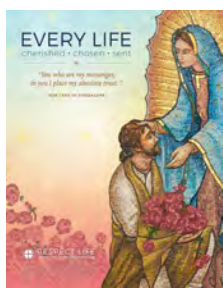
FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Respect Life + Rosary + Bullying Prevention + Confirmation

AN ONGOING OCTOBER!

Dear Parish Family:

October is a busy month for the Church. There are a number of themes that run through it. Some I am aware of. Some I just learned of in my new role as Principal of OLQA. These emphases are good ones. They focus and direct us. I wonder though if there is a tendency in us to say "Well...that's over." Let's move on to November and all that month brings. I hope it's not that way for you. It shouldn't be for you or for us as a parish community.



Respect Life Month. We focus, as a church, a good deal of energy on Respect Life Month and we should. We're probably a little distracted these days as a Church but we really don't have time for this distraction. There are pregnant moms in need of support, unborn children in danger, poor and hungry in need, death row inmates in need of justice, the dying in need of care and so many more life issues in need of our attention. Let's not waver. As a matter of fact, let's get even more committed. Have you volunteered in Parish Social Ministry yet? Have you learned more about our Pro-Life group? Have you joined the Catholic Action Network yet? What are you waiting for?

Bullying Prevention. This past week at OLQA, we recognized Bullying Prevention Week. It's not a one week process I assure you. It's one that requires constant attention and vigilance. It's also not something limited to kids in middle school. Adults are not much better. If you're not so sure, hop online. There are bullies of all types, particularly Catholic ones! If I'm honest, I'm not too far away from earning that title at times. I have to watch it. Maybe you do too? We're fortunate to be able to make the connection between Bullying Prevention and Respect Life Month. Neither should this end on Wednesday.



Rosary. I try to pray the Rosary every day. I sometimes fail. I forget, to be honest. No excuse. Sometimes I fall asleep half way through. Sometimes I look at an image of the Blessed Mother and say, "It's not happening today. I hope you understand." I know the difference it does make for me. If it makes that much of a difference in my life, imagine the difference it would make if we all prayed it? Pope Francis asked us to pray the Rosary, the Sub Tuum Praesidium and the Prayer to St. Michael the Archangel throughout October for the Church. Does our emphasis have to end on October 31st? I hope not. Maybe it will inspire us to pray these prayers each day. I have put in a graphic that might be worth cutting out. It's on page 4.



Confirmation. This past Tuesday, we celebrated the Sacrament of Confirmation at SJE. What a great day for our parish as over two hundred young people and their families came together to complete their initiation into the Catholic Church. What a gift for us. I am a realist. I know not everyone will be back right away. I live in hope, though. I pray the seeds planted, and hopefully watered and nourished at the celebration this past Tuesday, will take root in our young people.

It doesn't need to end this October—for them, for you or for me.

All families who have celebrated a funeral Mass at SJE in the past year are being specially invited, and all parishioners, whether or not they have experienced a loss, are invited to come and join in prayer. Following the Mass, all are welcome for hospitality. Please consider participating in this Mass to join together in prayerful solidarity with our brothers and sisters who have lost a loved one in the past year.

ALL SOULS DAY NOVENA

All Souls Day Novena envelopes are now available. These envelopes are a meaningful way for you to have your deceased loved ones prayed for in the Novena of Masses for All Souls Day. Take an envelope, fill out the name of the deceased, and return the envelope with your donation. Envelopes may be returned either in the collection basket or at the rectory. Special Masses will be offered for nine (9) days throughout the month of November for these intentions for the deceased.

ALTAR OF REMEMBRANCE

During the month of November, we remember in a special way our loved ones who have died. This year, we will be preparing a special Altar of Remembrance in Our Lady's Chapel. *Beginning November 1st, you are invited to place a picture on the altar so that we may remember your loved ones and pray for each other.* Please limit the size of your photo (perhaps no larger than 4 x 6) so that there is room for everyone who wishes to participate. You may place the picture in a small frame. Please remember to write your name and phone number on the back of the picture. Pictures may be dropped off at the rectory or at the sacristy. *We ask that you pick up your picture no later than Friday, November 30.*

The St. Genesius Guild

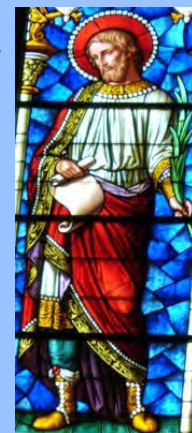
St. Genesius of Arles is the patron saint of secretaries. He mastered the art of shorthand, transcribing court cases for the archives of the Roman Empire.

FORMING MINDS AND HEARTS

Children's Liturgy of the Word

We want to do more to reach out to young people and their families! Soon, we would like to start the Children's Liturgy of the Word at the 9 a.m. Mass on Sundays.

How does it work?

In a nutshell, young children are invited forward after the Collect (Opening Prayer) and are sent forth to another place to hear the readings in a language that is a little easier for them. Catechists and other trained adults lead the children through the readings and a brief reflection. Children return to Mass after the Creed and Universal Prayer and remain with their families for the rest of the Mass.

What can I do?

We need adults and teens who love working with children and want to share God's Word with them approximately once every six weeks. There will be plenty of training and resources made available to you. You will always be working in a group!

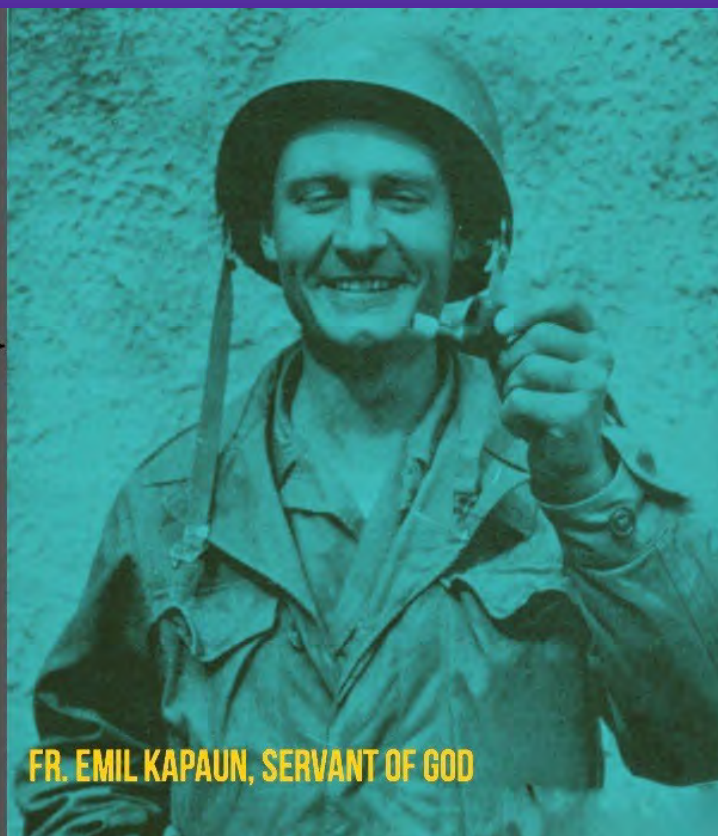

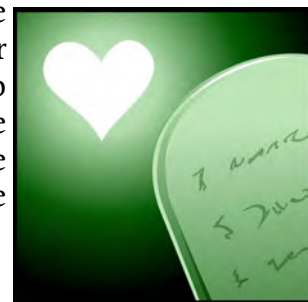
