# A message from our Pastor, Fr. Patrick...

### Gospel Reflection ~ Mark 12:38-44 The Story of the Poor Widow

Today's gospel really touches my heart. Jesus is now in the city of Jerusalem. He made His final entry. Soon He will be handed over to the secular and religious authorities for execution. He will be condemned for bringing the world eternity; for doing the Father's will. We can only begin to imagine what was going on in His mind. When referring to the poor widow, it is clear that Jesus cares about our wellbeing. Jesus wants us to trust more in God's providence and God's promise for humanity. He wants us to follow the example of the poor widow's complete trust in God.

After speaking about the dangers of exploiting others for personal gain and status in the world, Jesus shows them what true devotion to God is all about when referring to the lowly widow who gave just a few cents into the Temple treasury. He warns them not to seek places of honor, but instead to trust more in God. When referring to the widow who gave all that she had back to God, He encouraged them to do the same with trusting and loving hearts.

In ancient Israel, widows had no inheritance rights and usually had to rely on their children, male relatives or charity to survive. When Jesus saw how the rich gave of their surpluses to the Temple treasury, He was deeply moved when He saw how the poor widow gave from her heart. Although it was just a few cents, it was everything she had. It was, as scripture states, her entire livelihood not knowing where her next meal would come from. She just trusted that God would provide and remain true to His Word. (Psalms 68:6 & 72:4)

We can begin to see how touched Jesus was by her example of trust and generosity and how close her heart was to God. By giving all that she had back to God, she would have to rely more on God to sustain her in life. She believed that God would give her all that she needed to survive. Knowing that His death was imminent, we can only begin to realize how this moment reassured Jesus that He was on the right path in bringing the world redemption. After seeing how the widow gave everything she had over to God (Greek translation: "gave her whole life"), Jesus knew He would have to do exactly the same. He would have to give His entire life over to God for the world's salvation. He, like the lowly widow, would rely on God's promise and providence. He knew in His heart, like the widow did, that God would provide in the end for Him and all of humanity, and remain faithful to His promise in bringing us eternal life.

Because our Lord trusted in God's unfailing promise for humanity, we have salvation without end. We have eternity on our side. If Jesus did not give His entire life completely over to God in complete trust, we would still be living in our sins without the hope of redemption. In His lowliness, He remained faithful to the end for our sake. It is no wonder that He sweated drops of blood in the garden of Gethsemane. He knew what was at stake for humanity; death or new life, eternity or damnation.

If we want to live in hope and joy in God's Word and promise, we too have to trust more in God's providence and know in our hearts that He will remain faithful to us too, until the very end. The more we trust in God and the more we give from our hearts, the more we will receive in return. God will have a more active role in our lives, and provide us with everything that we need for the journey in living lives



that are joyful and fulfilling in the Lord.







# A Message from Msgr. Walden...

Now that the election in our nation is over, we had our say as we "put in our two cents". That phrase came to mind as I first read the Gospel for today's Mass (Mark 12:38-44) where Jesus was watching people make contributions in the temple and saw a poor widow put in two small coins. He responded to what she did: "Amen, I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasury. For they have all contributed from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood." Obviously Jesus is not praising poverty but challenges His listeners and us to think about how generous we are not just with our money, but with the time, attention, talents, basics resources. The first reading at today's Mass (1 Kings 17:10-16) recounts a similar type of the experience where prophet encounters a poor widow and her son. There was a famine in the land at that time and she had only enough flour for one last simple meal for her and her son. Elijah assures her that the container of flour will not grow empty if she makes a cake for him first, and it doesn't for the rest of the year long famine. Her generosity made her rich in love and good works.

Humility is a virtue and its foundation is the first Beatitude: "Blessed are the poor in spirit, the kingdom of heaven is theirs." To be humble is to recognize the needs, situations, and concerns of not only ourselves but of those around us: family, friends, and countless others that come to our attention through the media. Compassion and concern are far more that nice thoughts, they are the foundation of a responsive action on our part. So often the first thing that we have to get through is: what is this going to cost me in terms of time, attention, and resources. There are those people in our lives that we willingly and freely give of ourselves to as they do to

us. One of the things we say is: "I will pray for you." That is a wonderful response but sincere



prayer will ultimately lead us to do what we can to be the answer to the need. God does answer prayers and many times we are the answer. How trusting and hopeful God is in us to do what we can with sincere concern, attention, time, joy, generosity, and resources.

At times we feel that we cannot fight "city hall" and government policies that we see as unjust. Jesus did not change the government of His time, He brought those who responded to Him into the love, life, goodness, mercy and generosity of God. How good to see that light! How great it is make that light brighter by all we say and do everyday of our lives!

### I offer Psalm 93 for your prayerful reflection.

The Lord is king, with majesty enrobed; the Lord has robed himself with might, he has girded himself with power.

The world you made firm, not to be moved; your throne has stood firm from of old.

From all eternity, O Lord, you are.

The waters have lifted up, O Lord, the waters have lifted up their voice, the waters have lifted up their thunder.

Greater than the roar of mighty waters more glorious than the surgings of the sea, the Lord is glorious on high.

Truly your decrees are to be trusted.


