A Reflection Deacon Ed Grieb...

27th Sunday in Ordinary Time 'Increase our Faith' (Luke 17:5-10)

Our readings this week speak to us about *Faith*, a gift from God that's been freely given, one we don't have to earn. Instead, it's something we want to respond to through love.

In our first reading, the Prophet Habakkuk is lamenting and questioning God about life around him; maybe not unlike what we may feel like doing at times. Habakkuk sees the injustice destruction, and violence surrounding him as Jerusalem comes under siege from the Babylonians. The Lord hears gives Habakuk and him encouragement to write down and pass on, 'the vision still has its time.....and will not disappoint....wait and it will surely come.' These words we can still take to heart today, a reminder for us to trust in God's plan. It's not difficult to see how, in the big picture, some things haven't changed over the centuries. Today, we see the conflict and war in Ukraine and the middle east, assassination, school shootings and crime/violence. But Holy Scripture is God's living word and continues to speak to us today, it can rekindle our own Faith.

The responsorial psalm today from Psalm 95 is a familiar one, it speaks to us about being attentive and listening for His guidance, if today you hear His voice, harden not your heart.' Hearing and listening for God's voice can be quite a challenge for us in today's world, finding quiet away from the distractions of the voices coming from our phones, TV, radio and social media. So we need to search out some time to quiet ourselves and listen for God's voice, a time to refrain from lamenting to God about all that is wrong and finding out what He suggests we do to confront problems and issues in our life and family.

In our second reading, St. Paul draws on his own experience of persevering in the face of opposition and confrontation in order to encourage Timothy to maintain his faith in order to protect the Christian community there in Ephesus against false prophets and teachings.

All three readings speak to us and remind us that God will Not Disappoint. Through Holy Scripture, the workings of the Holy Spirit and the assistance of one another, He encourages us to persevere through our challenges and difficulties.

Jesus conveys a similar message to His Apostles in today's Gospel passage from Luke. Jesus is on His journey to Jerusalem, knowing what awaits Him, and knowing that the Apostles must be appropriately prepared to carry on His work once He returns to the Father. In recent weeks past, we've heard Jesus speak to them in order to encourage them. He's spoken about, among other things, the demands of discipleship, the distraction that wealth and other matters can present us, and the need to remember the dignity of all people, especially those most in need in our communities. And after speaking to them about the ever-present temptation of sin, as well as the need to forgive, our Gospel today has the Apostles looking for help as they ask Jesus to 'increase their faith.' Without directly answering them or giving them what they believe they need, Jesus tells them they have been given the wonderful gift of Faith. He points them to the tiny mustard seed, that Faith even the size of a mustard seed can produce miraculous results when it's permitted and encouraged to grow.

But in addition to reinforcing the gift of faith they already have, Jesus goes a step further; reminding them to stay humble, remembering that the fruits of all their gifts are meant to be shared with others. This is the response that will strengthen our faith within our hearts so that we can always walk in Christ's light, listening for and following God's will.



Votive Candles/Altar Candles




Women's Group... our Wor

A Message from Msgr. Walden...

"Increase our faith." Those words are the beginning of today's Gospel (Luke 17:5-10) where the apostles voice this request to Jesus. Surely we would all like to have our faith increased. In a reflection I read from Pope Benedict XVI this week this statement puts things in a clearer light: "Catholics are not promised an "exterior" happiness but rather a deep interior security through communion with the Lord." We live in a world where we can all too easily allow ourselves to be bombarded with reports of violence, injustice, confusion, and criticism. Then there are those times where we simply surf the internet on sites that consume more time than we are aware of while doing it.

