## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

### Bread and Coins

## OFFERING OR OBLIGATION

Dear Parish Family:

This weekend we here two different perspectives on offering, of giving to another. We can probably find ourselves in the either story...or maybe a little bit of both. The sense of offering is important for us to consider. We are in a time of giving as the holidays approach. We are also in a time of reflection as we consider the some of the practical and ministerial realities of our parish community.

So when it comes to offering—times, gifts, financial offerings—do you operate primarily from a place of desperation and desolation or do you operate from a place of dependence on God for everything?

**Desolation and Desperation.** As I pray with this week's readings, the widow in the first reading seems to operate from this place. There is, obviously, more to her story. I tend to imagine meeting someone like her today and her responding by saying something like, "What? I have so little. We're going to die anyway....but if you tell me I have to, I guess, I'll do it!" She does. The Lord does not abandon her.

How do we respond when we know what the Lord is asking of us? Does our offering come from a sense of obligation or openness to all that God wants of us? Do I do "it" (whatever it is) because I have to or because you're making me? If there is a particular situation in which I am always operating from this place, what does that say to me?

**Dependence.** Compare that with the widow in the Gospel. Again, I am sure there is more to her story too! However, she has very little. She knows she has very little. She gives it all the Lord. Not because she is obligated but because she is confident that God will take care of her! She does not give from her "extra" or because she wants others to see. No. Her relationship with the Lord is everything. Her offering is a sign of her praise and thanksgiving!

These readings come at an important time in our parish. This week, I will preach at all the Masses and, as part of that preaching, present some information about the financial realities of our parish as well as ministerial needs of this community. We are at an important time. Coming through the rebuilding of the Church as well as this pandemic, we are in the process of preparing for the 125th anniversary of St. John's. Each one of us—including me—must discern well what the Lord is asking of each of us and respond as this widow does. Let us give from our heart offering it all to the Lord.

Some areas to consider:

- ♦ **Finances.** Please review the 2020-21 financial review. This can also be found on the website by clicking on financial statements. The past two years can also be found there. Over the past two years we have faced some unexpected expenses including an insurance bill from the diocese in 2019-20 and exponentially increasing property insurance costs that were not budgeted. Because of your generous offering, we are still able to move forward in ministry and mission with new and exciting opportunities and practical improvements on the horizon. Your support of the weekly collection makes all the difference in the fiscal and pastoral life of our parish.
- ♦ **Ministry.** If you're reading this, please consider how you might respond to God's call in ministry. Honestly, the parish NEEDS you and your gifts here. There are so many opportunities to volunteer, donate your time, share your gifts, offer something for the good of the other. Just flip through the bulletin today. Our already vibrant ministries can shine even brighter and bring Christ's light to even more people. We just need you!
- ♦ **Vocations.** Today, begins Vocation Awareness Week. Please, please, please pray for vocations to the priesthood. Do you already know God is calling to you to the priesthood or religious life but your





responding like the widow in the first reading when you know you need to respond like the widow in the Gospel? I'll admit I responded like the first widow for many years until I did the work of discerning God's call and entering the seminary for formation to the priesthood. What about you?

The widows have something to teach us today! Whether it be bread and coins, money and mission, vocations and vision, let us deeply consider what God wants, not what we want. Let's pray for the courage to contribute all we have.

Please say a prayer for me.

SJE is in need of some construction/maintenance assistance with the following projects:

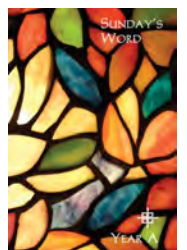

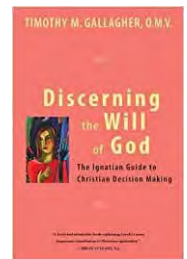
