# A message from Msgr. Walden...

After 52 years of priesthood I have been asked to retire and to come to St. John the Evangelist in Center Moriches and live and work as a priest with Fr. Patrick Riegger. I began my priestly ministry in 1971 at St. John the Evangelist in Riverhead. After eight happy years there, I was assigned to St. Anne's in Brentwood for eight years. Those were truly good years. Following that, I was sent St. Anthony of Padua in East Northport for less than two years when I was assigned as pastor in St. Thomas More in Hauppauge for fourteen years. My next assignment sent me next door to St. Patrick in Smithtown for the past twenty years. All of these were blessings for me and I look forward to more years with you at St. John the Evangelist in Center Moriches. My home parish is St. Agnes in Greenport, my hometown.



Welcome!

In 2005 I met Fr. Patrick Riegger when he was assigned as an associate at St. Patrick in Smithtown. From the moment he walked in the door he brought his joy, goodness, and love to that rectory and parish. Through the years we have become good friends. He is a truly good priest whose presence and love you are coming to experience. It is because of him that the move from 20 years in Smithtown is easier for me.

I also have a connection with some of the priests who have been assigned to St. John the Evangelist here in Center Moriches. Fr. Virgil Power was my pastor at St. Agnes in Greenport when I was ordained and Fr. Paul Dahm was his associate. You had them here in the same capacity after that. Fr. John Corcoran, a former pastor here, was my math teacher in the Minor Seminary 1963-1965. I was in the seminary with Msgr. Jim McDonald and served at first Mass as a priest in St Joseph's in Garden City in 1967. I believe the architect who designed your church also designed the church I finished building in Smithtown.

I look forward to living with and serving you as a priest in the years ahead. It has been a blessing to walk the journey of life with more people than I could ever have imagined. Over and over again I have been inspired by the goodness, love and faith of countless people. I recently read an article about Pope John Paul II who began his time as pope with these words: "Be not afraid!" How good it is when we open our minds and hearts to the presence of Jesus in our lives as we pray, live, work, and love together. I look forward to living the words of Psalm 63 that I pray in Sunday Morning prayer in the Breviary with you:

> O God, you are my God, for you I long; for you my soul is thirsting. My body pines for you like a dry, weary land without water. So I gaze on you in the sanctuary to see your strength and your glory.

For your love is better than life, my lips will speak your praise. So I will bless you all my life, in your name I will lift up my hands. My soul shall be filled as with a banquet, my mouth shall praise you with joy.

On my bed I remember you. On you I muse through the night for you have been my help; in the shadow of your wings I rejoice. My soul clings to you; your right hand holds me fast. Glory...

Psalm Prayer: Father, creator of unfailing light, give that same light to those who call to you. May our lips praise you; our lives proclaim your goodness; our work give you honor, and our voices celebrate you for ever.


#### Hands-On Learning

desolations of our spiritual life, we go through times of pure joy to "Where are You Jesus?"


St. Ignatius (1491-1556), recuperating from war wounds was given reading material on the life of Christ & the saints. As he thought about what he read, he became aware of his thought patterns, how the thoughts affected his feelings, and how the good feelings remained with him. When he had worldly thoughts, although he felt good while thinking them, he noticed that afterward the feelings left him empty. He continued reading spiritual books growing in wisdom. God was leading him, fulfilling His Plan for him to be a great saint & to teach us. God's plan for us is the same, the process is slow.

As women who love Jesus, we want to learn more and grow closer to Him, at times feeling inadequate, wondering is this Jesus, me or the enemy. In our group, we begin to see we're all equal, with the same problems, emotions, weaknesses, confusion, strengths, desires, fears, doing the best we can; we don't have to be perfect. Jesus consoles us through our love for each other. If you feel desire to come but are fearful, we understand because we've been there and at times still are; just come as you are, no rules or requirements, you don't have to read or share. We respect the privacy of others, sharing is anonymous!
