# A message from our Pastor, Fr. Patrick...

First Sunday of Advent A Season of Hope and New Beginnings

This weekend we begin a new liturgical season. Advent. Advent offers us another opportunity to draw closer to Jesus through prayer and reflection and through the reading of the Scriptures. The Scriptures that we hear being proclaimed at the masses during the next four weeks invite us to become more attentive and aware of the presence of the Lord in our lives. The Scriptures remind us of the importance of God and how we can prepare ourselves for the Day of Judgment when we stand before the Lord.

The word Advent means coming. Advent invites us to allow Jesus to come more fully into our lives. This season invites us in all of its simplicity to open

our hearts to receive Him with great joy and anticipation, knowing that He is the fulfillment of all of our hopes and longings! Advent is another opportunity to grow in our personal relationship with Jesus. It is a time for us to be restored in our hope as we await the fullness of God's Kingdom. It is an opportunity for us to prepare our lives for the next life, knowing of God's great promise for us and His

great desire to be one with us forever in heaven.

Advent is a time for spiritual renewal and growth. It is a time to grow in our awareness and appreciation of the Lord; to rediscover for ourselves the complete love that God has for humanity fully revealed in Jesus; to open our hearts a little more towards the one who is among us to fill us with His joy and wonder. It is a time to awaken our hearts to the one who can refresh our souls and restore us to wholeness. It is a time to be at peace with ourselves knowing of the greatness and the power of God in our lives; to know of the urgency that exists in preparing ourselves for the Day of Judgment.

For me, Advent is one of my favorite seasons because it precedes Christmas. Advent leads us into the great Christmas Feast. Before Jesus was born, the Jewish people were anxiously awaiting the promise of the coming savior. This longing was the first Advent. No Christmas, no Jesus! No Jesus, no salvation! Jesus would not have entered the world, and we would still be living in complete darkness. If



Jesus did not enter the world, we would not be saved. This is why we need Advent because Advent reminds us of and prepares us to celebrate Christmas with greater meaning and understanding of the importance of why Jesus came to live among us. Advent gets us thinking again. It reminds us of the urgency that exists in preparing for a new Christmas season that can help change the way in which we approach life more joyfully in the Lord. Advent changes our perspective on life with Christmas in sight. It changes the way in which we relate to Christ in our service and love for one another, if we take this season seriously.

The truth is our lives are one long season of Advent because we never know the day nor the hour when the Son of Man will come again to restore all

things back to new. We are always anticipating the return of our Lord who will gather the elect, all of God's faithful, into the Kingdom of Heaven. Even though we do not know the day nor the hour when all things will be restored back to new, what we do know is that this day will come upon us unexpectedly and we only have this life of ours to account for. Even if the second coming occurs after our time here

on earth, we only have this life to get ready for eternity. Advent reminds us that Christmas and eternity are right around the corner and the importance of preparing ourselves for these two great feasts!

As we enter this new season of Advent, let's not allow the busyness and the craziness of the holiday season to distract us or overshadow the purpose behind this season. Let us rejoice again in the Lord and surrender more to God. Let us take this season of Advent more seriously so we can encounter the Lord more fully. He is coming into our lives each day to bring us His peace and joy! Let us allow the candles we light on the Advent wreath to remind us just how close and near Jesus is to us. He lights up the pathway to eternity. Our future depends on the way in which we are living our lives at this moment. We are the ones in control of our final destiny, no one else. Advent allows us to do just this, to reconnect with the Lord; to deepen our relationship with God, and to see the joy and wonder that is found in Jesus!





The 2025 Sunday's Word books have arrived!

Sunday's Word is for use in conjunction with a hymnal and service book or other music resource, and is intended for those who wish to pre-read the scriptures of the day as a preparation for the celebration, who have difficulty hearing, or who feel the need to read the text as it is proclaimed for full comprehension. The Eucharistic Prayers



are also included. It contains the assembly's responsorial psalm refrain for each Sunday and major feast. Sunday's Word also contains the Order of Mass.

The weekday section includes the entrance antiphon, Psalm response, gospel verse, and communion antiphon for all feasts, memorials, and weekdays of the year. In addition, the Order of Mass texts (including both the Nicene Creed and the Apostle's Creed) are printed on the inside front cover for convenience.







# A Message from Msgr. Walden...

"You better watch out, You better not cry, Better not pout, I'm telling you why: Santa Claus is comin' to town." These lyrics were written in 1934 and simply expressed the innocent joy of Christmas for children. Well, Santa Claus did come to town (New York City) at the end of the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Christmas parade this past Thursday. That was immediately followed by Black Friday (this past day supposedly Christmas Friday), the shopping brings the merchants into the black financially. With all the talk about whether or not we are now a Christian nation, Christmas is certainly in the forefront of everyone's mind, but not necessarily for spiritual reasons.

