





FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Whose Kingdom?

THE PILATE PERSPECTIVE

Dear Parish Family:

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. It is the end of the liturgical year. When we return to Mass next Sunday, we will begin the season of Advent. There is a nice link here between this ending and beginning. The readings for next week will sound very similar to what we prayed with this past week.

During the preface to the Eucharistic Prayer this weekend, we pray for an eternal and universal kingdom, a kingdom of truth and life, a kingdom of holiness and grace, a kingdom of justice, love and peace.

Are these the kingdoms we really long for? They're different than many of the kingdoms we spend our time trying to build today...or at least the ones I can find myself desiring. Maybe the same for you? I can find myself concerned about the kingdom of security and safety, of confidence and comfort, of superiority and safety, of acceptance and, honestly, arrogance. When I am involved in those building projects, Jesus Christ is not the King of the Universe. I find that I am actually trying to preserve my own perceived kingship. I suppose it is not so different for organizations, community, religions, governments, countries and the like.

What happens when these kingdoms are threatened by holiness, justice, peace, love, and the like? We often become possessive, fear-filled, reactionary, dishonest, hateful, self-centered and blinded. These are not disciple-like qualities. In many of our most heated debates these days, don't we find ourselves filled with fear, grabbing on as tight as we can to what we have, refusing to trust, unopen to where the spirit might be moving us? Instead we become rigid. Pope Francis in *Let Us Dream* writes (69-70), "Rigidity is the sign of the bad spirit concealing something. What is hidden might not be revealed for a long time, until some scandal erupts." We are so often concerned about self-preservation that we avoid pouring ourselves out for the kingdoms we pray for today—justice, love, peace, holiness, grace, truth, and life. Those become secondary to our own projects. Scandal erupts.

It is sort of the perspective of Pilate in today's gospel from the Passion of John. He is concerned about a kingdom of this world. A kingdom that may threaten Pilate or his people. Jesus is not concerned, bothered, overwhelmed, distracted, or caught up in this world. Neither should we.

This requires a deep and close relationship with Jesus, a heart to heart relationship. It is a level of relationship that we can never make strong enough. We can always be doing something to make it stronger. Always.

In that spirit, I invite you to consider praying the **Novena of Grace**. It is prayed around the Feast of St. Francis Xavier (December 3rd) and/or around the date of his canonization (March 12th). I have a great connection tot his as I was ordained a priest on his feast day. I am always leery of encouraging any particular devotion or novena. Simply because I find it a source of grace and re-grounding does not meant that you

have to find the same. If it is something that works for you, please consider it. If it's not, no problem. If you wish to pray it, you should begin on Thursday, November 25th and conclude on Friday, December 3rd. You can access it here https://www.sacredspace.ie/novenas/francisxavier or take a copy of the booklet at the doors of the church.

There is always an intention surrounding this novena. I have never prayed the Novena of Grace to find my intention unanswered. Admittedly, it is never answered in the way I think it should be (my kingdom view!). As I look back there has never been a time I did not find the consolation I needed in this prayer (God's kingdom view). I hope the same can be true for you.

If you can, please say a prayer for me.






The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

NOVEMBER 21, 2021

Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

On the last Sunday of each liturgical year, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, or Christ the King.

Pope Pius XI instituted this feast in 1925 with his encyclical *Quas primas* ("In the first") to respond to growing secularism and atheism. He recognized that attempting to "thrust Jesus Christ and his holy law" out of public life would result in continuing discord among



people and nations. This solemnity reminds us that while governments come and go, Christ reigns as King forever.

During the early twentieth century, in Mexico, Russia, and some parts of Europe, militantly secularistic regimes threatened not just the Catholic Church and its faithful but civilization itself. Pope Pius XI's encyclical gave Catholics hope and—while governments around them crumbled—the assurance that Christ the King shall reign forever. Jesus Christ "is very truth, and it is from him that truth must be obediently received by all mankind" (*Quas primas*, 7).

For Christians, when our faith is repeatedly marginalized in public life, we can fall into the habit of compartmentalizing our lives. We love Jesus in our private lives, but we shrink from acknowledging the kingship of Christ in social life. When we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King, we declare to the world and remind ourselves that Jesus is the Lord of the Church and of the entire universe.


Ernie's Place Food Pantry— serving those in need on Mon. and Thurs.

We Pray
