


St. John the Evangelist Roman Catholic Church

Advent Beginnings


GRACE AND GRATITUDE

Dear Parish Family:

As part of my role as a part-time social worker in the Catholic School in Center Moriches, I work with our school counselor on some of the social emotional learning presentations. They are good opportunities to help students process and maybe better understand their actions and reactions. It fits in per-

fectly with the mission of Catholic schools to try and to form the whole person. It is also nice to be able to bring the beauty of our Catholic tradition into the lessons. When we presented about bullying, for example, we used the story of the Good Samaritan to speak about bystanders and upstanders.

This month we are focused on mindfulness and gratitude trying to understand the need to step back at times, take a breath, and consider things before acting and reacting. I titled my presentations "Grace and Gratitude". When I stepped down as the principal in 2020, a family gave me a sign (see the



Grace. The song begins, "All I have and all I feel is all because of you. All I reap is all I sow and love is our living proof." We just don't take time to consider this enough, do we? Good news! We are in a good time of the year for this work. Advent calls us to slow down a bit to see the signs of God at work in our lives. The first part of Advent draws us to consider the heavens so we might need to reorder some of our own priorities so we may get there one day! This is one of the reasons our Advent wreath hangs so high....looking through it symbolically draws us to look at the heavens.

It is no coincidence that we celebrate Advent in the darkest time of the year. In the darkest time of the year, what about taking some time consider the "moon and the stars" referenced in the Gospel. In my own life, I have taken time to be a little more aware of the beauty of creation—even in the dark of night. We prepare to celebrate Incarnation at Christmas. This incarnation happens in the midst of God's creation.

When we stop to consider how all of this works and comes together (when we get out of the way), how could it be anything else but grace at work, God's love at work? What if we tried to take some of that time in the weeks ahead? Seek some silence. Walk quietly outside. Create a quiet space to just be in your home, maybe around the Advent wreath? It may take a little time but you'll see the sings of God's love at work.

Gratitude. As you consider the many graces in your life—even in the midst of the darkness—how can we not be grateful to God for all he has done for us? Yes, we face struggles. We can feel defeated. We may want to throw up our hands and say forget it. Take a deep breath, no matter how bad the day is, and find something to be grateful for in your life...and be sure to thank God. I had students in our sessions this past week write thank you notes to people they were grateful for in their own lives. Many asked for two or three additional cards. Maybe not a bad idea for each one of us?



My friend, Msgr. Joe DeGrocco, is not only a huge Olivia Newton John fan. He is a huge Advent fan! When I lived in my former parish and in the seminary, we celebrated Advent hard-core! He challenged (well, forced us) to hold off on Christmas and allow Advent to do it what it is there to do. We laughed and sometimes made jokes (and good ones, too!). However, he was right. The Church gives us this beautiful time to recognize God's grace and to be grateful. Let's not miss out.

Please say a prayer for me.

ADVENT 2021

ADVENT AND THE NEW LITURGICAL YEAR

Our new liturgical year begins this weekend with the celebration of the First Sunday of Advent.

Here are some things for your consideration!

- As we have done in the past, each week we will offer a different blessing of Church for you (and/or your family) to pray. Please make use of these blessings in your homes.
- During the Sunday Masses of Advent, we will use the Entrance Antiphon from the *Roman Missal*. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal encourages the use of the antiphon each week. It's purpose and that of the Entrance Hymn—is to "open the celebration, foster the unity of those gathered, introduce their thoughts to the mystery of the liturgical time or festivity and accompany the procession of the Priest and ministers" (47).



- We will use a new music setting for Advent. It will be familiar to you as it is based on the very popular Advent Hymn O Come, O Come Emmanuel. Pay attention to the ways our music changes in this liturgical season. You'll hear some different sounds, some quieter ones, as we prepare for the joyous season of Christmas!
- During the season of Advent (and the season of Lent), the Gloria is not said or sung. It creates a sense of anticipation. Store up your fervor for the Vigil of Christmas, or Christmas Day.
- Look for some opportunities to grow deeper in the dark and quiet times of Advent. Take some quiet time in the Church or Seton Chapel, pray for those we will serve in these holidays, come early to Mass or praying quietly in Our Lady's Chapel after Mass or join a ministry or prayer group and so much more. Do not do these things to "do" things. Rather, enter them hoping to create a deeper space for Christ to dwell.
- Advent Reconciliation. We do plan to have an Advent Day of Reconciliation on Monday, December 20, 2021. We need to wait as we get closer to determine if and how we will able to do this.

May the wreath and its light be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation.

May he come quickly and not delay.






SJE offers a number of ways to remember loved ones, or honor someone living.

Advent Begins!

November 28 - December 24

Beginning the Church's liturgical year, Advent (from, "ad-venire" in Latin or "to come to") is the season encompassing the four Sundays (and weekdays) leading up to the celebration of Christmas.

The Advent season is a time of preparation that directs our hearts and minds to Christ's second coming at the end of time and to the anniversary of Our Lord's birth on Christmas. From the earliest days of the Church, people have been fascinated by Jesus' promise to come back. But the scripture readings during Advent tell us not to waste our time with predictions. Advent is not about speculation. Our Advent readings call us to be alert and ready, not weighted down and distracted by the cares of this world (Lk 21:34-36). Like Lent, the liturgical color for Advent is purple since both are seasons that prepare us for great feast days. Advent also includes an element of penance in the sense of preparing, quieting, and disciplining our hearts for the full joy of Christmas.

As we prepare for Christmas, the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* notes some differences to the Mass that should be observed during the season. For instance, the priest will wear violet or purple during Advent, except for the Third Sunday of Advent (Gaudete Sunday) when rose is worn (GIRM, no. 316). Aside from what the priest wears, other aesthetic changes in the Church can include a more modestly decorated altar.

The final days of Advent, from December 17 to December 24, we focus on our preparation for the celebrations of the Nativity of our Lord at Christmas. In particular, the "O" Antiphons are sung during this period and have been by the Church since at least the eighth century. They are a magnificent theology that uses ancient biblical imagery drawn from the messianic hopes of the Old Testament to proclaim the coming of Christ as the fulfillment not only of Old Testament hopes, but of present ones as well.

Advent devotions including the Advent wreath, remind us of the meaning of the season. Our Advent calendar above can help you fully enter into the season with daily activity and prayer suggestions to prepare you spiritually for the birth of Jesus Christ.
