A message from Fr. Patrick...

Gospel Reflection "Growing in Our Faith and Trust in God" ~ Luke 17.6

"If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you would say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you" (LK 17:6). After speaking to the crowds about the dangers of wealth and how our love for accumulating wealth can lead us to despair and utter unhappiness, Jesus today reminds us what is really essential in life and how we can truly be happy in this world and live lives that are joyful and meaningful.



Through the Image of the Mustard Seed, Jesus reminds us how essential it is for us to have faith, even if it is small like a mustard seed, because faith in God is what really matters in the end even if it's not so strong at times. Faith (and this is the point Jesus is illustrating for us today) even as small as a mustard seed, which is the smallest of all seeds has enormous power in God's Kingdom. It can move mountains. "You and say to a mulberry tree (which at times can be 70 feet tall with an extensive root system), 'be uprooted and planted in the sea' and it would obey you."

In other words, when we have faith in God, we can do anything! Anything is possible with the power of God because even trees with deep roots are not planted in the sea. Therefore, faith in God's redemptive power as little as it might be can do the impossible! And Jesus makes this point clear! It is that simple because it is faith that matters! It is faith that heals and faith that reassures. It is faith that saves us in the end and restores us to new life with God. It is faith and faith alone that makes us whole again and brings us new hope! It is amazing how much stronger and grounded our lives would be and how much happier we would be in our world today if we relied on our faith

more each day trusting in God's promise and providential care and not so much of the things of this world which leads us empty and stranded in the end.

The truth is, we are here today as a pilgrim church destined for eternity because of our faith and trust in God. It is amazing to think how much the faith has increased and has grown in our parish community during the last 125 years. We can only begin to imagine the relevance of today's image of a mustard seed signifying our potential to grow in our faith, when looking back at the history and origins of our church here in Center Moriches. How small the community of faith was back in 1898 in comparison to now and how it has grown tremendously over the past six generations to the big parish family that it is today. And how our faith and St. John's Church continues to give witness to our local community so that others can grow in their own faith in Christ.

We see how the Gospel today is being fulfilled in our midst here in the Moriches area, when we look to see how St. John's has grown to the size it is today because of the power of faith that has increased in size during these past twelve and half decades of parish life and ministry. It is faith that allows us to do extraordinary things for the church and humanity. It is faith that enables others to grow in their faith. It is faith that brings us joy in life and restored hope knowing how important it is to keep the Lord close in our lives! When we have faith and trust in God, we have everything! And when we do not have faith in God's saving power, we have nothing—nothing for the journey that will sustain us and strengthen us and reassure us of our greatest hope, new and eternal life!

To think that we are part of the history of faith that has developed here over many generations is extraordinary. To think that we are connected in some way with those that preceded us and served this parish well since the late 19th century is truly amazing. It is clear and evident right here how important and real and essential faith is and the implications it can have on our lives and the lives of others. We are the beautiful parish family that we are today –125 years later because of our faith and trust in Jesus and our love and concern for one another!

I would also like to take this opportunity on the weekend of my Installation as Pastor, to thank each one of you for your love and support over these past three months. You have been so kind and patient with me during my time of transition as I was settling in. This time has been wonderful and reassuring because in these few short months, I have witnessed your faith in Jesus and your love, and concern for one another. This is one of the reasons St. John's is so beautifully recognized all around the diocese, as well as the history and the spirit that continues to flourish here each day.

Finally, I would like to thank my family especially my parents for bringing me up in the faith and for always being there for me and my immediate family and for keeping us close all these years. Without their love and support I never would have been ordained to the Priesthood or be here with you today. I am so blessed to be assigned so close to them and have the opportunity to visit them often especially after a busy day of ministry here at St. John's to either watch the news or a Met game together. I will always be grateful to them and all of you and my closest friends for being a big part of my life and priesthood! I promise to pray for all of you and your families each day! Thank you again for everything and for allowing me to serve you in my role and duty as pastor.



Did you know ...

Below is some neat history about St. John's that was unknown to most of us on the 125th Anniversary Committee, but well recalled by longtime resident, parishioner, and graduate of St. John the Evangelist school, Bob Salomone.

In the summer months of the early 1960s, St. John's had a weekly Sunday Mass which was offered at the Eastport American Legion Hall. I believe it was done to alleviate the crowding at the Center Moriches Church as well as a convenience to the people living in the more eastern parts of the parish.

I recall setting up the folding chairs every Saturday with my dad and others. After Mass on Sunday, all the chairs had to be put away. My Mom and other committee members would carefully launder and press the altar linens and set up the altar on wheels each week.

Father Matthew Wisniewski comes to mind as the priest who most often made the big ride east to celebrate Mass. (Fr. Matthew was the Associate Pastor under Fr. Kowalski & Fr. Klarmann)

I was very young at the time, but my most vivid memory of it all was as the altar boy. The pads they gave us to kneel on were paper thin. Kneeling on that hardwood Legion floor was like doing your weekly penance!

We are ready and eager for fact checking on all of this if anyone can remember back that far! Let us know what you remember. Do you have a memory of St. John's, we would love to hear from you. History@SJEcm.org



Facilitated by Loretta Gallagher and Maureen Harney, our group will meet weekly on Wednesdays, for 8-10 weeks from 10am to 11:30 in the Convent. Our beloved Sister Ann started this group about 10 years ago and it has been a great support to many in our parish community who have suffered the death of a loved one. If you, or someone you know might benefit from this support community we hope that you will join us. Many of our current and former participants have shared that the second year can often be more difficult than the first, sometimes managing through the first few months with support from family and friends but realizing that others sharing the same feelings are often the best supporters. Most people also find that a group is most beneficial if started not sooner than three months after the death, however this is an individual decision, and all are welcome at any time. We do ask for a \$10 donation for the cost of the program materials. If an evening group works better with your schedule, please reach out, we are open to facilitating an additional program if there is interest.




WOMEN'S GROUP


