St. John's Food Pantry Ministry

ERNIE'S PLACE

Dear Parish Family:

This past Thursday we celebrated the Commemoration of All Souls. On Thursday evening, we prayed with members of our parish who have lost a loved one this past year. It is always a beautiful—and yes emotional—liturgy. As part of the liturgy, we remember each person by name and pray for them and their families.



One name we read and one person we prayed for on Thursday evening was Ernie Vigliotta. Ernie died last November 12th surrounded by his amazing family. We celebrated Ernie's funeral a few days later. What a funeral it was! We were blessed by the presence of Msgr. McDonald who preached a message of hope and even a little humor in recognizing the many ways God used Ernie to touch the lives of so many in our parish life. He had a tremendous devotion and commitment to the priests who served here at St. John's. He offered his life for so many in our parish but especially for the poor and the vulnerable. This continued beyond his life here on earth. After his passing, many made donations to the Food Pantry and Parish Social Ministry efforts here at SJE. This has supported the work of the Food Pantry and so many of our efforts for those in need. What a gift!

After consulting with the leaders of some of our parish's social ministry groups, our Pastoral Team and Ernie's family, we are going to rename the Food Pantry, "Ernie's Place—St. John's Food Pantry Ministry". (You can see a rendition of the new sign to the left of this paragraph.)



Why are we doing this? First, it is not simply about recognizing Ernie Vigliotta. It's ultimately about honoring the amazing way he responded to God's call to serve those in need in the hopes that we might do the same in the midst of this community. When others ask, "Why is this named Ernie's Place?" it will be an opportunity to share about a man who offered his life for the Church as a husband, father, grandfather, relative, friend and parishioner. I hope it serves as an inspiration and a challenge. Whenever I hear about Ernie's life and contributions, as well as the example of so many others here—past and present, I am pushed in my own heart to try to respond to God's call with the same devotion. Maybe the same for you?

The second reason for the name is about those we serve and an opportunity to give them a greater dignity and honor. There is a certain stigma for the poor when they ask for help and even an embarrassment to come to the "Food Pantry". The volunteers do everything they can to make it as easy as possible for the poor and vulnerable to approach and seek support here at SJE. It's probably a little easier to say "Hey—head over to Ernie's Place. They're great. They'll help you with what you need." Even for someone in need to respond to another by saying, "I'm heading to Ernie's Place." It's a little easier than saying, "We have to go to the food pantry."

Next **Sunday, November 12, 2017 at 1:00 p.m.**, we will have a special blessing and renaming of the Food Pantry. I hope you can come and join with Ernie's family and friends as we give thanks to God for a pillar in our community, one whose legacy of offering and response we continue to build upon as a parish family. See you at Ernie's Place.

After this letter, at the suggestion of members of our Pastoral Council, we'll include excerpts of the Catechism in the bulletin throughout the year. Bishop Barres writes:



4) Celebrate that the Catechism of the Catholic Church helps us to be nourished and inspired by the witness and teaching of the Fathers, Doctors, Saints and Martyrs of the Church

Every one of the four parts of the *Catechism* is enriched by the wisdom of the Fathers, Doctors and Saints of the Church. The lives, writings and teachings of the saints are a breath of prayer that circulates throughout the *Catechism*.

Their joyful presence in the *Catechism* is a reminder that the content is not only meant to be read, studied, taught and prayed but it is meant to be lived. The saints show us that it can be lived.

One Year Installed

HUMBLED

Dear Parish Family:

Last year on this weekend, November 5th to be exact, I was formally installed as your Pastor. It is a ministry I was surprised to be called to take on and one that has kept me in awe and amazement. It is hard for me to comprehend all that has happened in this past year. Life changed dramatically for my family and I a month after I was installed. Needless to say our parish has changed radically since May 19th. It's been quite a year to say the least.



As we come to the end of the liturgical year, it is also a good time for us to take stock of our past year of life and ministry. Last year, I spoke at all of the Masses presenting but the Annual Financial Report, which I believe has been the tradition here. I do not mind speaking to you about money and finances. It is a reality and it is our common reality as a parish family. We should look over a year not just from a financial perspective. It's a part of our parish. It's only one part, though. A lot more has happened over the past year. That's why this year's Annual Report is a little different. As you look through the next few pages you're going to see the "TOP 5" developments of some of the areas of our parish's life and ministry over the past year. I have asked our parish's leaders to help with this.

