FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Moving Forward

FAMILY FIRST



Dear Parish Family:

This past Tuesday would have been my Dad's 74th birthday. I happened to be at the cemetery for a funeral service and had some time to spend at my dad's grave (and even to ask for some fatherly advice!). It gave me some time to think about the many ways my family—my parents, brother, sister, aunts, uncles, cousins—have taught me about faith and endurance in this life. My mom has said to me more than once, "I don't know how you get through this life without faith."

This week, following the report to the parish and our reflection on the Sunday readings last weekend, I want to share some exciting news. As you know we have made an effort over these years to work on the formation of families in faith—from Family Life Ministry, Children's Liturgy of the Word, special liturgies and services and more. Our biggest transition is the movement to a family based model of catechesis for families in Grades 1-6. This has been a huge adjustment and, at times, challenge. Yet, we are seeing signs of new life! (Michelle Pirraglia has provided an update in the Faith Formation pages.)

Since last Spring, the Pastoral Team has been discussing the possibility of having a person on the staff directly responsible for engaging families in every aspect of the life of the parish. We have examined some different options and ideas and, I believe, we are ready to take the next step.



I am happy to introduce Carolyn Lapham as the new Coordinator of Family Ministry at SJE. This position will link Carolyn to our Faith Formation program (where hundreds of family are already registered), our school community, existing children's and family ministries and the formation of new initiatives that reach out to families and connect more strongly to the parish community, to the Church. As a member of the Pastoral Team, Carolyn will seek ways to better reach out to families in all aspects of parish life, with a certain focus and link to Faith Formation. She will help us to develop new and creative ways to minister to families of all shapes and sizes.

While the task is daunting and, in some ways, uncharted, I think Carolyn is the right person to initiate this new area of parish leadership. Carolyn is a retired special educator and administrator, tireless volunteer, catechist, former youth ministry leader, co-coordinator of Vacation Bible camp, parish social ministry leader, and more...not too mention a wife, mom, grandma, daughter, and beloved family member. Those who meet Carolyn are touched by her presence, perspective, sensitivity, and deep faith. Now, even more members of our parish will come to know what so many of us already do.


In his encyclical, *Lumen Fidei*, Pope Francis writes (57): "Absorbed and deepened in the family, faith becomes a light capable of illumining all our relationships in society." It is my hope that this emphasis on family will not only touch those in our parish but will help families to see the incredible impact they can have on the life of the world.

I hope this initiative gives each of us some to pause about our own family life, particularly during this month of remembrance. How often do we take those we spend most of our time with for granted? Have we allowed the faith that brings us to the parish to touch the lives of our family members and friends? Do we take time to be grateful for those who have gone before us who shine "like the stars forever" (Daniel 12:3)?

As I was sitting by my dad's grave asking for some ways to be a good father figure to someone, a person came behind me which caused me to almost jump out of my skin. It was a florist delivery person. My mom had ordered flowers for my dad's birthday and I happened to be there as they arrived. (She was happy that I could confirm delivery.) As I was driving home, I laughed (and cried) a bit more. Good reminders, though, of how family infiltrates our lives in many ways—from this world and beyond. More of a reason for our parish to invite our parish's families to a deeper encounter in faith so they, too, can one day shine like those stars forever.

Please say a prayer for me.



WHAT WE'VE BEEN UP TO...



Thank you to our catechists, priests, volunteers and parish staff who've helped serve the nearly 1,200 students in our Faith Formation program this past year! Incorporating guests speakers, hands-on activities, prayer experiences such as

Eucharistic Adoration and more, we have worked to make Faith Formation at SJE more experiential and engaging.

- **“FAMILY OF FAITH”**: We have moved to a family catechesis model for our younger students in grades 1-6 through our “Family of Faith” program. Parents and students come together to learn about the faith once a month on campus, and then work at home to reinforce the lessons for each month.

- **CONFIRMATION PREP**: For our Confirmation preparation, we have moved to more of a youth ministry model through our “Fearless” program. Focusing on the Gospel of John, the program brings students together in small groups twice a month to learn and discuss the faith through talks, small group discussion, games, activities, service work and prayer experiences.

- **VOLUNTEERS**: Our more than 50 volunteers are the engine of our program and help lead our students and their families closer to Christ, the Church and our local parish community. World Day of the Poor

WHO LIVES IN POVERTY USA?

All those who make less than the Federal government’s official poverty threshold... which for a family of four is about \$25,700. People working at minimum wage, even holding down multiple jobs. Seniors living on fixed incomes. Wage earners suddenly out of work. Millions of families everywhere from our cities to rural communities.

Poverty does not strike all demographics equally. For example, in 2018, 10.6% of men, and 12.9% of women lived in Poverty USA. Along the same lines, the poverty rate for married couples in 2018 was only 4.7% - but the poverty rate for single-parent families with no wife present was 12.7%, and for single-parent families with no husband present was 24.9%.

In 2018, the poverty rate for people living with a disability was 25.7%. That’s nearly 4 million people living with a disability—in poverty.

Weekly Scripture Reflection

The Gospel predicts end times; our challenge though is to live faithfully now. When we live in conformity to the Word, hearing Jesus' words and living them out, the future holds no fear for us.

As you place your gift in the Society of St. Vincent de Paul poor box, know that you are hearing the words of Jesus and living them out.


