FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Respect Life Month

MY DESK

Dear Parish Family:

I have a few desks these days. I have one in the Rectory Office. I have a desk in my room where I live. I have a desk/table in the social work office of the school. They are different in size and shape and serve different purposes. Yet, they have one thing in common—they're usually a mess. Of course I know where everything is...or at least I can tell you this. I do have fits of clean ups where everything is taken off the desk, some type of cleaning solution is used and I am ready to begin again. This lasts for about three to four hours.

I can offer many reasons for this mess. I am busy. I am involved in many things. There are too many locations. It's not that important. I can figure it all out. I don't need a level space to write. The computer mouse will show up eventually.

We begin Respect Life Month this week. You can learn more about it on the cover and in other parts of the bulletin. Can I offer my desk as a non-threatening but simple approach to many of the respect life issues that draw some ire on all sides? If I cannot keep my desk clean (and you can add your own area of life that may be a bit disorganized or out of control here), then how I can ever be entrusted with deciding when life begins or ends? If there are the simple things of this life that I cannot manage, how can I ever make a decision about the things that belong to God? As human beings, we should not be dwelling in those places of God. We should never be standing in the place of God when it comes to life and death decisions. Period.

So when life ends and begins is not for me to decide (or you if you are reading this). If God has allowed life to be created who am I ever to say it is OK for that life to end? Who am I to get in God's way? This applies to some of the challenging issues that can arise in this area from contraception to abortion and even to the death penalty and euthanasia. Simply, we should not be making these decisions. These are not our calls. They're God's. (Of course, there are layers and layers of theological doctrines and tenets to support each of those issues and others. You can visit uscgb.org or drvclife.org to start that search.)

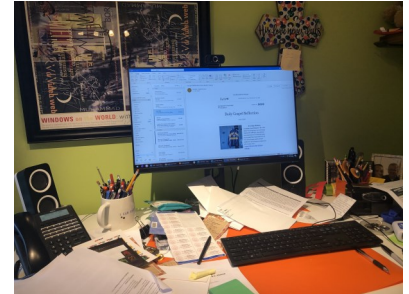
Is this simple? Easy to accept? Absolutely not. No one said it would be. To be a pregnant teenager or to be caring for a dying parent or child or to grieve the loss of a loved one at the hands of a crime.... none of these situations are easy. They shouldn't be. Life is involved.

I find some consolation in the image of St. Joseph for this year's Respect Life Month. We read around Christmas that Joseph was thinking about taking things in his own hands deciding to "divorce (Mary) quietly". Reminded by the voice of the angel to not be afraid, to trust in God's plan, and to know God is with us always, Joseph says YES (Matthew 1:18-25). The story of our salvation continues on to a manger in Bethlehem and a cross in Jerusalem. As hard as it was to do, Joseph accepts that it cannot be his way or his plan, but must be God's way and God's plan. Joseph, like each of us, must cooperate with that plan. This should inspire in us a spirit of cooperation in the form of service (support centers that care for pregnant women or providing support for hospice workers or visiting those in prison), witness (being part of movements approved by the Church like *40 Days for Life* or those that advocate for an end to the death penalty or lobbying to bring about end to the laws to support the taking of a human life) and always prayer (for those involved in these pain-staking decisions and for the conversion of those who perpetuate the lies that we are in control of the beginning and end of life).

Every now and then, I think I have the desk under control. It never lasts long. It reminds of my limitations and my humanity. Ultimately, a messy desk is not the gravest of concerns. It does however remind me of my limitations as a human being. If I cannot manage some pretty simple things, how can I ever be entrusted to determine the beginning or the end of life? That's not my place or yours. It's God's. It is our place to seek to cooperate (advocate/witness/serve) with the will of God and inspire (not judge, condemn and finger-point) others to do the same.

St. Joseph, defender of life, pray for us.

Please say a prayer for me.

3. You must attend one of the diocesan training sessions. If you wish to also bring Holy Communion to the sick and homebound, you must attend a separate "Specialized" training session.

St. Joseph

Faithful Protector of Mother and Child

The infant Christ “came into our world in a state of great vulnerability. He needed to be defended, protected, cared for and raised by Joseph” (PC 5). The humble and often hidden carpenter of Nazareth accompanied Mary in her pregnancy, assisted at the birth of the Messiah in a stable, presented Jesus in the Temple, fled with his family far from their homeland to protect them, and lovingly raised Jesus as his own son in the years to come.

While the angel of the Lord appeared to Mary to announce that she would bring forth the Savior of the world, it was revealed to Joseph in a series of dreams how God’s plans would be brought to fulfillment. As Pope Francis highlights, “God trusted Joseph, as did Mary, who found in him someone who would not only save her life, but would always provide for her and her child” (PC 5).

help us to
imitate your
faithful trust and
courage.

Like every other human family, the Holy Family had to confront real and concrete challenges. Yet, “in every situation, Joseph declared his own ‘fiat’” (PC 3). His “yes” to the Lord meant that regardless of the hardship and personal sacrifice to himself, he consistently chose to put the needs of Mary and Jesus before his own. Joseph’s devotion helps reveal to us our own call to show special care for the lives of those whom God has entrusted to us.

