A Message from the Wedding Ministry...

"Now at the resurrection whose wife will that woman be? For all seven had been married to her." (Luke 20:33)



It's a joy to be involved in the different ministries here at St. John's, especially as a cantor in the music ministry. I can still remember, even though it was over fifty years ago, singing harmonies while sitting next to my mom, Philomena, as she played the organ up in the loft of the old church. It is truly a privilege to also be part of the pastoral council, and to be an extraordinary minister of Holy Communion. I grew up in this wonderful parish, and attended its Catholic school, which was then St. John's

Elementary School. I feel so blessed by the friendships I've had and continue to form with parishioners and clergy, who make this parish the amazing community it is. I am so grateful to be a part of it.

Over twenty years ago, my husband Ed and I were asked to take over the position as coordinators of the weddings that take place here in our parish. Being involved in the wedding ministry allows us to share in each couple's excitement as they prepare to enter their journey as husband and wife. In marriage, God gives a man and a woman the beautiful opportunity to help make saints of each other. Marriage is built on the foundation of mutual love and respect, and to truly love someone is to want that person to get to Heaven, where all are saints.

In today's gospel, Jesus has an encounter with the Sadducees about marriage. The Sadducees had primary authority over the Temple, yet, unlike the Pharisees, they recognized only the original five books of the bible (the Pentateuch) and did not believe in the resurrection of the dead. Jesus had recently disagreed with the sacrificial practices of the Temple, so the Sadducees began citing a passage from the Book of Deuteronomy concerning a law referring to a levirate marriage (which sought to insure the preservation of one's family name by stipulating that a man should marry the childless widow of his brother). The Sadducees decided to take the idea of that law to an extreme level in an effort to discredit Jesus. He avoided their trap, however, by citing a passage from the Book of Exodus, indicating that God is the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, speaking in the present tense, pointing to the reality of the resurrection of the body.

At the first spark of life, when a soul is created, that soul exists forever, because souls are meant for Heaven. The primary purpose of marital love is to bring new souls to Heaven through the miracle of God's life-creating process. It is meant to be a mirror of God's love for us; selfless, and sacrificial. Once we are in Heaven with God our Creator, earthly relationships will have served their purpose. Human marriage will no longer play a role, for we will all be with God, who is the Bridegroom of the entire Church. As human beings, we are inclined to try to compare our life on Earth with life in Heaven, and wonder how our relationships will be different. It's hard for us to imagine a heavenly existence, where we will live outside of time and space. In Heaven, the vision of who we are to each other will be completely outshined by the Beatific Vision, because we will see God as He is, and come face-to-face with True Love. Even in this life, our relationship with God is primary. So it stands to reason that in Heaven, the relationship that will matter the most is our relationship with God. We will all be one Communion of Saints.

During the marriage rite, the bride and groom exchange their marriage vows, which will often include the words, 'until death do us part.' This doesn't mean that in death they will stop loving each other. Death only means that we will be separated from our bodies, which also means that we will be detached from earthly classifications. In Heaven, we will recognize each other, but there won't be any need for name tags or titles. We will not see each other as one belonging to another, but as all belonging to God.

Regarding the Sadducees and the Pharisees, a good way to differentiate between the two is to remember that the Pharisees believed in the resurrection of the body, while the Sadducees did not. To believe that there is no existence after this life is a very unhappy belief. That is why they were (Sadd...u cee?)

Jesus himself said, "I am the resurrection, and the life; whoever believes in me, will never die." Those are surely words to 'live' by.

Did you know ...

The following is from our parishioner Evelyn Stachnik: "On June 20th, 1943, my husband, Michael M. Stachnik Jr. graduated from St john's in Center Moriches.
