A Reflection on the Gospel: Matt 21:33-43

'The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone.'

In this parable that Jesus told, the landowner's son was seized, and suffered at the hands of the tenants. In the first century, when a landowner died without an heir, that land would become the property of the tenants. The tenants of the vineyard weren't looking for what was fair. They were looking for what they wanted. In the Book of Genesis, Jacob's son Joseph was also seized, and suffered at the hands of his brothers. And Jesus Himself, God the Father's Son, would soon be seized, and suffer at the hands of His persecutors. Neither the landowner's son, nor Joseph, nor Jesus did anything to deserve the treatment they received. So why were they all treated this way? What is the connection between these three events? What is at the core of all this anger?

It's envy.

In the case of the landowner's son, the tenants were envious of the inheritance of the property that the owner's son would one day acquire. In Joseph's case, his brothers were envious of the love that their father Jacob had for him. And regarding Jesus, the chief priests and elders were envious of the following Jesus was getting, because He was offering something they couldn't give: true freedom. Envy is the sin that gnaws at our human nature, and no one is completely immune to it. However, when we stand before God, none of us will have any more or less than any one else. The only thing we will have to our name is the record of our love.

The landowner in this parable learned what we also know these days: completely trustworthy people are hard to find. But they are the ones who give hope to humanity. They are exactly the kind of people that God wants us to be, even when no one is looking, and even when the world around us doesn't make it easy. We are the tenants of God's Kingdom on Earth. We are born into this world (the vineyard) with a choice. We can either follow God's teachings, or reject them. We can produce either good fruit, or rotten fruit. We can be either a stone that builds up the Church, or one that aids in its destruction.

In the end, the landowner's son's death was avenged as the tenants were put to a wretched death, Joseph became a great leader in Egypt, and Jesus became the Cornerstone of God's entire Plan of Redemption. Our destiny will be determined by the choices we make. Either way, the Kingdom of God will remain, and the inheritance of it can't be seized. Just as the landowner sent his son into the vineyard, God the Father sent His perfect, sinless Son (the Suffering Servant) into a sinful world that was in need of forgiveness. But forgiving sin is not the same as condoning it, and we can't receive forgiveness unless we have first repented. God is merciful, but just, and we are still responsible for our own actions. Every time we sin, we become like those tenants, only we are rejecting the Son of God, and each of our sins becomes another pound on the nail of His Cross.

Heaven is a gift that is offered to all. But not everyone chooses to be there. At the end of our lives, each of us (individually) will be asked to give an account of how we handled 'our portion of the vineyard.' So we really need to ask ourselves: How clean will our own hands be?
