A Reflection from the Director of Family Ministries...

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome. Now that's a mouthful! The Basilica of St. John Lateran is the oldest and highest-ranking of the four major basilicas in Rome, Italy. It serves as the cathedral of the Diocese of Rome and the official ecclesiastical seat of the Pope. Now, if you're anything like me...you may be a bit curious about the history of the Lateran Basilica. Well, I did a little research, and I even discovered why it's extra special for our parish family. Allow me to share with you just a little of what I learned. For those of you who know all about this...skip to paragraph # 4.

In 313, the Emperor Constantine granted full liberty to

Christians, springboarding Christianity from an illegitimate to a legitimate religion in the Roman Empire. In response to this, Christians began openly building churches all over, as they were now free to consecrate places to God. Constantine the Great also constructed churches, one of which was a magnificent basilica, built on the Caelian Hill in Rome. You guessed it -Constantine built the Lateran Basilica. The name Lateran comes from the family name, Laterani, a

privileged Roman family who previously

owned the property on which the basilica was built. The Lateran Basilica, the oldest church in the west, served as both a physical and a political turning point in the history of our Christian Faith. But there's more! The Lateran Basilica was dedicated several different times by several different popes. In 324, Pope Sylvester I dedicated the basilica to Christ the Savior. Later on, a chapel dedicated to St. John the Baptist was built inside the basilica, which served as the baptistry. This moved Pope Sergius II to dedicate the basilica to St. John the Baptist in the 10th century. In the 12th century, Pope Lucius II dedicated the basilica to none other than St. John the Evangelist! And so the official name is: "Papal Archbasilica of the Most Holy Savior and Saints John the Baptist and the Evangelist in the Lateran". This is simplified in common vernacular to "St. John Lateran." And just to clear up any confusion regarding the question, "Who is St. John Lateran?" It's a trick question. There is no such saint.

The Lateran Basilica and the adjacent Lateran Palace have housed many events that have changed the course of world history as well as that of the Catholic Church; including 5 Ecumenical councils, the signing of the Lateran Pacts and serving as the residence of the Popes until the 15th century. The history of the architecture is fascinating...and too vast to incorporate herein.

So where did the feast day come from? The basilica had been destroyed several times throughout history, but it was always rebuilt. Under the pontificate of Benedict XIII, the final reconstruction took place and the basilica was rededicated in the early part of the 18th century. It was at that time that today's feast was established and extended to the universal Church. The dedication anniversary of every cathedral is a feast day for all the churches in that diocese. As the Lateran is the cathedral of Rome, it is a feast day for the entire Church, celebrated everywhere. In fact, the feast of the Dedication of St. John Lateran is of such great

importance that it outranks a Sunday in Ordinary Time, as is the circumstance today.

But today's Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica is much more far-reaching than the dedication of a beautiful church to the Lord. It encourages us to reflect on the journey of God's people throughout history, God's constant love and faithful care, and our free will to respond to that love, or not. In the first reading, Ezekiel tries to encourage the people during the Babylonian exile, when they didn't have anything - no land to call their own and no place to pray to their God. He provides a beautiful vision of a temple... a temple flowing with the waters of

new life. It would be a place where the people could pray to their God and where their God would draw near to them. The people to whom Ezekiel spoke needed the promise of stability and safety, that the structure of a temple offered. But we know, all too well, that the "meeting place" for God and man, is not a brick-and-mortar building.

In the second reading, St. Paul makes it very clear to the people of Corinth that they themselves are the temples of God; the "buildings" in which the Holy Spirit of God

dwells. Each one of us, through the grace of God, is himself or herself, a "house of the Lord", with Jesus Christ as the foundation. St. Paul cautions us to carefully build upon the foundation. Yet how careful are we? Do we allow the mediocre building materials of a lost society to become part of the structure of our temples? Do we carefully scrutinize the "bricks" that will become embedded in our temple walls, making sure that they are solid and strong and holy? Perhaps a chat with a local mason could shed some light on the dangers of using subpar materials to build a structure, even though the foundation may be perfect. Have we honored our perfect foundation by using only the best materials with which to build our temples? Perhaps something to ponder.