It is always good to go back to our roots and see how traditions and celebrations have come about. During these four Sundays of Advent, the first readings at Mass will come from a different prophet each week (Jeremiah, Baruch, Zephaniah, and Micah), all expressing human hope for the ultimate meaning of life. Left to ourselves as human beings, we can so easily become lost, confused, self centered, and self protective. From the very beginning of creation, we as human beings fell into the trap of thinking we know better than God and don't need God. In spite of the original sin committed by Adam and Eve, and the infinitely countless sins committed by us as human beings since then, God has not given up in His love for us and His desire to have us be part of His life here and forever in heaven. Advent is a simple season and time to be uplifted, inspired, and renewed by the deepest longings every human being has, the longing to live in peace and joy forever in heaven.

The spirit of Christmas is a spirit of generosity, giving, and joy. Ultimately, it opens our minds and hearts to be generous to one another as God is to us. Our most precious gifts are not wrapped up in a box, but our love, joy, mercy, patience, and sincerity. Without these simple virtues that are at the foundation of true, pure love, every Friday is Black Friday, every Saturday is Black Saturday, every Sunday is Black Sunday, every Monday is Black Monday, every Tuesday is Black Tuesday, every Wednesday is Black Wednesday, every Thursday is Black Thursday, because the love we so wonderfully have is not lived. Thank God all that changed with Good Friday and Easter Sunday. The power of God's love is far beyond what we could ever conceive left to ourselves. At Christmas we celebrate the wonder and



humility of God's love as He came into our world in Jesus just as you and I, precious and in need of parental love. His life is mirrored so beautifully in our parents. Thank you mom and dad for the gift of life and for the gift of your love.

I invite you to take some time during these weeks before Christmas to make a visit to our chapel in the convent on Monday through Friday 3:00 PM to 7:00 PM where the Blessed Sacrament, Jesus in the Eucharist, is on our altar for quiet prayer and reflection. Bring a bible and read the opening chapters of the Gospels from Matthew and Luke (chapters 1 and 2 in both). Santa Claus is comin' to town was long ago preceded by what the angels proclaimed to the Shepherds when Jesus was born:

"Now there were shepherds in that region living in the fields and keeping the night watch over their flock. The angel of the Lord appeared to them and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were struck with great fear. The angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid; for behold, I proclaim to you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For today in the city of David a savior has been born for you who is Messiah and Lord. And this will be a sign for you: you will find an infant wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger.' And suddenly there was a multitude of the heavenly host with the angel, praising God and saying: 'Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests.' When the angels went away from them to heaven, the shepherds said to one another, 'Let us go, then, to Bethlehem to see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us.' So they went in haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the infant lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known the message that had been told them about this child. All who heard it were amazed by what had been told them by the shepherds. And Mary kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart. Then the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, just as it had been told to them. (Luke 2:8-20)

Para obtener más información sobre la Carta para la Protección de Niños y Jóvenes, visite drvc.org. As a Christian tradition, the wreath holds the four Advent candles. The candles represent Jesus coming as the light in darkness. One candle is lit each Sunday until all four candles are lit. As Christmas draws nearer, each candle brings a little more light into the darkness. Sometimes a white candle is lit on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day to symbolize that Jesus is with us. This can be referred to as the "Christ candle."

Each of the candles lit before Christmas represent an aspect of preparation during the season of Advent.

### The First Week of Advent Represents: Hope

Candle Name: the Prophecy Candle Candle Color: Purple

Purple is the primary color associated with Advent. Within the Catholic Church, it symbolizes penance, preparation, and sacrifice. During the first week of Advent, we remember the Old Testament prophets who foretold of Jesus' coming with hope and anticipation.

### The Second Week of Advent Represents: Peace and Preparation

### Candle Name: the Bethlehem Candle Candle Color: Purple

During this second week of Advent, we reflect on our lives and work on becoming better-versions-ofourselves in preparation for Jesus' coming. We remember the journey Joseph and Mary took from Nazareth to Bethlehem.

### The Third Week of Advent Represents: Joy

Candle Name: the Shepherd's Candle Candle Color: Pink

This third candle is pink and symbolizes rejoicing. During the third week of Advent we are filled with joy for the near arrival of Jesus on Christmas day. This Sunday is often called "Gaudete Sunday" as we reflect on the joy the shepherd's felt at the birth of Jesus.

### The Fourth Week of Advent Represents: Love

Candle Name: *the Angel's Candle* Candle Color: Purple

During this final week of Advent we rejoice in the endless love that God has for us, which is made apparent in the birth of his Son. We reflect on the good news of God's love brought to us from the angel Gabriel.

### Lighting Your Advent Wreath During the Week

Each day during the Fourth week of Advent, at the evening meal (or any time), light the first and second purple candles and the pink candle. The following prayers accompany the lighting of the candles. All make the sign of the cross: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen. Someone at table reads the Scripture assigned to the liturgy of the day (one or both of the readings may be used). Go to www.usccb.org to find the readings of the day. Then the Leader continues:

#### Leader: Lift up your hearts.

All respond: We lift them up to the Lord.

The Leader prays: God, the Father of mercies, you willed your Son to take flesh, in order to give life back to us. Bless these your gifts with which we are about to nourish our bodies, so that, receiving new strength, we may wait in watchfulness for the glorious coming of Christ. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen. After the meal, the Leader says: Let us live soberly, justly, and devoutly in this world as we wait in joyful hope for the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ.

All respond: For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.