What do we mean when we ask God to increase our faith? Praying, spending time in communion with God, is not a duty to be checked off as an obligation taken care of. Just as we carry those we love in our hearts and they carry us in theirs, so we are always in the mind and heart of God. Our challenge is to find the time and place to allow Him into our hearts and to be uplifted by the thought that we are always in His heart. The key is to see that more than that I am with God, that God is with me. How often do we text one another and look for an instant reply? But those we love and who love us are always with us as we are with them. We pray for those we love, especially when there is sickness or trouble. We pray for our loved ones who have died as we continue to carry them in our hearts and look forward to reunion with them when we die. We pray for many people and things where things seem beyond our control. The other side of the coin, as in our interpersonal relationships, is to just think of the blessings we have and say thank you to God. When we have a close call and a danger passes do we pray: "Thank You When a problem is resolved or a relationship restored do we pray: "Thank You God!"? Just as thoughts of those we love

consciously go in and out of our minds everyday, so our faith enables us to see the hand of God. As I have



mentioned before, each night as I pray the night prayer from the breviary I begin by calling to mind three things that I am grateful for that day. Yes, we need to call to mind our faults, but what really lifts us up is recognizing the hand and presence of God in our day. Our interpersonal relationships that are life giving fill us with gratitude, inspiration, and joy.

Prayer is not a duty but a time to be renewed, enriched, inspired, and encouraged. How good it is to get beyond fitting prayer in and becoming more secure in our presence in His heart.

I offer Psalm 46 for our prayerful reflection:

God is for us a refuge and strength, a helper close at hand, in time of distress, so we shall not fear though the earth should rock, though the mountains fall into the depths of the sea; even though its waters rage and foam, even though the mountains be shaken by its waves.

The Lord of hosts is with us:
the God of Jacob is our stronghold.
The waters of a river give joy to God's city,
the holy place where the Most High dwells.
God is within, it cannot be shaken;
God will help it at the dawning of the day.
Nations are in tumult, kingdoms are shaken:
he lifts his voice, the earth shrinks away.
The Lord of hosts is with us:
the God of Jacob is our stronghold.
Come, consider the works of the Lord,

Come, consider the works of the Lord, the redoubtable deeds he has done on the earth. He puts an end to wars over all the earth; the bow he breaks, the spear he snaps.

He burns the shields with fire.

"Be still and know that I am God, supreme among the nations, supreme on the

Did you know that our new Baptism Program is up and running?

Here at St. John's we redesigned our Baptism Preparation program in January 2025. We wanted our program to be warm and welcoming, so we have included more interpersonal communication multiple opportunities for families to come to St. John's prior to the day of Baptism. Our mission is to make St. John's every family's home away from home, where we come together to worship our Almighty God, to learn about our amazing Catholic faith, to dive deeper in our personal relationship with Jesus and grow together as a parish family accepting, loving, supporting and serving each other, our local community and beyond. Baptism preparation program includes the following components:

- * Registration into the parish as a family
- * Complete the online Baptism registration for the child who is to be Baptized
- Attend an in-person Baptism
 Preparation class
- * Complete the online Baptism Belonging video course
- * Submit all required paperwork

When all requirements have been met, meet with a member of the Baptism Ministry to schedule a date for Baptism.



To be a godparent (or a sponsor for someone who is receiving Confirmation) a Catholic must meet the following requirements. Thes are not "guidelines" here at St. John's. These are the requirements of the universal Catholic Church and are the same all over the world. Different parishes may choose to document these requirements differently. The role of sponsor is an important one!The godparent (sponsor) must be a fully initiated Catholic who supports the person receiving the sacrament through their own example of Catholic living and a desire to help the person learn more about the Catholic faith through prayer, discussion and instruction. The Catholic Church has the following requirements for godparents/sponsors:

- The sponsor must be a fully initiated member of the Catholic Church which means he or she has received the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist (Communion) and Confirmation.
- The godparent/sponsor must be at least 16 years of age (a person younger than 16 must be fully initiated in the Catholic Church)
- The godparent/sponsor must have an active life of faith in the Catholic Church and provide good example of Catholic Living.
- If the godparent/sponsor is married, he/she must be married in the Catholic Church
- The godparent/sponsor cannot be either parent of the person being Baptized or Confirmed.

Now that you know a little more about Baptism... spread the word! We have a wonderful parish at St. John's and we are growing every day!


May the grace of the Jubilee reawaken in us, *Pilgrims of Hope*, a yearning for the treasures of heaven.
