We will celebrate a special All Souls Parish Mass of Remembrance on All Souls Day, Wednesday, November 2 at 7:00 p.m. At this Mass we will pray by name for all who have died in our parish community over the past year. All families who have celebrated a funeral Mass at SJE in the past year are being specially invited, and all parishioners, whether or not they have experienced a loss, are invited to come and join in prayer. Following the Mass, all are welcome for hospitality. Please consider participating in this Mass to join together in prayerful solidarity with our brothers and sisters who have lost a loved one in the past year.

Altar of Remembrance

During the month of November, we remember in a special way our loved ones who have died. This year, we will be preparing a special Altar of Remembrance in the Our Lady's Chapel, in the church. Beginning November 1st, you are invited to place a picture on the altar so that we may remember your loved ones and pray for each other. Please limit the size of your photo (perhaps no larger than 4 x 6) so that there is room for everyone who wishes to participate. You may place the picture in a small frame. Please remember to write your name and phone number on the back of the picture. Pictures may be dropped off at the rectory or at the sacristy. We ask that you pick up your picture no later than Wednesday, November 30.

All Souls Day Novena

All Souls Day Novena envelopes are now available. These envelopes are meaningful way for you to have your deceased loved ones prayed for in the Novena of Masses for All Souls Day. A Message from the Director of Faith Formation ...

"[Zacchaeus] could not see him because of the crowd, for he was short in stature.

So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree in order to see Jesus,

who was about to pass that way." -Luke 19:4



Every time I hear the above verse from this Sunday's Gospel, I always chuckle. I can identify with Zacchaeus first and foremost because I, too, am "short in stature"! While I'm not sure I would be as brave as Zacchaeus was climbing that sycamore tree, this Gospel causes me to reflect on the deeper meaning. Where am I in my own relationship with God and what am I willing to do to see Him—to discover Him in the people and situations around me? It can be difficult to see God in the midst of our busy schedules, in our pain and grief, even in the those with whom we share our lives. But He wants us to seek Him, to make the effort. For Zacchaeus, it was climbing a tree. For us today, it may be as simple as making time in our

schedule for daily prayer or volunteering in a ministry to help serve the community.

The second part I love about this Scripture passage is Jesus' response. Of all the people there, Jesus saw Zacchaeus and his efforts to get a glimpse of Him. One might even imagine Jesus being amused by the sight of this grown, wealthy man sitting in a tree. We may also imagine Jesus being pleased at Zacchaeus' dedication. Jesus asks Zacchaeus to come down and tells him that He will be staying at Zacchaeus' house that day. How might we respond if the Lord asked the same of us? Would we ask Jesus to wait until our house was all clean and properly prepared? Or would we be like Zacchaeus who "came down quickly and received Him with joy" (Luke 19:6)? Will we allow Jesus to come into the mess our lives, confident that He will help us and bring salvation to our house as He did to Zacchaeus? This Gospel also reminds us of God's willingness to forgive, perhaps calling us to encounter Him in the Sacrament of Reconciliation where we receive His Mercy. And finally, it shows God's desire to make a home in us—to live and dwell within our hearts, especially when we receive Jesus truly present in the Sacrament of the Eucharist.

Over the past two months, we have received many of our parish families with great joy in our Faith Formation program, which serves students in Grades 1-8! We have nearly 1,000 children enrolled in our Sacramental preparation and ongoing children's formation programs. I'm so grateful to all the parents, family members and friends who have made the faith a priority in their lives and the lives of their children, and come together with such a great spirit! Much appreciation and credit goes to our Faith Formation Team, including our staff members and volunteers who work so hard to help teach our young people and their families about God's love and how to live it out in their daily lives.

Please especially keep in your prayers our 138 students who will be receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation on November 3! One of the "catchphrases" of our "FEARLESS" Confirmation program is that "Confirmation is NOT graduation from Church!" We are indebted to the wonderful witness of our parish community—you who come to Mass, who provide support for those in need through our Parish Social Ministry and who teach our young people how to be true disciples. THANK YOU FOR YOUR WITNESS!

May we always be like Zacchaeus—who was not perfect, who acknowledged his faults, but also strove to make amends and welcomed our Lord with great joy! Let us also always be confident that the God who loves us immeasurably will greet us with great joy in return!



Second Reading + 2 Thessalonians 1:11-2:2

When you are "shaken out of your mind suddenly" on your spiritual journey, do you think God can use your fellow believers or even non-believers to help you out? Give some examples of how this might work.

Gospel + Luke 19:1-10

A man climbs a tree in order to see. A holy man goes to a "sinner's" house for dinner. A repenting person gives half of all his possessions to the poor. How do you explain these events? Does knowing Jesus Christ elicit extraordinary behavior from you? What?


