FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Always Looking for Another

Are you the One?

Dear Parish Family:

A number of years ago God blessed me with a pretty good friend. It has never been a journey of faith, necessarily. Our paths have crossed and re-crossed over the years for a lot of reasons. This friend is Catholic in name (and I don't mean that disrespectfully) and trying real hard to embrace the Catholic faith on a deeper level.

Over the past few encounters our conversations have been become more spiritual, more religious. It is nice to see. However, it challenges me to be more of aware of where I am on this journey of faith and the work I need to do. My friend asked me about my own Catholic faith. "Why are you part of the Catholic Church?" was the question posed. Jesus established it, I responded.

As we continued our conversation, my friend spoke about the struggle he had with accepting Jesus of Nazareth as the Messiah, as the Savior. I can often hear that fear of taking a risk, the concern if he is wrong, the worry about making that leap of faith in my friend's words and emotions.



I pray for my friend every day. Considering this friendship, I can hear my friend's voice a little in the person of John the Baptist at the beginning of this Sunday's Gospel. John sends followers to Jesus with a simple question, "Are you the one who is to come, or should we look for another?" (Matthew 12:3). I feel like my friend is at the place of that question. To be honest, as I look at my own life and how I live it, I guess at times I'm not too far away from that stage either. Maybe the same for you?

I recommended a book to my friend that was shared with me years ago by a spiritual director. Written by Sister Ruth Burrows, OCD, *To Believe in Jesus* sort of set me straight when I first read it years ago. I hope you will keep reading as I share two reflections. First, "As Christians, Jesus must be our addiction. Is he?" (p. vii) This is a good Advent question. Is Jesus your addiction? Is it He who you long for before anyone or anything else? Do we really want Him? Or do we pay lip-service to such claims while our lifestyle, time in prayer, desire to care for the poor and vulnerable fail to match our words?



Second, she writes, "For many, venture to say most, there would be no significant difference in their religious attitude if the incarnation had not taken place...We have formed our own ideas of what God wants us to be like and are earnestly striving for self-perfection.

We are really reversing roles. We are trying to be God in making him better off through what we give him. We want to make him a present of our own perfect selves. This has nothing to do with holiness. Only Jesus is holy, the only one pleasing to his father. Only allowing him to communicate his holiness to us can we be pleasing to God (17)."

For you and me, does the Incarnation matter? Does God breaking into world make a difference in how I live my life or how I face the darkness of the world or the struggles of my own brokenness? Am I allowing Jesus to communicate his holiness to me?

It is the Third Week of Advent. We might come to these days—especially after reading these words I shared—that we're not really where we need to be at this point. No one of us is probably where we need to be. It reads like John the Baptist wasn't quiet there yet either in the midst of a difficult and dark time in his own life. So how does Jesus respond? He tells John's followers to look around and see all that Jesus Christ has done in the time. I think that is probably some good advice for each one of us, especially in those moments of darkness or imprisonment or despair or even everyday life when we take Jesus for granted. Let's take a look around. Let's take some time to see—even each day—the ways the "inbreaking of God" is impacting each one of our lives.

My friend and I presently read this book about Jesus together. I think it is helping my friend. I know it is helping me to re-orient the way we live our lives each day. My friend's excitement and enthusiasm and wonder is inspiring me with a little more of the Christmas spirit. I hope these final weeks of Advent can do the same for each of us.

Please say a prayer for me. Please say a prayer for my friend, too.

This year, because of the day Christmas falls, we will not have one extended period of Reconciliation on the Monday before Christmas. Rather, we will offer extended times on the following dates:

Monday, December 23—Confession end at 2 p.m. (or later, if necessary) after the 12 Noon Mass.

ADVENT AND THE NEW LITURGICAL YEAR

Our new liturgical year has begun. Let's review the following:



• As we have done in the past, each week we will offer a different blessing of Church for you (and/or your family to pray. Please make use of these blessings

• We have available editions of *Sunday's Word 2020*. You can pick them up and take them with you. A free will offering of \$5.00 is requested but not required. You can place your offering in one of the Poor Boxes. These books contain all of the Sunday readings as well as the psalm and antiphons for Daily Mass. They can picked up in the Vestry or in the Parish Office. (If we are out of them as you read this, more are on the way.) Ideally, please read the Scriptures before coming to Mass and open your ears and hearts while at Mass to hear God's Word.

• During the Sunday Masses of Advent, we will use the Entrance Antiphon from the *Roman Missal*. The *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* encourages the use of the antiphon each week. It's purpose - and that of the Entrance Hymn—is to "open the celebration, foster the unity of those gathered, introduce their thoughts to the mystery of the liturgical time or festivity and accompany the procession of the Priest and ministers" (47). We hope to continue this practice in other seasons as well.

• We will use a new music setting for Advent and Christmas—Mass of Our Lady. It will be familiar to you. Pay attention the ways our music changes in this liturgical season. You'll hear some different sounds, some quieter ones, as we prepare for the joyous season of Christmas!

• During the season of Advent (and the season of Lent), the Gloria is not said or sung. It creates a sense of anticipation. Store up your fervor for the Vigil of Christmas or Christmas Day.

• Look for some opportunities to grow deeper in the dark and quiet times of Advent. Take some quiet time in the Church or Seton Chapel, attend Handel's Messiah, pray for those we will serve in these holidays, come early to Mass or pray quietly in Our Lady's Chapel after Mass or join a ministry or prayer group and so much more. Do not do these things to "do" things. Rather, enter them hoping to create a deeper space for Christ to dwell.

3. List the obstacles God encountered in bringing Jesus into the world. Is anything obstacle-free? How can good come out of obstruction? John Shea made a statement about Joseph's hesitancy to take Mary into his home. Discuss his statement: "This foreshadows the tension of all who will be drawn to Jesus. Is he a scandal to be rejected, or a manifestation of the Spirit to be welcomed?" (Shea, 45) "When Joseph awoke ..." Did Joseph wake up in more than one way?
