A Message from Msgr. Walden...

Living in the 21st century, we have the benefit of countless advances in technology, medicine, and science that have given us ways to enhance and benefit us. We can study and read history and try to learn from the advances and even mistakes that have been made in past generations. We can allow ourselves to be bombarded with information with our phones, computers, and TVs. But where is hope? Do we count our blessings? As much as we have so many advances, we live in a very violent, angry, and divided world and nation. To find and live in true peace, we need to find and live in love, mercy, justice, and truth. Without love, mercy, justice, and truth, we are tempted and doomed to regress and repeat the mistakes of past generations.

These past Sundays, we have been hearing Jesus in the Gospels say that He was going to Jerusalem and be rejected, crucified, and rise from the dead. How could this happen to Jesus, the Way, Truth, and Life, God Himself? He became one with us in our humanity so we could become one with Him in His divinity in this life and forever in heaven. In the Gospel for last Sunday's Mass, Jesus speaks about the horror that awaits those who harm "little ones", those who are most innocent and vulnerable among us. Progress only comes for "little ones" and we who are "big ones" when we cherish, respect, protect, and love each other. Where else do "little ones" learn and experience love and concern if not from we who are "big ones".

Everyday we continue to be bombarded in the media with the major political issues. No one who seeks an elected office, or is in one, can lead us to the Promised Land without finding the Way, Truth, and Life. Look at justice system at the time of Jesus. He was arrested right after the Last Supper, tried, scourged, crowned with thorns, condemned to carry His cross through the streets and crucified - all in less than 24 hours, no appeals, no mercy. The crucial issue I have written about before is abortion. How sad in the 21st century where we can save children who are born at even 24 weeks! (I have a grandniece who was born at 24 weeks, spent months in Infant Intensive Care, was 14 ounces and ten inches long and is now an active, joyful first grader.) What has gotten us to the point where we are now in our nation where public opinion and leaders want to allow abortion, killing children in the womb, and make it a legal right in the name of health. There are many reasons, and surely anguished decisions to have an abortion, but making it so easy leads to a life of covering up and trying to justify that an innocent human life was taken. Evil is certainly in our midst causing death of the innocent and division, anger, and derision among us. As we now experience division in our nation, the only hope is to rise above evil. Ancient people sacrificed their



children to placate their gods. Their civilizations are gone. May we not follow in their footsteps.

I offer Psalm 51 and its prayer for your reflection.

Have mercy on me, God, in your kindness. In your compassion blot out my offense. O wash me more and more from my guilt and cleanse me from my sin.

My offenses truly I know them; my sin is always before me. Against you, you alone, have I sinned; what is evil in your sight I have done.

That you may be justified when you give sentence and be without reproach when you judge, O see, in guilt I was born, a sinner was I conceived.

Indeed you love truth in the heart; then in the secret of my heart teach me wisdom. O purify me, then I shall be clean; O wash me, I shall be whiter than snow.

Make me hear rejoicing and gladness, that the bones you have crushed may revive. From my sins turn away your face and blot out all my guilt.

A pure heart create for me, O God, put a steadfast spirit within me.
Do not cast me away from your presence, nor deprive me of your holy spirit.
Give me again the joy of your help; with a spirit of fervor sustain me, that I may teach transgressors your ways and sinners may return to you.
O rescue me, God, my helper,

and my tongue shall ring out your goodness. O Lord, open my lips and my mouth shall declare your praise. For in sacrifice you take no delight, burnt offering from me you would refuse, my sacrifice, a contrite spirit,

a humbled, contrite heart you will not spurn. In your goodness, show favor to Zion:

rebuild the walls of Jerusalem.

Then you will be pleased with lawful sacrifice, holocausts offered on your altar. Glory...

Psalm Prayer: Father, he who knew no sin was made sin for us, to save us and restore us to your friendship. Look upon our contrite heart and afflicted spirit and heal our troubled conscience, so that in the joy and strength of the Holy Spirit we may proclaim your praise and glory before all the nations.





