FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

You are the potter, we are the clay...

MOLDABLE

Dear Parish Family:

It is a late Monday evening and I am finishing an appointment. It's been quite a day and a quite a few weeks. As I was returning to my parish office today, I walked through the parking through the school, through the school parking lot to the convent and through the field to the Rectory. Exhausted from the day – not the walk – I smiled. Let me tell you why.

I left Ernie's Place after storing more turkeys and listening to the stories of the Ernie's Place staff. The pantry is still full. That's not too common in pantries around Thanksgiving. New volunteers stepped up and helped sort the overwhelming amount of donations. Serving over 25 families in one night this Monday, volunteers spoke of the chance to meet some incredible customers who came seeking support and also offering it with their words of gratitude and humility ("No, I don't need that much. Please save it for someone else.").

I walked through the school. There the saints of the Community Meal served a Thanksgiving Feast with the food prepared by so many of you for those whose Thanksgiving may be spent in a room or on the street or in a place alone. Here, too, a few more Thanksgiving Baskets were given out to those in need. Because of your support and generosity, SJE served nearly 130 families for Thanksgiving. So many of you prepared beauti-

ful baskets – I had a little envy, I must admit! – for families in our community. Volunteers prepared, sorted, distributed, and provided for so many people in need this past weekend. Now the delivery crew begins to make the home visits tomorrow morning. More people being molded and formed.

As I moved to the parking lot so many cars were present. More moldable people as one of our many 12 step groups know that "through working our program of recovery, we are given the grace to meet those challenges". The Meeting Room of the Red Barn was alive too! This time with the men and women from our Spanish community who are coming to know about the Catholic faith in preparation for Baptism and full initi-

ation into the Church. Fr. Jaime is doing an incredible job building our RCIA process in Spanish and English. More people open to where the Spirit leads, open to formed and molded in the life of the Church.

As I continued to walk, I noticed the chickens were sleeping. I laughed. Who would have thought a parish would provide fresh eggs to the poor and needy and that I would become a chicken whisperer guiding the escaped chicken or two back into the pen. I think they actually listen to me. Even they're a bit moldable and flexible. (Seminarian Louis was good enough to take a picture.)

The lights in Seton Chapel were still on so I went in thinking I had forgotten to turn them off only to hear the voices of a few gathering to pray for priests during a special Holy Hour each Monday. The convent still held the smell of incense from Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament where nearly 40 people came to pray between the hours 3 and 7 p.m.

on this Monday. So many coming to pray to be with the Lord but also, I hope, to be open to where God might be calling and moving us.

As I returned to my parish office, I met with a young person beginning another part of his life journey. Returning from his senior year with a world of opportunity ahead of him. I had the chance to help with something related to school but was more and more in awe of how this stubborn, frustrating freshman in high school had a become a man of deeper substance and depth (most of the time—some stubborn remnants remain). He never thought he would have the opportunities that lie before him. More signs of being open, flexible, moldable to the work of the potter.

Advent is upon us. It is a time to look, watch, stay alert and prepare for how each one of our lives can be different because of Jesus. We can decide to leave ourselves as we are or we can pray for the openness so needed to fully embrace the mystery of Christmas. The potter is well at work here as shown by so many of you in these days and times. What more needs to be loosened and made flexible? What signs do you need to see that Jesus wants to be so intimate with you and me?

ADVENT AND THE NEW LITURGICAL YEAR

Our new liturgical year begins this weekend with the celebration of the First Sunday of Advent.

Here are some things for your consideration!

- As we have done in the past, each week we will offer a different blessing of Church for you (and/or your family) to pray. Please make use of these blessings.
- During the Sunday Masses of Advent, we will use the Entrance Antiphon from the Roman Missal. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal encourages the use of the antiphon each week. It's purpose and that of the Entrance Hymn—is to "open the celebration, foster the unity of those gathered, introduce their thoughts to the mystery of the liturgical time or festivity and accompany the procession of the Priest and ministers" (47). We hope to continue this practice in other seasons as well.



- We will use a new music setting for Advent. It will be familiar to you as it is based on the very popular Advent Hymn O Come, O Come Emmanuel. Pay attention to the ways our music changes in this liturgical season. You'll hear some different sounds, some quieter ones, as we prepare for the joyous season of Christmas!
- During the season of Advent (and the season of Lent), the Gloria is not said or sung. It creates a sense of anticipation. Store up your fervor for the Vigil of Christmas, or Christmas Day.
- Look for some opportunities to grow deeper in the dark and quiet times of Advent. Take some quiet time in the Church or Seton Chapel, pray for those we will serve in these holidays, come early to Mass or praying quietly in Our Lady's Chapel after Mass or join a ministry or prayer group and so much more. Do not do these things to "do" things. Rather, enter them hoping to create a deeper space for Christ to dwell.
- Advent Reconciliation. We do plan to have an Advent Day of Reconciliation on Monday, December 21, 2020. We need to wait as we get closer to determine if and how we will able to do this. Confessions times are listed in the bulletin. Of course you can always contact the Parish Office to make an appointment with one of our priests. Please do your best to receive the Sacrament in the Church during one of our regular times or the extended times noted above.

