

# A Reflection from Msgr. Walden...

### **All Souls Day**

There was a man in my last parish who would greet me and others with these words: "Peace be with you and all those you carry in your heart." Those in our hearts are a great source of joy, hope, peace, security and love. Today, November 2<sup>nd</sup>, is All Souls Day. It is a day to remember in a special way all those who have died and are still very much in our hearts, minds, and thoughts. As much as our memories bring joy, because we are people of faith, these memories bring comfort and even joy as we contemplate the next time we will be fully in their presence and they will be in ours. As death brings tears, sadness, and sorrow, because of our faith, it brings the vision, hope, and reality Where they have gone we of reunion. surely hope to follow and through that be reunited forever in God's presence.

One of the most powerful and hopeful Gospel passages to read and contemplate at funerals and wakes is from John 14:1-6. This is part of the Last Supper Discourse in St. John's Gospel (John, chapters 13-17) where Jesus pours out His heart in love, hope, and direction for those about to face His crucifixion the next day. Briefly their hopes would be shattered, but once Jesus rose all His words from the Last Supper and throughout His three year public ministry of preaching, healing the sick, raising the dead, and feeding all who hunger for what only God can give us, illumined their minds and hearts with joy, courage, and absolute trust in Him and His words and actions of life.

What is very clear and certain is that as much death separates us from loved ones, in the end, it will do just the opposite - it will reunite us eternally. It is only with the vision of faith that we can find peace and direction and also face the reality of our own death and what will happen then. While we do not have a step by step

guide to read and guide us, we do have more written any itinerary can provide. We have the Word of Jesus Christ who literally is the Word of God. The love and joy shared in this life will be magnified more than we can imagine. The fullness of God's presence will make us fully present to and with one another. Today is not only a day to look back with gratitude, but to very much look forward with hope and joy to what we all internally hope and long for: life, love, joy, and peace with all those we carry in our hearts, magnified by the fullness and purity of God's love. Eternal life will be eternal joy,

wonder, and gratitude.

The Gospel of St. John opens with these words: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came to be through him, and without him nothing came to be. What came to be through him was life, and this life was the light of the human race; the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it. A man named John was sent from God. He came for testimony, to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He was not the light, but came to testify to the light. The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world came to be through him, but the world did not know him. He came to what was his own, but his own people did not accept him. But to those who did accept him he gave power to become children of God, to those who believe in his name, who were born not by natural generation nor by human choice nor by a man's decision but of God. And the Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us, and we saw his glory, the glory as of the Father's only Son, full of grace and truth."


## Women's Group...