At first glance it might seem like an opportunity for gloating or even a poorly placed self-exaltation, i.e. "Look at how great we are...". If you read these pages and come away with that feeling we have failed. Rather, I hope you read these pages and are a bit humbled. I hope you are humbled, as I am, to be part of such a vibrant Catholic community of faith because this is more than we deserve. We should be humbled because anything we are able to do is because of the gifts God has given us as individuals and a community. None of these "things" would be possible without the Divine moving and dwelling here. How blessed are we!

We should have a good sense of humility because God has called us to this point in our parish's time. You'll notice so many of the "Top 5's" in this Annual Report involve us going out beyond ourselves to serve the other, whoever the other may be and where they be at a moment in time. The Gospel tells us today that "The greatest among you must be your servant" (Matthew 23:12). We are humbled because the Lord calls us to serve, calls us to offer our lives for the sake of the other.

As you read through these pages, I hope you will be inspired by the many ways the Spirit is at work here at SJE and how so many of us are allowing the Spirit to move in us. I hope as you read these pages you will also be challenged, challenged to respond to God's call to be great—by serving! **Quite simply, there is much work and ministry to do in the weeks and months ahead. Together, we have many chances to be humbled!**

It is good to take some time to look back. It would be easy for any of us to focus only one time in our personal lives or the tragedy that shook all of us in May and stay stuck in that place. Taking the long view allows us to see and to recognize the challenging and difficult times but also recognizing the Spirit at work through it all. Humbling indeed.

As I write this letter, I took some time to reflect on what I wrote last November to each of you. I quoted Pope Francis as he called us priests to recognize we are "healed paralytics". He states:

"Our priest is barefoot with respect to a land that he continues to believe and consider holy. He is not scandalized by the frailties that shake the human soul: aware that he is himself a healed paralytic, he is far removed from the coldness of the rigorist, as he is from the superficiality of those who easily comply. He accepts responsibility for others, feeling he is part of and responsible for their destiny.... With the oil of hope and consolation, he becomes neighbour to each person, careful to share in their abandonment and suffering. Having given up self-determination, he has no agenda to protect, but each morning consigns his time to the Lord so as to be free to meet and be approached by people. In this way, our priest is neither a bureaucrat nor an anonymous institutional official; he is not consecrated for an administrative role, nor is he motivated by criteria of efficiency...He knows that Love is everything. He does not seek earthly assurances or honorary titles, which lead one to trust in man; in the ministry per se he asks for nothing that goes beyond actual

His simple and essential lifestyle, always available, presents him as credible in people's eyes and brings him close to the humble, in a pastoral charity which creates freedom and solidarity. A servant of life, he walks with the heart and pace of the poor; he is enriched by being with them. He is a man of peace and reconciliation, a sign and instrument of God's tenderness, careful to spread goodness with the same fervour with which others look after their own interests."

I wish could write to you and say I have lived up to these expectations. I know I have failed in times and moments and my failures have caused others some pain and distance. A "healed paralytic", for sure, but I am one who is aware he is in need of ever greater healing. It is quite humbling. That's a good thing.

As we reflect upon the year that has gone before us and look forward to what lies ahead, may this humility cause is in a desire to be great. Never for ourselves. Never for our parish. Only for God and his people. A humbling task ahead, indeed. I'm up for it. I hope you are too.

QUEREMOS BAUTIZAR A SU HIJO ... ¡¡Hoy !!!

Como católicos, creemos firmemente en la importancia y la necesidad del hermoso sacramento del Bautismo. Es realmente el fundamento de nuestra vida como cristianos. Debido a la gran importancia de este sacramento, nosotros como cristianos católicos estamos llamados a hacer todo lo que esté a nuestro alcance para asegurarnos de que a nuestros hijos no se les prive de los beneficios del Bautismo por más tiempo del que es absolutamente necesario. Hay una mentalidad entre algunos católicos de que el bautismo puede demorarse durante muchos meses o incluso años.