And once again, in the gospel, the meeting place of God and Man, becomes the focal point. For the moneychangers, it was the value of the coin that blinded them. Profit interfered with the sacredness of that place. The temple had been built as a holy place, a place where people would fall to their knees before their God...to praise Him, to thank Him, to seek His mercy and to ask for His help. The temple was a holy place where God could come to His people, to listen to their prayers, to forgive them, to guide them and to love them. Have we turned our temples into something other than that? We may not be distracted by selling oxen and sheep and doves; but have we lost sight of our true purpose here on earth because we are distracted by the things of this world? A good, long, look within will provide the answers.

So now what? Perhaps today, knowing that we are unconditionally loved by God, we invite Jesus to spill our coins, and turn over our tables, so that with His love and mercy, we can return our "temples" to their true purpose... to know God...to love God, to serve God, and to one day be with Him forever in Heaven.







Book of the Names of the Dead






Women's Group...






A Message from Monsignor Walden...

Today's Mass is not what would be compassionate otherwise, but because the date is November 9th, we celebrate the dedication of the Basilica of St. John Lateran in Rome. This basilica is the first church building allowed by the reigning King in Rome. Constantine was the first emperor to become a Christian and St. John Lateran was given by his family (Laterano) in the year 313. It is the diocesan church for the Bishop of Rome, which the pope is in addition to being the head of the church around the world. When I went to Rome over thirty years ago, I visited that church as well as St. Peter's Basilica.

Our parish church right here in Center Moriches is a gift we have to come together to pray, celebrate, and encounter God Himself in the Sacraments. It is also a building where we can just come and pray privately in Jesus' presence in the Eucharist. In addition, we have the Blessed Sacrament Chapel in the Convent, where every weekday we can come and pray until 7:00 PM Monday through Friday. The first reading for Mass today is from Ezekiel 47:1-2, 8-9,12 where a beautiful image of what flows out of God's temple will do. The water flowing out makes a great stream for fish, plants, and all people. The water is so powerful that the trees along its banks yield fruit every month, not just once a year. Once the water flows into the ocean, then its fresh water overpowers the salt in the sea.

That is an incredible picture, but what flows out of our parish Church right here on Ocean Avenue is you and me. We are the ones who are nourished, motivated, and empowered to make a powerful, loving difference in the lives of all we touch with our love, goodness, generosity, mercy, concern, words, and love everyday. None of us is perfect, but with the love of God and His presence in our minds and hearts, needs are met with joy; and God's love and mercy energizes and humbles us to always seek reconciliation and strengthening words with those whose lives we touch everyday through simple gestures, kind words, and our

presence. Through wonder of God's mercy and wisdom, we enrich each



other, thereby putting flesh and bones on the Body of Christ, the Church in the World. That simple exercise we use with children is spelling the word CHURCH by saying, C H, then pointing to each other saving YOU ARE, C, H. Yes, our wonderful church building is a powerful resource for all us and all whose lives we touch everyday of our lives.

When I was an altar boy back in the 1950s we began Mass by kneeling and responding to the priests words as we prayed together:

Priest:

Introibo ad altare Dei.

Translation: I will go unto the altar of God.

Altar Boys:

Ad Deum qui laetificat juventutem meam.

Translation: Unto God who gives joy to my youth.

I conclude with the Blessed Virgin Mary's prayer of joy.

My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, my spirit rejoices in God my Savior for he has looked with favor on his lowly servant. From this day all generations will call me blessed:

the Almighty has done great things for me, and holy is his Name.

He has mercy on those who fear him in every generation.

He has shown the strength of his arm, he has scattered the proud in their conceit. He has cast down the mighty from their thrones, and has lifted up the lowly. He has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent away empty. He has come to the help of his servant Israel for he remembered his promise of mercy, the promise he made to our fathers,

to Abraham and his children forever.


May the grace of the Jubilee reawaken in us, *Pilgrims of Hope*, a yearning for the treasures of heaven.


May that same grace spread the joy and peace of our Redeemer throughout the earth.
