A Message from the Director of Religious Education...

"By your perseverance you will secure your lives." ~Luke 21:19

"Confirmation is NOT graduation from Church!"

On November 7, we were blessed to have 131 young people from our parish receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, with Bishop John O. Barres celebrating the Sacrament. In preparation, students attended sessions this Fall where one of the main themes was the quote above—CONFIRMATION IS NOT GRADUATION FROM CHURCH! It's just the beginning!

We congratulate our Confirmandi and pray that they will persevere in faith, as they now have been fully initiated into the life of the Church. And there are a lot of reasons to hope that they will! I—along with their volunteer small group leaders—have watched these young people grow and mature over the last two-and-a-half years. Listening to their conversations in



small group, seeing their prayerfulness during our Eucharistic Adoration and Confession nights, and witnessing their generosity in doing simple acts of service all are signs of hope in the midst of a world that, at times, can remind us more of the frightening descriptions we hear in today's Gospel.

At first glance, St. Luke's account may seem like a bit of a "downer." Jesus speaks of wars, earthquakes, famines, plagues—all things we know have occurred and are happening even in our lifetime. He also predicts the persecution and betrayal those who follow Him often experience, to various degrees. It's heavy! But we need to also hear Jesus' words of encouragement:


- "Do not be deceived..." Be careful how much trust we place in worldly figures—prayerful discernment is key.
- "Do not be terrified..." Jesus assures us God's justice will prevail and to trust in Him.
- "I myself shall give you a wisdom in speaking..." If we stay rooted in prayer and relationship with God, He will inspire and lead us. (Sometimes it's about just getting out of God's way!)

"By your perseverance you will secure your lives." - By coming to Mass and praying daily, keeping the Commandments and serving others with a generous heart, we keep ourselves open to God, Who gives us the grace to persevere.

Speaking of perseverance, in St. Paul's letter to the Thessalonians, he chastises this particular Christian community for not persevering in the faith he modeled for them. Unfortunately, sometimes a verse from this passage is used broadly against those struggling with food insecurity. But if we look at the context of the passage, we find that St. Paul is calling the people to be more community-minded. The Thessalonians became complacent because they believed Jesus' second coming and the end of the world would happen immediately. Their misguided faith was leading not just to complacency, but to being "disorderly" and "not keeping busy but minding the business of others." St. Paul's point is that we all should be contributing to our communities as much as we are able—which may look different depending on each person's ability and need—and to refrain from gossip and judgment. In heeding St. Paul's words, we persevere in faith, hope and charity.

Perseverance in faith is what we hope to foster through our Faith Formation program. By keeping the faith active and connecting to our daily lives, our program encourages families and young people to make the faith and their relationship with God the center of their lives in real and practical ways.

This month, we were blessed to have Deacon Ed and Fr. Francis speak to our Grades 1-6 families about the






Women's Group... Our Women's Group will begin again on Monday, September 22,

Last weekend, I was with my family in Greenport. As we were driving through the town the Christmas lights were already put up and lit on the main street. The next big day nationally is Thanksgiving and then the joy of preparing for Christmas in our personal and family lives. As I continue to read a brief reflection from Pope Benedict XVI every day, this thought puts ourselves personally, and the Church in our world today, in perspective: "Without God, the world cannot be bright." Yes, the Christmas lights decorations dress visible and up surroundings, but the true light that brings joy and hope comes through the presence of Jesus in our lives everyday. Not only is He present to us when we pray and receive Him in the Sacraments, He is also present through us.

As much as there is darkness in our world caused by disagreements, distrust, injustice, apathy, and a feeling of powerlessness, there is also hope and light through the good things we say, do, and think everyday. On a national, international, local, and even personal level, there is anger, disappointment, and tension. In the Gospel for today's Mass (Luke 21:5-19), Jesus presents a very challenging picture to say the least. He speaks of the coming of wars and insurrection and, even more, the persecution and rejection of those who believe in Him. But He does not speak these words to prepare us for darkness and division, but to open our minds and hearts to the power of His presence in our minds and hearts. It is wonderful at Christmas to receive cards and open gifts. They light up our outlook, not just confirming past joys but inviting us to see the power of the divine love of Jesus in our lives. The key is to be nourished, uplifted, and an instrument of His love. As much as "without God the world cannot be bright", His presence in the core of who we are brightens all those whose lives we touch. Living our faith everyday does not mean we walk around with a halo over our heads, but that our presence is challenging, encouraging, and life giving. As much as Jesus speaks about us being rejected, He experienced the darkness and injustice of the cross. But even there, He never stopped loving and offering the path to hope, peace, and the fullness of life.

We live in what we consider modern times. Yes, we have many advances in science and technology that

bring many conveniences. But how we use the advances in science and technology determines whether or not they bring us together or build the walls thicker between us. The way we speak and act with one another personally, locally, nationally, and internationally determines whether or not the world we live in will be bright and life-giving, or dark and life draining. The last words of Jesus in today's Gospel are, "By your perseverance you will secure your lives." The more we see our faith as a pure gift and embrace it, the brighter God's loving presence in our world.

I offer Psalm 23 for your prayerful reflection.

The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want. Fresh and green are the pastures where he gives me repose. Near restful waters he leads me, to revive my drooping spirit.

He guides me along the right path; he is true to his name. If I should walk in the valley of darkness no evil would I fear. You are there with your crook and your staff; with these you give me comfort.

You have prepared a banquet for me in the sight of my foes.

My head you have anointed with oil; my cup is overflowing.

Surely goodness and kindness shall follow me all the days of my life.
In the Lord's own house shall I dwell for ever and ever.

Psalm Prayer: Lord Jesus Christ, Shepherd of your Church, you give us new birth in the waters of Baptism; you anoint us with oil, and call us to salvation at your table. Dispel the terrors of death and the darkness of error. Lead your people along safe paths, that they may rest securely in you and live for ever in your Father's house.


May the grace of the Jubilee reawaken in us, *Pilgrims of Hope*, a yearning for the treasures of heaven.
