

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK **HOMELESS, but not HOPELESS**

Dear Parish Family:

One of the things I regret most about being the Pastor here is the lack of time for me to join with our Street Ministry. Each week, they leave the comforts of SJE and go out to minister to poor and vulnerable inside and outside of our community. We minister on average to about 50 to 60 people a night. (See page 12 for more information.) When I can be out with them-even if it's for just a small amount of time-I become ever more aware of the presence of God in our midst.



Today you likely received this bulletin from a school auditorium—either our own or at Center Moriches High School. It's not our regular home. In some ways, because of the tragic events of May 19th, we find ourselves sort of homeless. We gather for prayer

in Seton Chapel now and in the gym on the weekends. We have less space which requires adjustments for so many volunteers and ministries. We are forced to use resources-financial and otherwise-in ways we did not plan. There is a pressure involved in trying to restore our home for prayer and worship. Being without a home is tough.

Yet, over the past seven months and six days (who's counting?) we are not hopeless. Mere words cannot begin to express the gratitude for so many ways this parish and local community have come together. From those who are helping in the Town of Brookhaven and the Diocese of Rockville Centre to the outpouring of support from local religious congregations and businesses, to the generosity of so many in these challenging times. Within our community, the helping hands of the students of OLQA and Youth Ministry who set up our worship space, the many people who have gone out of their way for a kind word or an offering of encouragement to a community that has wrapped itself in prayer for the restoration of the church building. Homeless, maybe. Hopeless, not a chance.

As you read this, perhaps you find yourself a little "homeless" in one part of your life or another. Maybe there's a place you're not grounded or feeling like you do not belong. It might even be in your own relationship with our Lord and the Church. I hope your joining with us today is one step in bringing you to a stronger foundation. Like those saints and angels who minister in our Street Ministry (you can be one of them!), in a different way, I hope you will allow us to welcome you, to minister to you, to support you, to challenge you, to love you.

Read through the pages of this bulletin (not during Mass :)), visit our website, check out our Facebook page and consider some ways you might make SJE your home. It might be in joining the over 500 volunteers who serve here or one of the over 50 ministries. Perhaps it will be to come and pray quietly in Seton Chapel or commit to worship with us each Sunday. Maybe you'll be courageous enough to reach out and allow us to help you in some way. Or maybe you still need a little time. We're willing to meet you where you are.

The story of Christ breaking into the world has a strong "homeless" theme to it, no? Mary and Joseph can't find a place to stay. They journey and journey until they settle for a place. As you journey here, perhaps, a little lost, feeling a bit unwelcome in one place or another, homeless in a sense, I hope you will do more than settle here for a day. Starting today, allow the light of Christ that breaks into the world to brighten up your dark spaces. In that encounter, consider being a light through the many ways we reach out in prayer and service to the margins.

In a few weeks, we'll gather for Epiphany. We remember these astrologers or wise men or kings moving in darkness to find the presence of God. Homeless, too, they found the light of a star and then found the Light of the World. May the same be true for you in these days. Merry Christmas!

SETON CHAPEL

In August, we formally opened our newly renovated Seton Chapel. Because of the damage from the fire on May 19th, the convent became the place for Daily Mass. This summer, we did some extensive renovations in the convent that created a new meeting room and a large space for prayer. Daily Mass and confessions take place in Seton Chapel as does Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and our daily rosaries. Seton Chapel open at 6:30 a.m. and closes at approximately 7 p.m. In the early morning and at night, you may park in the school parking lot. During the day we ask that you park on St. John Place. Come and say a prayer in this beautiful space.



REBUILD + REPAIR + RESTORE

As you may know, on Friday, May 19, 2017, the interior of our Church building was destroyed by fire and smoke. Since then, with the help of our insurance company, contractors and the local community, we have undertaken the enormous work of restoration. As our demolition work proceeded, the damages to the Church were more extensive than anticipated. This delayed the beginning of our restoration work. In November, we started our restoration work with new HVAC equipment and now new fire and sprinkler systems. This week, we also began necessary demolition work that will allow for a new lift that will enable those who are disable to enter the sanctuary.

• You make a formal commitment to this community of faith....basically saying, "I want to belong..."


• This parish makes a formal commitment to you, basically saying, "We want to be here for you!"

First, contact the Parish Office at 631.878.0009 or via e-mail at rectory@sjecm.org to meet with one of our parish priests or deacon. Both parents will need to attend this meeting.

Second, you will attend a Baptismal Preparation Class led by our parish staff. You will sign up for this class at the meeting with one of our parish's priests or deacon.

Third, Baptisms are generally celebrated in English on the 1st, 3rd and 4th Sundays and in Spanish on the 2nd Sunday of each month. You will select this date at your initial meeting.

Well we're not looking to plan that any time soon, but we can always use help with our Ministry of Consolation!!! This ministry reaches out in a variety of ways to those who have recently faced the death of someone they love. The wonderful women and men who offer their time in this ministry—as well as our office staff—do a wonderful job in ministering to those in need.

We are in need of more help as we seek to grow the Ministry of Consolation. We are in need of parishioners to come forward as:

Liturgical Ministers (Greeters, Servers, Extraordinary Ministers and Readers),

Cakebakers (willing to make a small dessert for a family who has suffered a loss),

Worship Aid Makers (able to update our Mass program for each funeral, involves light computer and possibly copier use),

Organizers (able to assign tasks to those who have offered their time), and

Companions (meeting with a family who has suffered a loss to assist with choosing readings, hymns, etc. and being present on the day of the funeral)

PRAYING FOR AND MINISTERING TO THE SICK

But when someone is sick, we at times think: "let's call for the priest to come"; "no, then he will bring bad luck, let's not call him", or "he will scare the sick person". Why do we think this? Because the idea is floating about that the undertakers arrive after the priest. And this is not true. The priest comes to help the sick or elderly person; that is why the priest's visit to the sick is so important; we ought to call the priest to the sick person's side and say: "come, give him the anointing, bless him".

Those who are seriously ill or facing surgery, as well as those in danger of death, should receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. Please call the Parish Office and ask for one of our priests.

If you or a family member are ill and wish to receive Holy Communion, please contact the parish office. One of our parish priests will come visit you and an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Community will then visit each week.
