathway to encounter God more fully. No question we need to say our prayers to stay connected to the Lord and support our churches financially. However, as important and as essential as these rituals and traditions are for living a good Christian life, if we do not approach liturgy and our prayer life with open and contrite hearts, then the desired end will be lost. We will not feel closer to God if our hearts are hardened and self-righteous, if our hearts are not pure and sincere.

The tax collector, however, who represents all of us sinners in need of repentance, has a desire for change. He recognizes how merciful and understanding God is and His desire to be one with us. Unlike the Pharisees who draw attention to themselves in selfish ways and are often judgmental towards others, the tax-collector draws his attention directly to God, not himself. He understands his need for forgiveness and his utter

dependence upon God.

The big question for us is, who do we often identify with? The humble tax collector (a sinner) or a disingenuous Pharisee (self-righteous know-it-all)? Maybe at times, both. Maybe we rely more on ourselves at times and less on God, and vice versa. Again, we can have the desire and make the effort to fulfill all of our religious obligations and spend countless hours in prayer and reflection. But if our hearts are self-righteous and not sincere, we will not inherit the Kingdom of God. We will not feel any closer to God than when we first started praying. It will be a lost opportunity for spiritual growth and renewal. God cannot be found in the pompous circumstances. We cannot enter more deeply into the mysteries of God. Yet, the more we recognize our utter dependence and reliance on God, the happier we will be in life. God will live and remain in our hearts if our hearts are filled with love, wonder and gratitude.

The truth is, we are always in need of God and repentance. The irony here and the point that Jesus is making for us is that we are all sinners in need of God's mercy and forgiveness regardless of who we are. In the end, it is all about seeking God's Kingdom first and a greater conversion of heart. But unless we have the right and proper disposition when approaching God in prayer and when we gather together for sacred liturgy, God will remain at a distance and become more abstract in our lives. Yet, if we have the right and proper disposition in fulfilling all of our religious obligations and our motives are pure, sincere and genuine, then God will remain close to us and make us whole again. God will bring new joy and new life into our hearts. God will live among us and within us.



\*\*PARISH UPDATE \*\* - This weekend is CMA (Catholic Ministries Appeal) video weekend. This video highlights where all the resources go that we collect. A generous portion goes to Catholic Charities and towards the formation of priests and deacons. It also helps fund the many different youth programs that our diocese offers and for the ongoing maintenance and upkeep of the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception where many diocesan events and retreats are held throughout the year.

With just under 2 ½ months to go, we are currently around 75% of our goal. Last year at this time we were at 80%. I am optimistic we can reach our goal of 100% again if we all participate in this annual fundraiser. Once we reach 80%, everything else collected up to 100% comes back to us in a generous rebate. If we reach our goal, we will receive \$24,000 like we did last year. We used last year's rebate of \$24,000 towards the cleaning (power washing) of the outside of the entire church during this past summer, along with the major work of sealing the church's parking lot. If your means allow, please join me in supporting this year's CMA. Please take a brochure from any one of the exits of the church and mail in your gift. It is not too late, and no gift is too small. Thank you for your consideration.

I hope and pray that everyone is having a nice autumn with your families! When I went to Arlington, Texas this past September with Msgr. Walden and my close friend Danny, I kept our parish family in my prayers, especially when celebrating mass. It was fun to visit AT&T Stadium where the Dallas Cowboys play and attend three Major League ball games at Globe Life Field where the Texas Rangers play. What beautiful venues! One afternoon we went for lunch at Stockyards in Fort Worth. It was clear and 94 degrees when we arrived.

Once again, a big thanks for supporting this year's Summer Appeal! Your generosity towards this annual appeal is greatly appreciated. Moreover, please pray for the candidates from the ninth grade in our Faith Formation who will be receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation with Bishop Barres here on Friday November 7<sup>th</sup>. What an exciting time in these candidates' lives! The Spirit will be alive here at St. John's. Finally, please join us in Seton Chapel anytime from 3-7 PM on Tuesday, October 28<sup>th</sup> when we will have the exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. That evening, we will be praying for all the priests of our diocese. In addition, on Friday November 14<sup>th</sup> at 7 PM in our church, we will be hosting a diocesan Holy Hour praying for vocations to the priesthood and religious life. Vocation Director, Fr. John Crozier, will lead us in prayer and reflection. Hope to see you there!



### Book of the Names of the Dead



# Order of Christian Initiation for Adults [OCIA]

Do you know someone who is interested in becoming Catholic?

Jesus said to his apostles, "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" (Matthew 28:19). The Good News of salvation in Jesus Christ is meant for all peoples, and the Catholic Church is open to all who believe. A non-Christian becomes a Catholic by baptism, and non-Catholic Christians who are already baptized in the Name of the Trinity enter fully into the Catholic Church by receiving Confirmation and Eucharist. These three Sacraments of Initiation are given to adult candidates once a year on the most Solemn Feast of Easter.