During this Year of St. Joseph, each of us can find in him “an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble” (PC, Intro). Joseph shows us how to say “yes” to life, despite our own fears, frailties, and weaknesses. For it is Joseph who was “chosen by God to guide the beginnings of the history of redemption. He was the true ‘miracle’ by which God saves the child and his mother” (PC 5).

May we, too, be miracles in the lives of those who are most in need, especially at the beginning and end of life. Dear St. Joseph, you who were “able to turn a problem into a possibility by trusting always in divine providence” (PC 5), help us to imitate your faithful trust and courage.

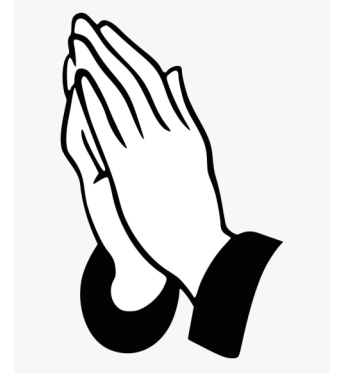
New Altar Server Training

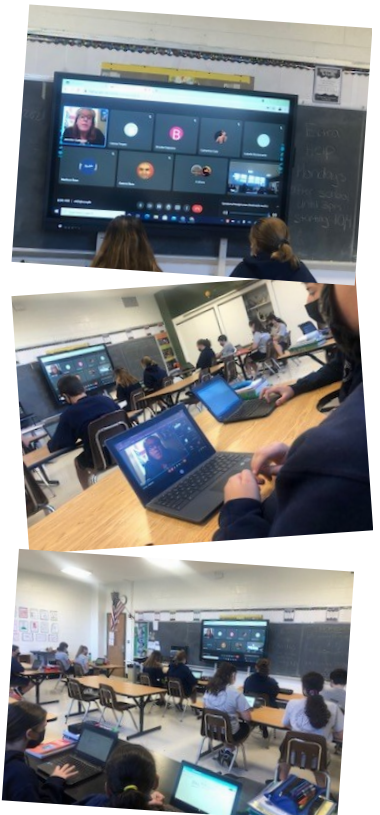

Students in REACH II participated in a virtual consultation meeting with Dr. Jennifer Gallagher, Superintendent of Schools in Long Beach, NY. Dr. Gallagher completed her doctoral dissertation at St. John's University examining the challenges of schooling for immigrants. In addition, Dr. Gallagher has worked as an 8th grade Catholic school teacher, Catholic school principal, principal of the Nativity School in NYC and now as superintendent in Long Beach. Students were able to ask questions about research processes in general as well as questions about their specific projects.

REACH (Research + Excellence + Academics + Catholicism + Hope) is a two year comprehensive research class that serves as a graduation requirements for students at the Catholic School in Center Moriches. Beginning in 7th grade, student select a topic, introduce it and conduct a comprehensive review of the literature. In REACH II, students will develop a methodology, carry out an organized project with the help of a mentor and present their finding in written and presentation form.

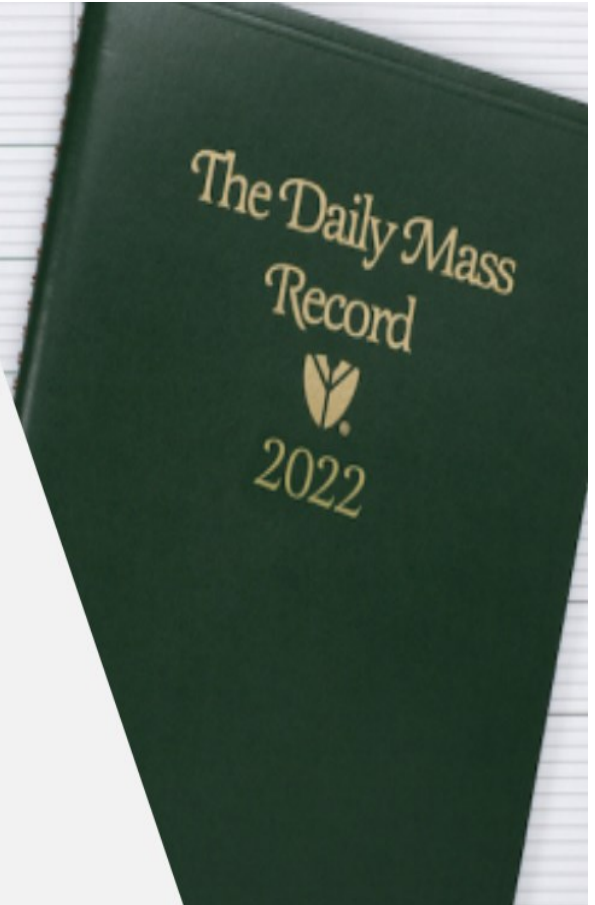

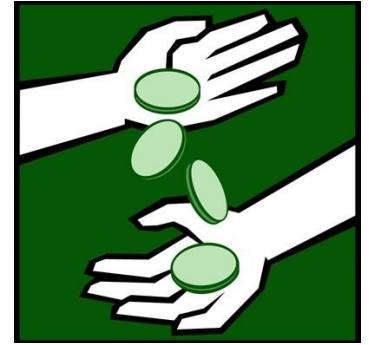
