FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK More Advocates Needed

BLESSED ARE THE POOR

Dear Parish Family:

Today, we celebrate All Saints Day. This solemnity takes the place of the 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time so we take a break from our reading of later parts of the Gospel of Matthew that we have been praying with in these weeks and go back to the beginning of the Sermon on the Mount—The Beatitudes.



Permit me to use the first beatitude— Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the Kingdom of heaven—as an opportunity to share some bittersweet news. Alex Finta, who has served in Parish Social Ministry for four years, the last two as the director, has resigned his position effective November 6th. This is a huge loss for our parish community. Building on the shoulders of giants who have served as volunteers and leaders over the years, Alex has led the expansion of Parish Social Ministry into new areas and has provided many opportunities for parishioners and members of the staff (including me) to use our gifts to serve the poor and the vulnerable.

In his letter to the staff and parish social ministry volunteers Alex wrote, "What I am most proud of is the continued work of dignity, the most important thing we can provide, towards the people we serve." Over the past few years, I

have learned a great deal about this from Alex and his spirit. I have seen his interactions with those who visit at the Community Meal and the Street Ministry and wish I could be as real with the guests as he

allows himself to be. In a sense, he seeks to treat those who come to us in need not just as clients but as brothers and sisters—members of the family. Whether it be the remodeling or new approach of Ernie's Place or the reorganization of our intake process for our parish outreach or moving many of our processes to online applications or his presence at the Street Ministry or constant push to make sure we are carrying out the true work of the Gospel, we have learned a great deal from him. As we conclude Respect Life Month, I think we can be proud of the dignity we offer those who come to our doors, particularly in the area of Parish Social Ministry.



Like any healthy parish family, we have been privileged to walk with Alex in his own life journey and he with our parish community. Since coming to SJE and OLQA in 2016, we celebrated Alex's graduation from Fordham University, his marriage to his incredible wife, Regina, and the birth and



baptism of Sadie Grace. Alex has walked with us, too, inside and outside of Parish Social Ministry. He has served the school in times of change and transition (including with this guy as principal), was present during the destruction and rebuilding of the church building, helped to establish CYO, has been part of our parish's Pastoral Team and Leadership Team and been a part of this parish's story.

You might be saying, "Fr. John's where is the sweet part?" It's not necessarily sweet for our parish community but it is for Alex. Alex is moving into working at a mental health clinic where he will focus more on one to one and group counseling and support. It is an area of social work that Alex excels in and has shared with many in our community (and part of the reason we are working to establish a counseling center here one day). This new position will



give Alex the time and space to focus on this aspect of giving people dignity without many of the administrative responsibilities of being the Director of Parish Social Ministry.

Alex officially joined the staff of St. John's in 2017 as the Associate Director of Parish Social Ministry. I entitled the article "Another Advocate". In that letter, I wrote, "Alex will focus his work on the 'peripheries', the 'going out' of the Gospel." I think you would agree that he has led our parish far beyond Ocean Avenue into the new and exciting and challenging and even risk-taking moments.

The peripheries often fill all of this and more. As individuals and as a parish, we are more of a Beatitude parish because of Alex's presence here.

So let us "rejoice and be glad" for Alex and he responds to a new call in his life and for our parish as we raise up new advocates to minister to the poor and vulnerable among us for theirs is the "kingdom of heaven".

Please say a prayer for me, particularly in these days of transition.

Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship

The upcoming election – as each election should – calls us to deep discernment regarding the choices we make. The bishops of the United States of America wrote *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizen-ship* in 2015. They have published an updated Introductory Letter for our consideration. I ask that you read it and the entire document carefully before voting this year. This week's excerpt -

At all levels of society, we are aware of a great need for leadership that models love for righteousness (Wisdom 1:1) as well as the virtues of justice, prudence, courage, and temperance. Our commitment as people of faith to imitate Christ's love and compassion should challenge us to serve as models of civil dialogue, especially in a context where discourse is eroding at all levels of society. Where we live, work, and worship, we strive to understand before seeking to be understood, to treat with respect those with whom we disagree, to dismantle stereotypes, and to build productive conversation in 8 place of vitriol. Catholics from every walk of life can bring their faith and our consistent moral framework to contribute to important work in our communities, nation, and world on an ongoing basis, not just during election season. In this coming year and beyond, we urge leaders and all Catholics to respond in prayer and action to the call to faithful citizenship. In doing so, we live out the call to holiness and work with Christ as he builds his kingdom of love.

