



As a Christian tradition, the wreath holds the four Advent candles. The candles represent Jesus coming as the light in darkness. One candle is lit each Sunday until all four candles are lit. As Christmas draws nearer, each candle brings a little more light into the darkness. Sometimes a white candle is lit on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day to symbolize

that Jesus is with us. This can be referred to as the "Christ candle."

Each of the candles lit before Christmas represent an aspect of preparation during the season of Advent <u>The First Week of Advent Represents</u>: **Hope** Candle Name: the *Prophecy Candle*

Candle Color: Purple

Purple is the primary color associated with Advent. Within the Catholic Church it symbolizes penance, preparation, and sacrifice. During the first week of Advent we remember the Old Testament prophets who foretold of Jesus' coming with hope and anticipation.

The Second Week of Advent Represents: Peace and Preparation Candle Name: the Bethlehem Candle

Candle Color: Purple

During this second week of Advent, we reflect on our lives and work on becoming better-versions-of-ourselves in preparation for Jesus' coming. We remember the journey Joseph and Mary took from Nazareth to Bethlehem.

The Third Week of Advent Represents: Joy Candle Name: the Shepherd's Candle

Candle Color: Pink

This third candle is pink and symbolizes rejoicing. During the third week of Advent we are filled with joy for the near arrival of Jesus on Christmas day. This Sunday is often called "Gaudete Sunday" as we reflect on the joy the shepherd's felt at the birth of Jesus.

The Fourth Week of Advent Represents: Love Candle Name: the Angel's Candle

Candle Color: Purple

During this final week of Advent we rejoice in the endless love that God has for us, which is made apparent in the birth of his Son. We reflect on the good news of God's love brought to us from the angel Gabriel.

Lighting Your Advent Wreath During the Week

Each day during the Fourth week of Advent, at the evening meal (or any time), light the first and second purple candles and the pink candle. The following prayers accompany the lighting of the candles.

All make the sign of the cross: **In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen**. Someone at table reads the Scripture assigned to the liturgy of the day (one or both of the readings may be used).

Go to www.usccb.org to find the readings of the day. Then the Leader continues:

Leader: Lift up your hearts.

All respond: We lift them up to the Lord.

The Leader prays: God, the Father of mercies, you willed your Son to take flesh, in order to give life back to us. Bless these your gifts with which we are about to nourish our bodies, so that, receiving new strength, we may wait in watchfulness for the glorious coming of Christ. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

After the meal, the Leader says: Let us live soberly, justly, and devoutly in this world as we wait in joyful hope for the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ. All respond: For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.

Did you know...



Let's pick up where we left off from the November 27th bulletin.

A generous parishioner, Joseph McAleenan placed the winning bid at an auction for the recently vacated Center Moriches public school on the north east corner of Brookfield Avenue & Main Street in 1925. Mr. McAleenan transferred that over to Fr. John Donlon, who was the Pastor of St. John's at that time. This property transfer, on Nov. 7, 1925 was the beginning of the community's first parochial school. This picturesque wood framed 4 class-room structure was erected in 1896.

The following was taken from Diamond Jubilee Celebration of 1973:

"On September 2, 1926, in a downpour of rain, Sister Mary Nazaretta Granahan, Assistant Mother, accompanied to Center Moriches the three Sisters assigned to the new mission on Long Island – Sister Miriam Patricia McGinty, superior and principal, Sister Rita Carmel Sheehan and Sister Marie Regina Baker. Eleven days, St. John's School opened with 64 children, grades 1 to 5; but before the first school year had ended, the number of students had increased by one hundred.

Father Donlon was transferred the following year, and was replaced by Father Thomas Scanlon. Then in January of 1928 Sister Miriam Bernard McNally came to St. John's, where she would hold the office of Superior, from 1928 until 1934; would return again in 1935 for another six year period, and again in 1943 for two years.

Sister Miriam Bernard's kindness to the poor became a legend in Center Moriches. There was for instance, a Thanksgiving Day when, as the Sisters were about to sit down to a festive dinner, Sister Miriam Bernard returned from a visit to a sick woman of the parish. "The mother is going to die soon and there are seven children in the house without a bite to eat" she explained, as she absent mindedly took the entire dinner, tablecloth and all, from the table and packed it up to bring to the stricken family. This kind of ongoing charity, repeated in varying patterns, made the Sisters respected and loved in the Center Moriches community.




