November 26, 2023 A Message from Our Pastor, Fr. Patrick... "The Creat Judgment" (Mt 25:21-46)

"The Great Judgment" (Mt 25:31-46)

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. We celebrate the universal sovereignty of Christ. We celebrate the universality of His Kingship and His complete love and concern for humanity. Today's feast was instituted in 1925 by Pope Pius XI in response to the political and social climate at the time. With the rise of dictatorships and monarchs all around the world and the increase of secularism, Pope Pius saw the importance and the need to remind the world that our allegiance and trust must be rooted in Christ and Christ alone. With the world looking elsewhere for truth and happiness, Pope Pius saw the urgency to remind the world and the faithful that Jesus is the Supreme and Sovereign Ruler of the Universe.

He wanted to redirect the world's attention back to God. He wanted to remind all of society that Jesus' Kingship and Kingdom surpass all earthy powers and authorities. He wanted



to make it clear, as the Vicar of Christ, that Jesus' Kingship and power will endure forever. Instead of turning to worldly figures for truth and happiness, one must turn to Christ who offered His life as a ransom for all. Pope Pius refers to the Scriptures as evidence of the Lordship of Christ and how important it is that we trust in God and God alone; that He is the fulfillment of all of our hopes and longings in Christ Jesus!

Today's Feast is very relevant for every generation because it is so easy for us to lose our way. In today's Gospel, Jesus reminds us that judgment is real and inevitable. It is clear that one day we will all stand before the Judgment Seat of Christ to give a full account of our lives. In the end, it will all come down to how well we provided for those less fortunate than us, the most needy and vulnerable in our world. The urgency of being prepared for Judgment Day is real because we only have this life to get it right. We only have this life of ours to prepare ourselves for a life eternal with God.

It saddens me when I see so much evil and violence in our world today. It saddens me when I hear that people do not believe in God or Christ. If so, what are we living for? Are we living for this world which will eventually come to an end? Or are we living for Heaven which will last forever? The truth is we determine our eternal fate. And it is clear in today's Gospel of the criteria that is necessary to inherit eternal life. It all comes down to the Corporal Works of Mercy in how we respected and served the least in the Kingdom of God. We will be judged on how well we relate and connect with humanity as a whole, especially towards the less fortunate in our society. If today's Gospel does not lead us to greater conversion of heart and sympathy for those who are often ignored in society, if it does not change us to recognize those in greatest need of our help and support, then I am not sure what will.

Today's feast marks the conclusion of another liturgical year! What a beautiful time for us to take some inventory of our lives as we prepare for a new beginning. What a beautiful time for us to reflect on our lives as we enter a new season of Advent next weekend: A season filled with new hope and joy in the Lord. What a perfect time to look to Christ again as our Supreme Shepherd and model for all ages. To remember that He came to show us how to live in communion with God and in service to one another. He shows us by example how to provide for others and how to tend to His flock with a shepherd's care and love. Today's Feast reminds us of and reassures us that Jesus Christ, Our Sovereign King, will reign forever!

From the Desk of Msgr. Walden

There is more Jesus in the meatballs than in the Mass card. Those words were spoken by a priest who gave a retreat in a parish I was in over 25 years ago. He was my spiritual director when I was in the seminary, became a pastor, and then retired. When he gave the retreat, he was retired. What did he mean? Was he being heretical?

Absolutely not! In the Gospel for today's Mass (Matthew 25:14-30), Jesus tells a parable about three people who were entrusted with talents. The first two used their talents to do good while the third buried the talent. Our greatest talents come from our hearts where we use all the love and goodness in them to enrich the lives of others.

The point the priest who gave the retreat was making was that it is good, but very easy to send a Mass card, while to take the pot of meatballs and go over to the house of someone who is sick or lost a loved one is to sit down and cry, comfort, console and support them.

We cannot cure diseases or bring back loved ones from the dead, but our personal presence brings hope, support, and comfort. Our greatest gift to one another is the love and concern we share in our hearts and our physical presence accompanied by our undivided attention and concern.

An open heart pours out goodness, love, and life. When the good that can be done is right in front of us, the greatest thing we can do is to follow the powerful prompting of our hearts and reach out. This point was made very clear in a reflection for this Sunday in the Magnificat publication with these words from a reflection for today by Pope Francis: "How many people spend their lives simply accumulating possessions, concerned only about the good life and not the good they can do. Yet how empty is a life centered on our needs and blind to the needs of others. The reason we have gifts is so that we can be gifts for others. And here, brothers and sisters, we should ask ourselves the question: do I only follow my own needs, or am I able to look to the needs of others, to whomever is in need? Are our hands open or are they closed?"

Our hands only do what our hearts prompt them to do. In the preface for the votive Mass for the Sacred Heart, we have these words: "For raised up high on the Cross, he gave himself up for us with a wonderful love and poured out blood and water from his pierced side, the wellspring of the Church's Sacraments, so that, won over to the open heart of the Savior, all might draw water joyfully from the springs of salvation." Each time love pours out of our hearts we bring the peace, hope, and presence of Jesus to one another. The thought goes from what do I have to do now to what can I do for others. Jesus refused stop the love pouring out from His heart even on the cross: "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do" (Luke 23:34), "This day you will be with me in paradise." (Luke 23:43) It is not in protecting and guarding ourselves that we find meaning and security, but in sharing who and what we are with one another. It is in freely taking the time and giving others our undivided, loving attention, the very things Jesus does for us when we pray to Him and encounter Him in the Sacraments.

Prayer to the Sacred Heart of Jesus: O most holy heart of Jesus, fountain of every blessing, I adore you, I love you, and with lively sorrow for my sins, I offer you this poor heart of mine. Make me humble, patient, pure and wholly obedient to your will. Grant, good Jesus, that I may live in you and for you.

Women's Group...

Fr. Timothy Gallagher's book on The Discernment of Spirits, lists St. Ignatius' 14 rules for discernment, then goes through each rule a chapter at a time, describing how to apply it in our lives. In the ups & downs, consolations and desolations of our spiritual life, we go



through times of pure joy to "Where are You Jesus?"

St. Ignatius (1491-1556), recuperating from war wounds was given reading material on the life of Christ & the saints. As he thought about what he read, he became aware of his thought patterns, how the thoughts affected his feelings, and how the good feelings remained with him. When he had worldly thoughts, although he felt good while thinking them, he noticed that afterward the feelings left him empty. He continued reading spiritual books growing in wisdom. God was leading him, fulfilling His Plan for him to be a great saint & to teach us. God's plan for us is the same, the process is slow.

As women who love Jesus, we want to learn more and grow closer to Him, at times feeling inadequate, wondering is this Jesus, me or the enemy. In our group, we begin to see we're all equal, with the same problems, emotions, weaknesses, confusion, strengths, desires, fears, doing the best we can; we don't have to be perfect. Jesus consoles us through our love for each other. If you feel desire to come but are fearful, we understand because we've been there and at times still are; just come as you are, no rules or requirements, you don't have to read or share. We respect the privacy of others, sharing is anonymous!