Merciful Father, Thank you for inviting each of us to join in your work of building the kingdom of love, justice, and peace. Draw us close to you in prayer as we discern your call in our families and communities. Send us forth to encounter all whom you love: those not yet born, those in poverty, those in need of welcome. Inspire us to respond to the call to faithful citizenship, during election season and beyond. Help us to imitate your charity and compassion and to serve as models of loving dialogue. Teach us to treat others with respect, even when we disagree, and seek to share your love and mercy. We ask this through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God forever and ever. Amen

Bring sandwiches to church November 15th. We will have two different drop off times for your convenience. The first will be between the hours of 9am-11am. If you can't make it in the morning, the second drop off time will be 5pm-6pm. We will be collecting and boxing the sandwiches outside of the (front) main entrance.

We ask that everyone please wear a mask and gloves while preparing sandwiches. Each sandwich should be placed in its own baggie. Peanut butter and Jelly are the easiest to make. Please keep in mind one loaf of bread makes 10 sandwiches. We will also accept cold cut sandwiches, we just ask that you label them.

Please try to make sandwiches as close to Sunday as possible, as they will be delivered to Light House Mission in Bellport on Monday morning. We will also be accepting supply donations for those that would like to contribute but can't make sandwiches, such as, peanut butter, jelly, or bread. We will be placing a quick instruction video on Facebook and Youtube. We miss you all and look forward to seeing you all soon.

YOUNG AT HEART (AND OTHERS)



A short while before I found a place to make my annual Retreat, someone I greatly admired gave me a book entitled *An Invitation to Love* by William Barry, S.J. As I started to read it, I realized that it was actually a book subtitled "A Personal Retreat on the Great Commandment." I started to read it during my hours before the Blessed Sacrament. You cannot read it as you would a novel; it is really a book

which leads the reader into contemplation on true LOVE and all the ways to consider this great gift. I brought the book with me on retreat and I was so glad that I did. The Retreat was a private one; there was no Retreat Leader!

At present, I have recently finished the Prayer Session #30 and I'd like to share some of the lines which really impressed me. The sacraments, especially the Eucharist comes through Liturgy. "God's desire is not exhausted in our adoration and thanksgiving; God wants us to be transformed by eating and drinking the body and blood of Jesus . . . He wants us to partake of himself so that we will become like him in the way we act in this world . . . at the Eucharist we always hear the word of God, and this word is written . . .to draw us into the story of God's dream for our world." Barry ends this section with, "The liturgy sends us forth to do God's work in this world, to be God's heart, hands, eyes, ears, and voice to all those we meet."

Walking to receive Jesus should be approached prayerfully and not strolling along, arms swinging by your sides or looking around to see who's in the church. A good habit is to pray as you approach the Eucharistic Minister or Priest; perhaps to pray for a loved one or to say an Act of Contrition. Remember that after we receive Jesus, we should return to our pew to thank God for this gift of his Son. It is not the time to look around and smile to greet people. That is what we do after the priest leaves the altar. We all learned this when we made our First Holy Communion!

I would hope that those who cannot stay until after the final blessing at Mass are rushing home "to be God's heart, hands, eyes, ears, and voice" and not to avoid greeting other companions at Mass or to beat the crowd or some other excuse.

Remember that God's loves us all and always forgives us our sins; all he wants from us to do the work he gives us the graces we need to accomplish that. Remember, when in doubt, think, "What Would Jesus Do."

Seton Chapel – Closed 11/5 – 11/8


