FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Move Your Feet

FEAR

Dear Parish Family:

In my last parish Joe was a long time parishioner and volunteer and then became part of the maintenance staff after he retired from his work as a draftsman. He would say again and again "You have to move your feet. You can't stand still."

We are encountering some uncomfortable readings in some very uncomfortable times. The fear and anxiety levels for so many of us are at our maximum. For myself, I admit there have been waves of that fear and anxiety over these weeks, particularly. I see rising pandemic numbers and medical professionals I care deeply about sharing their experiences of increasing sickness and death. I share the anxiety of so many in these days when we accept the results of an election and fear those who might have or might try to undermine it. I see the financial realities these days that so many of our families are facing (and our parish as well). I read the summary of a report about a scandalous situation in the church involving abuse, cover up, promotion, and shameful actions of many who we hold or held in high regard.

It's certainly easier to be with the last servant (Matthew 25:24-25). No time for risks. Let's bury our treasure. Hide. Hope for the best. Fear wins. We stay in place.

In her book, *Guidelines for Mystical Prayer*, Sister Ruth Burrows writes, "God is trying to get us to accept a state where we have no assurance within ourself that all is well with us; a state where no clear path lies before us, where there is no way; a state of spiritual inadequacy experienced in its raw, humiliating bitterness" (p. 60). To which I say, as I re-read the first paragraph, he's doing a pretty good job these days...if we let him.

It seems in these days that everywhere we turn we are bombarded with agenda, conspiracy, theory, perspective, and propaganda that fill us with fear. And what does fear normally do? It paralyzes us. It stifles us. It prevents us from seeing another way except what we know. It sometimes pushes us back to old habits and dangerous destinations.

Or maybe each one of us needs to take the risk we have been avoiding? To work to more fully love and trust God above all the things in this world. Are these days and times not reminders that so many things are beyond us and our control? Do we retreat in fear? Bury our treasure? Withdraw? Hide?

This is not certainly the message the Gospel is giving us in these weeks. Last week, as we prayed with the first part of the 25th chapter of Matthew's Gospel, we are called to deep self examination. Are we really prepared to encounter the Lord? What is lacking? What needs more time and preparation? What are we waiting for....wait....it's not about what we can do. It is much more about letting God love me enough to purify and prepare me! If I allow that love to overtake me, I have nothing to fear!

Today, we continue with a similar theme. Do we cower in fear in this relationship with God or do we take the risk of investing more and more so we may have a greater gain? It is not about a "gain" in this world. It is about a gain in our relationship with the Lord. Do we take what God has given us ultimately, everything—and consider how we might do even greater things with it? Do we refuse to look back and rather trust in God and where he wants to lead us?

Hopefully, that moves us to the work of the end of the 25th chapter of Matthew's Gospel as we consider what we can and must do for one another. (See the front cover of the bulletin and page 2, 6, 8, and 9 for some more examples.) We pray that our love for one another will inspire us to action.

St. Teresa of Avila writes, "Love will make us quicken our steps, while fear will make us look where we are setting our feet so that we shall not fall." In the midst of challenging times, let's stop staring at our feet in fear and worry less about failing. Let's love more and quicken our steps.

KEEPING SAFE IN THESE DAYS! LITURGICAL PRACTICES, GOOD HEALTH AND COMMON SENSE!

Since 2017, we have published updates regarding good health, particularly in the winter months. My former Pastor, Msgr. Joseph DeGrocco, a former professor of liturgy at the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception, prepared a brief article for my former parish's bulletin. As we are approaching the winter season in a time of pandemic, there are some good things to consider in our celebration of the Eucharist and some things we have been encouraging for many years!

As we come to celebrate Mass together each week during these winter days, it's a good time to review some common-sense liturgical practices and issues, to help everyone stay healthy and to care for one another.

- <u>Not feeling great, STAY HOME!</u> Please do not take any chances for your sake or anyone else's! Join us via social media or watch Mass on the Catholic Faith Network. The risks are too great for you and for others in these days. There is no obligation to attend Mass in this time; it is not a sin to miss Mass for this reason. (Also, there is no need to go to Confession if you miss Mass because you are sick.)
- Entering the Church: You must enter through the main fellowship doors with your mask on. NO MASK
 = NO ENTRANCE into the Church. Sanitize your hands, take a worship aid and enter the church. For
 Masses in the Auditorium, you may enter through the north or south entrances. Specific doors are marked
 for entrance and exit.
- <u>Seating:</u> Please sit as close to the front as possible. It works best for groups of one and two can sit closer to the front and/or fill the seats along the perimeter of the church. This allows us to make the maximum, safe use of our available seating. Please keep a safe distance from those on either side of you and/or your family.
- <u>Holy Communion</u>: Priests, deacons and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion wash and sanitize their hands before Mass begins and immediately before distribution of Holy Communion. When Extraordinary Ministers go to their station, they place the vessel on the small table near that station and sanitize their hands before distributing Holy Communion.
- **<u>Communion from the Chalice</u>**: The distribution of the Precious Blood is suspended at this time.
- <u>Reception of Holy Communion</u>: Remember to bow as the person before you receives Holy Communion (this is not new). While you do this, please take down your mask. Please hold your hands out as flat as possible to receive Holy Communion. After placing the host in your mouth, put your mask back up and return to your seat.
- **<u>Greeting of Peace:</u>** The greeting of peace by shaking hands is suspended at this time.
- <u>Help!</u> We are always looking for more volunteers to assist with the Cana Care Crew, particularly after Masses with the wipe down of the pews. If you and/or your family are willing to help, please see one of the volunteers in the orange shirts. We provide the gloves, t-shirt, towels and cleaning solution. You provide the arm strength and the positive spirit!


NO DUMPING—Please!

SJE is so happy to accept donations when we can but cannot afford the fiscal and safety concerns raised when items are dumped. Please note the following and please share.

1. Ernie's Place: Donations may be left in the Fellowship Area of the Church or in the bin outside of Ernie's Place. If the bin is full (it is emptied daily), please leave the items in the Church or return another time. Items left out need to be discarded. NO CLOTHING OR ITEMS maybe left outside of Ernie's Place.

2. Thrift Shop/Green Bins. Items for the Thrift Shop may only be left in the green bins. If the bins are full, no items may be left outside of them. All items left outside are thrown out. There are no exceptions to this. You may also come to the Thrift Shop on Mondays and Tuesdays from 9-12 to drop off donations.