The preparation to become a Catholic through the Easter sacraments, known as the OCIA, involves coming to know the faith taught by the Church, and by prayer and ritual receiving the grace to commit to living that faith. The process of entering into the Catholic Church through OCIA at St. John the Evangelist is beginning soon and will extend to the end of March 2026. That process includes informal classes on the Catholic Faith and a time of prayerful discernment for each inquirer to embrace the fullness of Catholic teaching and freely commit to becoming Catholic. Admission into the Catholic Church for those who sustain their desire to join her throughout the process will take place at the Easter Vigil, on Saturday, April 4, 2026. During the last six weeks (the holy Season of Lent) before admission at Easter, candidates will be formally commit to being baptized at Easter and will be welcomed by the faith community.



# A Message from Msgr. Walden...


Where do we feel welcome? Who do we readily welcome into our presence, mind, thoughts, and heart? We can usually tell by the expression on someone's face or their tone of voice how welcome we are in their presence. There is quite a bit of difference between the expression, "I am so happy to see you", and the expression, "What are you doing here?" In the Gospel for today's Mass (Luke 18:9-14), we have the familiar parable of two people going to the temple to pray. The seemingly "religious one" has no problem about announcing his presence to God. But far from being humble, he contrasts himself with the tax collector. The last thing we can do in the presence of God is to present ourselves as better than someone else. That is not prayer but a prideful, false faith that is merely going through the motions. None of us is perfect, but we are very capable of generosity, sharing our goodness, kindness, time, attention, and resources with one another. The tax collector recognized his need for the mercy and love of God while the pharisee made it clear that God owed him congratulations and recognition.

The two thoughts to ponder are: "How welcome do I feel in the presence of God?" and "How welcoming am I to God and His presence?"

The first thing to focus on when we pray is how blessed we are to freely and attentively be in God's presence. Just as we welcome those who are an integral part of our lives in spite of distractions, disagreements, arguments, and harsh words at times, so are we welcome into God's presence in spite of our inability to focus attentively on who He is, how much He loves us, and how grateful He is to be attentive to us. The more we can put aside physical objects and negative thoughts and feelings, the more peace and hope we find. The truth is to find who we truly are and how meaningful and joyful our lives can be, even in the most trying of times, we need to find and take the time and make the time to think, speak, and listen from the depths of our hearts. We will see how blessed we are, how generous God is, how generous we can be, and that God is a blessing to us and for us so we can be that blessing to and for those He entrusts to our presence.

The words of the tax collector are key: "Be merciful to me a sinner." That prayer is only answered when we see the need and take the initiative to be generous with our time, talent, attention, and physical and mental resources. There is so much in our world to get us upset, angry, and spiteful with our words, actions, and thoughts. The tax collector could only recognize his need for God's mercy because he humbly and sincerely saw the truth of his shortcomings and allowed God's love to raise him up. The more we are open, attentive and honest in prayer, the more can see the blessings and hope we have and the blessings and hope we can be for all those who touch our lives everyday. As I keep saying, take the time to look for three blessings you

experience at the end of each day. How good it is when we recognize how we were the source and presence of a blessing for those who lives we touch.



My soul, give thanks to the Lord all my being, bless his holy name. My soul, give thanks to the Lord and never forget all his blessings. It is he who forgives all your guilt, who heals every one of your ills, who redeems your life from the grave, who crowns you with love and compassion, who fills your life with good things, renewing your youth like an eagle's. The Lord does deeds of justice, gives judgment for all who are oppressed. He made known his ways to Moses and his deeds to Israel's sons. The Lord is compassion and love, slow to anger and rich in mercy. His wrath will come to an end; he will not be angry for ever. He does not treat us according to our sins nor repay us according to our faults. For as the heavens are high above the earth so strong is his love for those who fear him. As far as the east is from the west so far does he remove our sins. As a father has compassion on his sons, the Lord has pity on those who fear him; for he knows of what we are made, he remembers that we are dust. As for man, his days are like grass; he flowers like the flower of the field; the wind blows and he is gone and his place never sees him again. But the love of the Lord is everlasting upon those who hold him in fear; his justice reaches out to children's children when they keep his covenant in truth, when they keep his will in their mind. The Lord has set his sway in heaven and his kingdom is ruling over all. Give thanks to the Lord, all his angels, mighty in power, fulfilling his word, who heed the voice of his word. Give thanks to the Lord, all his hosts, his servants who do his will. Give thanks to the Lord, all his works, in every place where he rules. My soul, give thanks to the Lord!




### Women's Group...


