A Message from Seminarian Patrick O'Brien



Dear Saint John's,

As Saint Francis used to say, "May the Lord give you His Peace!" My name is Patrick O'Brien, and I am a seminarian studying to be a priest for the Diocese of Rockville Centre, currently in my second year of theology studies at Saint Joseph's Seminary in Yonkers. When I was a sophomore at Bishop McGann-Mercy High School, I was invited by my high school theology teacher, Mike Clauberg, to an event through the Saint John's youth ministry for extra credit. It was a night of Eucharist Adoration with Father Rob Ketcham, beautiful music and, for the first time in my life, time of silent contemplation

with Jesus in the Eucharist. This was the springboard to my involvement with Saint John's Life Teen, attending weekly Sunday Mass and life nights, retreats, Steubenville Conferences, which paved the way for my attending Franciscan University, becoming an altar server in college, and ultimately responding to the Lord's invitation to enter the seminary. I am so grateful to be here with you this weekend, and to tell you that I am officially set to become a member of this parish. While I received my sacraments at another parish, it was through this parish community that began my personal encounters and relationship with Jesus. I look forward to seeing familiar faces and meeting new ones! Additionally, I will be back to serve the Christmas Masses and am so glad to be able to come home to Saint John's. On this First Sunday of Advent, the Mass readings tell us to walk in the light of the Lord (Is 2:5), put on the armor of light (Rom 13:12), and to be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come. (Mt 24:44) As we enter this period of waiting for the coming of the Lord at Christmas, for the Incarnation, let us also prepare our hearts for when He comes again. The most perfect way to do this is to surrender ourselves to Him, and to receive Him humbly and worthily when He comes to us at Mass in the Eucharist. Advent is a season of penance, let us go to Confession with humble and contrite hearts, where Jesus is waiting to forgive us. May we be open and prepare ourselves for Jesus, the One whom our souls love. May God Bless you and your families this Advent season and always!

All-powerful God, increase our strength of will for doing good that Christ may find an eager welcome at his coming and call us to his side in the kingdom of heaven, where he lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit one God, forever and ever. ~AMEN.

Advent...

Lighting Your Advent Wreath During the Week

Each day during the first week of Advent, at the evening meal (or any time) one purple candle is lite. The following prayers accompany the lighting of the candles.

All make the sign of the cross: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Someone at table reads the Scripture assigned to the liturgy of the day (one or both of the readings may be used). Go to www.usccb.org to find the readings of the day. Then the Leader continues: Leader: Lift up your hearts.

All respond: We lift them up to the Lord.

The Leader prays: God, the Father of mercies, you willed your Son to take flesh, in order to give life back to us. Bless these your gifts with which we are about to nourish our bodies, so that, receiving new strength, we may wait in watchfulness for the glorious coming of Christ. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

After the meal, the Leader says: Let us live soberly, justly, and devoutly in this world as we wait in joyful hope for the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ. All respond: For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.

Advent Considerations....

"Advent asks us every year, to wake up: "Now is the time for us to wake from sleep" (Rom 13:11). The winter season here in Tautra (Norway) gives a special impetus to this demand. When I pray in the dark church after Vigils, sometimes the darkness lulls me back towards sleep, and if my prayer is especially empty, I am tempted by compelling thoughts of my warm bed, attracted by the hibernation of sleep when the world outside is so dark and cold. There's a parallel here for all year. As Christians we are called to be utterly awake in a benighted world in order to use that vigilance as compassion, to resist being asleep to the overwhelming needs of the world in its distress. Being fully awake is the soul work of a life time. It pulls us continually to a wrenching self-knowledge from which humility can ultimately be formed. We can never entirely fulfill our personal vocation if we do not do the work of casting off sleep. I have only attempt to eat my breakfast mindfully, to discover that after two mouthfuls of bread, my mind has traveled long miles, and I am chasing yesterday's resentments, worried about to-

day's work, reliving dreams from the night before. The practice of remaining inside the experience of the taste and texture of the bread, the silence of the refectory, the flickering candle on the table in winter, the thirst for a cup of tea, has a resonance for staying in the truth of the heart at every moment, acknowledging my poverty, my constant need for God. Every attempt at mindfulness is a sharp lesson for me, revealing how asleep I often am to the life of my own heart, and thus to God." - Northern Light, p. 163





St. John the Evangelist Parish

Did you know ...

On February 2, 1909, the Reverend John J. Donlon was assigned as rector of St John the Evangelist in Center Moriches, and later appointed as Pastor in 1914.

Six years later in 1920, Father Donlon began the School Fund, which in four years provided enough money to purchase the Hallock residence, which was on the northwest corner of Clinton & Main Street in Center Moriches, (currently the site of the CVS pharmacy just west of the fire house). The intent of Fr. Donlon's purchase of the large house was to make it the Catholic elementary school in town.

That did not develop because a generous parishioner, Joseph McAleenan placed the winning bid of \$10k at an auction in 1925 and bought the former public school building on the northeast corner of Brookfield Avenue & Main Street in Center Moriches. The deed of that purchase was transferred to Fr. Donlon for the future St. John the Evangelist School. (More on that soon).

Now, Fr. Donlon's 1924 purchase of the Hallock residence, would not be a school as originally thought,

but instead be the convent for the Sisters of Charity who would staff the newly acquired school. When the school opened on September 13, 1926, there were 64 students in grades 1 through 5, and three Sisters. The nuns remained in this convent until 1954.

A large house was purchased at 19 Ocean Avenue in Center Moriches in 1954 by then Pastor, Rev. Stanislaus Kowalski, who converted this residence to the new convent. Fr. Kowalski, intended for the Sisters to be housed next to the property that would be next to the new school that would open in 1961.

Readings for Next Sunday— Solemnity of Christ the King

Please look over these readings and consider these reflection questions before coming to Mass next Sunday.

First Reading + Daniel 7:13-14

Compare and contrast Jesus' "kingdom" with countries that have powerful political organizations. Are the objectives somewhat different in God's kingdom and, for instance, the USA?

Second Reading + Revelation 1:5-8

This reading holds that Christ "has made us into a kingdom, priests for his God and Father." The Jerusalem Bible says that in union with Jesus, the messianic priest, we will consecrate the universe to God in a sacrifice of praise. How can you cooperate in this consecration ("making holy") of the universe to God? Is working on the care for creation a way of consecrating the universe?

<u>**Gospel**</u> + John 18:33b-37</u>

What does "testifying to the truth" mean? Does it mean defending our ideas? What is one small or large way you can be prophetic or testify to the truth?


