We will celebrate a special All Souls Parish Mass of Remembrance on All Souls Day, Tuesday, November 2 at 7:00 p.m. At this Mass we will pray by name for all who have died in our parish community over the past year. All families who have celebrated a funeral Mass at SJE in the past year are being specially invited, and all parishioners, whether or not they have experienced a loss, are invited to come and join in prayer. Following the Mass, all are welcome for hospitality. Please consider participating in this Mass to join together in prayerful solidarity with our brothers and sisters who have lost a loved one in the past year.

Altar of Remembrance

During the month of November, we remember in a special way our loved ones who have died. This year, we will be preparing a special Altar of Remembrance in the Church. Beginning November 1st, you are invited to place a picture on the altar so that we may remember your loved ones and pray for each other. Please limit the size of your photo (perhaps no larger than 4 x 6) so that there is room for everyone who wishes to participate. You may place the picture in a small frame. Please remember to write your name and phone number on the back of the picture. Pictures may be dropped off at the rectory or at the sacristy. We ask that you pick up your picture no later than Saturday, November 27th.

All Souls Day Novena

All Souls Day Novena envelopes are now available. These envelopes are a meaningful way for you to have your deceased loved ones prayed for in the Novena of Masses for All Souls Day. Take an envelope, fill out the name of the deceased, and return the envelope with your donation. Envelopes may be returned either in the collection basket or at the rectory. Special Masses will be offered for nine (9) days throughout the month of November for these intentions for the deceased.

Book of the Names of the Dead

Beginning November 1st, a special book will be placed inside Our Lady's Chapel for members of our parish community to write down the names of loved ones who have died.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

With all your heart...

CRUSHED ANGELS

Dear Parish Family:

I have mentioned that I started to read poetry. Some spiritual writers I read referenced some poems and one even suggested to try and read a poem a day. I have taken up that practice for the past few months. I'm not sure I get it all but it can provide another perspective on things. Recently, someone recommend a book entitled *I Heard God Laughing* which contains the writings of Hafiz, a Persian poet from the 1300s. Some of the poems are pretty funny, to be honest. I have one I'm going to use on All Saints Day.

My Sweet Crushed Angel

You have not danced so badly, my dear, Trying to hold hands with the Beautiful One.

You have waltzed with great style, My sweet, crushed angel, To have ever neared God's Heart at all.

Our Partner is notoriously difficult to follow, And even His best musicians are not always easy To hear.

So what if the music has stopped for a while.

So what

If the price of admission to the Divine Is out of reach tonight.

So what, my dear,

If you do not have the ante to gamble for Real Love.

The mind and body are famous For holding the heart ransom, But Hafiz knows the Beloved's eternal habits.

Have patience,

For He will not be able to resist your longing For long.

You have not danced so badly, my dear, Trying to kiss the Beautiful One.

You have actually waltzed with tremendous style, O my sweet,

Oh my sweet, crushed angel.

In the midst of preparing for this weekend's preaching, I came across the poem in the box to the left. I saw an interesting connection that has remained for a bit.

Take a minute and read the poem.

In the first reading and the Gospel this week, we pray with Law of Love. Both readings reference our need to love God and love neighbor. These commandments are not new to us. We hear them often. We probably repeat them often. We know we are expected to live out these commandments, as all of the others laws and commandments are based on them.

I think we can often measure our love of God (not always so easy to see) by how well we love our neighbor (sometimes easier to see). We can often be very pious and reverent in times of prayer and worship. This is good! Yet that reverence can disappear when we encounter a difficult person or meet someone we disagree with or disparage a leader and so on and so on. This is not good. This is the disconnection of the hypocrite.

There is another part to this that I think is also important to consider. If we love our neighbor we are messengers, i.e. angels. Angels are given their titles and names according to the message they bring.

Yet, this is hard. For at times the messenger of love—this is supposed to be you and me—is rejected or hurt or betrayed or ignored or hated or disregarded. We see many signs of this in the public square and likely in our own lives. This, in a word, is crushing. We can feel like a sweet, crushed angel.

How often we fall into despair, desolation, depression and the like? Some times, we give up! "Lord, give me a break....if you want this...how can I go through this? How can this family member reject me? How can this parent abandon me? How can this group hate me?" We see people leave the faith or the Church because of some type of a rejection or another. The hurt of loving our neighbor impacts our love of God.

Read the poem again.

Indeed there are times when we feel the price of admission to the Divine is too high. Again, we want to throw up our hands. Yet, if we have worked at always loving the other as our response to the love of God we will likely look back and say we "have not danced so badly" trying to draw nearer to God and to our neighbor. Perhaps those moments of being crushed or hurt or betrayed are some of the things that actually bring us to the place of utter dependence on God.

In those moments of loving God and the other, let us try to have patience. If we believe in the power of the Cross, we know it will not be long before our longing before the Lord is fulfilled. Sometimes the crushed angels are the most powerful messengers.

Please say a prayer for me, a fellow crushed angel!

Il Hallows' Day, the Solemnity of All Saints, or All Saints' Day is a celebration of all Catholic saints held on November 1 each year. "On this solemnity, we recall the holy men and women who, having completed their earthly journeys, now live forever with God. These saints, though not canonized, offer us models of abiding faith and love of God and neighbor" (Essential Guide to Seasons and Saints, 109).

In the Catholic Church, we are called to imitate and venerate saints because of their heroically virtuous lives, martyrdom, or their offering of life for others. But, what does veneration mean and why do we pray to the saints?

Veneration of the saints fosters our faith in God and does not detract from it. Rather, our faith in God is strengthen by our relationship with our brothers and sisters in the faith who are in heaven. The Church teaches that by imitating the virtues lived by the saints, the saints brings us closer to Christ. When we ask the saints to pray for us, we ask them to join their wills with the will of God and intercede for us here on earth. This is the Communion of Saints which we profess every Sunday in the Creed.

Parish Registration