Proposal 1: A Wolf in Sheep's Clothing

A statement of the Catholic Bishops of New York State

On November 5, faithful citizens throughout the nation will have the opportunity once again to exercise their sacred right to vote. Pope Francis has reminded us that as thoughtful Catholics, we must participate in the public square for the sake of the common good. Every Catholic is called to do the work of properly informing his or her conscience and voting for candidates and policies that will best advance the natural law, the protection of human rights, the dignity of the human person, the sacredness of all life, and the teachings of Christ and His Church. It is a presidential election year, and there are important votes to be cast for Congress and the state Legislature as well. Importantly, in New York, like several other states, there is also a critical referendum on the ballot.

Educating oneself will be especially important in the case of Proposal 1, sometimes referred to as the "Equal Rights Amendment." The title suggests a noble cause, as all children of God should be treated equally under the law. However, this proposed amendment to the state Constitution is broadly written and could have dangerous consequences if enacted, which is why we oppose it and urge you to vote no. The measure would, effectively, permanently legalize abortion without restriction and up until the moment of birth in New York. Aside from being redundant in a state that already has stripped away all abortion limitations, the amendment would render impossible any change to the law if the hearts and minds of New Yorkers were ever to shift toward protecting the child in the womb.

The amendment's sweeping language and inclusion of "age" as a protected class could also lead to parents' rights being stripped away. Courts could decide that parents have no authority over their minor children on important matters and permit children to make destructive and permanent decisions on their own which they could well live to regret, including but not limited to so-called "gender affirming" treatments and surgeries. The relationship between parents and their children is sacred. Parents must be able to support and guide their children in accord with the natural law, without interference from the government or courts, which would be reaching beyond their competency.

Proposal 1 is a wolf in sheep's clothing that could lead to darkness for many New York families. This amendment disregards the lives of unborn and struggling children in the name of political agendas. It could have dangerous consequences for these children and their parents. As they look to make their voices heard in the public square, faithful Catholics should consider these consequences and vote no. Likewise, they should thoughtfully vote their informed conscience up and down the ballot so that we might usher in change for good.





October:

A Sacred Month for Reflection, Remembrance, and Renewal

In the secular world, October is a time to celebrate fall. Families and friends may gather to pick apples and pumpkins or take a long drive to see the fall foliage. For some, October primarily focuses on Halloween, emphasizing costumes, candy, decorations, and celebrations.

The history of Halloween serves as a poignant reminder of the holy days that follow, particularly All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day. Halloween, also known as All Hallows Eve, is rooted in the Celtic festival of Samhain, a time when people honored the spirits of the departed.



Rosary, with the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary on October 7th. In a world filled with unrest, the Rosary provides us with a way to bring peace to our hearts and communities. Saint John Paul II called it his "favorite prayer," emphasizing that through it, we can profoundly encounter Christ.

October is also a time to honor several saints who inspire us to live courageously in our walk of faith.

St. Thérèse of Lisieux, the "Little Flower," reminds us that small acts of love done with great devotion can transform the world. Her feast day, **October 1**st, kicks off the month with a call to live in simplicity and trust in God's care.

October 2nd is the Feast of the Guardian Angels, a day dedicated to honoring the heavenly beings assigned by God to protect and guide us throughout our lives.

On October 4th, we honor St. Francis of Assisi. His Feast is celebrated with the blessing of animals in many communities, reminding us to honor and care for all living beings as part of our stewardship of creation.

We honor St. Faustina on October 5th. She was a Polish nun known for her profound devotion to Divine Mercy. Her teachings encourage the faithful to trust in God's mercy and to extend that mercy to others.

October 7th is the feast day of Our Lady of the Rosary, a celebration that honors the Virgin Mary's role in the promotion of the Rosary as a powerful form of prayer.

October 15th is the feast day of Saint Teresa of Avila. Saint Teresa taught about the importance of deepening one's relationship with God through prayer and reflection. Her feast day invites us to explore her teachings on interior life and to seek a closer connection with God through prayer and devotion.

And lastly, on October 22nd we honor the feast day of Saint Pope John Paul II. Through his papacy, he inspired millions through his message of hope, love, and the importance of faith in everyday life.