"Advent is the time of promise; it is not yet the time of fulfillment. We are still in the midst of everything and in the logical inexorability and relentlessness of destiny.... Space is still filled with the noise of destruction and annihilation, the shouts of self-assurance and arrogance, the weeping of despair and helplessness. 

KEEPING SAFE IN THESE DAYS!

LITURGICAL PRACTICES, GOOD HEALTH AND COMMON SENSE!

Since 2017, we have published updates regarding good health, particularly in the winter months. My former Pastor, Msgr. Joseph DeGrocco, a former professor of liturgy at the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception, prepared a brief article for my former parish's bulletin. As we are approaching the winter season in a time of pandemic, there are some good things to consider in our celebration of the Eucharist and some things we have been encouraging for many years!

As we come to celebrate Mass together each week during these winter days, it's a good time to review some common-sense liturgical practices and issues, to help everyone stay healthy and to care for one another.

- Not feeling great, STAY HOME! Please do not take any chances for your sake or anyone else's! Join us via social media or watch Mass on the Catholic Faith Network. The risks are too great for you and for others in these days. There is no obligation to attend Mass in this time; it is not a sin to miss Mass for this reason. (Also, there is no need to go to Confession if you miss Mass because you are sick.)
- Entering the Church: You must enter through the main fellowship doors with your mask on. NO MASK = NO ENTRANCE into the Church. Sanitize your hands, take a worship aid and enter the church. For Masses in the Auditorium, you may enter through the north or south entrances. Specific doors are marked for entrance and exit.
- <u>Seating:</u> Please sit as close to the front as possible. It works best for groups of one and two can sit closer to the front and/or fill the seats along the perimeter of the church. This allows us to make the maximum, safe use of our available seating. Please keep a safe distance from those on either side of you and/or your family.
- <u>Holy Communion:</u> Priests, deacons and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion wash and sanitize their hands before Mass begins and immediately before distribution of Holy Communion. When Extraordinary Ministers go to their station, they place the vessel on the small table near that station and sanitize their hands before distributing Holy Communion.
- Reception of Holy Communion: Remember to bow as the person before you receives Holy Communion (this is not new). While you do this, please take down your mask. Please hold your hands out as flat as possible to receive Holy Communion. After placing the host in your mouth, put your mask back up and return to your seat.
- Greeting of Peace: The greeting of peace by shaking hands is suspended at this time.
- <u>Help!</u>: We are always looking for more volunteers to assist with the Cana Care Crew, particularly after Masses with the wipe down of the pews. If you and/or your family are willing to help, please see one of the volunteers in the orange shirts. We provide the gloves, t-shirt, towels and cleaning solution. You provide the arm strength and the positive spirit!

Sunday Night Mass Come to The Six!

As you may have noticed, our Sunday morning Masses are beginning to fill up. This is good news! I want to ask those who may be accustomed to coming on Sunday morning to consider coming on Sunday evening at 6 p.m. In general - regardless of the public health situation we find ourselves in now- it is a little less crowded. It is also, at least for me, a great way to draw the weekend to a close. Coming to pray the Mass with the community of faith is a great way to conclude the Lord's Day and often allows me to be more focused rather than so easily distracted by all the day ahead may bring. Hope to see you there!

SAFE ENVIRONMENT UPDATES

Background Screening Update
The Office for the Protection of Children and Young People:

The Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People (The Charter) promulgated by the Bishops of the United States in 2002 outlines specific practices and guidelines providing standards of safety in parishes and dioceses throughout the United States. As directed in The Charter, the Diocese of Rockville Centre requires all employees, clergy, and volunteers to complete three requirements within thirty days of employment or volunteering:

Attend Protecting God's Children Program (Virtus)

Sign the Codes of Conduct;

Complete a background screen application. The Diocese requires all those who remain in active ministry be rescreened at 5 yr. intervals. volunteers/employees.

A Word on Background Screening of Volunteers:

The Office for the Protection of Children and Young People (OFPCYP) has streamlined the volunteer application process enabling volunteers to complete the three safe environment requirements in one step. Individuals wishing to volunteer in a parish or school:

Register to attend a Protecting God's Children class and create a Virtus account on the Virtus website: www.Virtus.org

Electronically acknowledge the Diocesan Code of Conduct- provided during the Virtus registration process.

Follow the instructions to complete the Sterling Volunteers background screening application background offered during the Virtus registration process.

Active Volunteers:

If you are active in a parish ministry, have already attended Virtus and have been background screened you may be at – or beyond- the *5yr. rescreening requirement*. If this is the case, you will receive an email from *Sterling Volunteers* asking you to complete the background screening application on-line. You may access the background screening application by following the prompt in the email or logging into your Virtus account. *Please be aware-this is not a scam nor has your e-mail been hacked.* The OFPCYP has been working with your parish to update the Safe Environment records and noted it is time for you to be rescreened. You may also be prompted to electronically resign the Code of Conduct when you log into your Virtus account.
