FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Working Through Darkness

FINDING CHRISTMAS

Dear Parish Family:

Merry Christmas!

Truthfully, I am writing this a week and a half before Christmas because of the bulletin deadline!

Once a month, we have the privilege to celebrate Mass at IGHL (Independent Group Home Living Program). It is a simple celebration which takes place in the Cafeteria. Its simplicity, I believe, allows the sacred to shine even brighter. Each time I am able to pray there I am in awe of how God works and how God is revealed through so many people there. You may know about the work of IGHL and other agen-

cies like it. Their mission is to "to develop and implement innovative programs, services and supports for people with intellectual disabilities, so that they can realize their full potential, and become contributing members of their community."

Accompanied by our social work intern Joe Conklin, I journeyed for our Advent/Pre-Christmas Mass. Together, we listened to God's Word, shared the eucharist, and encouraged one another with a little bit of the spirit of Christmas. I also tried out my Christmas homily. (They had numerous suggestions about what I needed to do better. I hope their advice pays off!) After Mass—and even a few times during it—they shared their hope for Jesus' coming. Their concert is tomorrow and plans are being made with family members and friends. I heard all about it. It was refreshing to hear.

Maybe you're like me? Christmas can be a challenge some times, especially over the past few years. Caught up in finding the darkness of winter tough or the

darkness of some aspect of my life overwhelming, or the craziness of these days, it can be hard to find the real Christmas spirit. I think especially of those mourning the loss of someone they love this Christmas or who are celebrating Christmas in a place or situation – physical or spiritual—they did not expect to find themselves. It is not always "the most wonderful time of the year".

The excitement and the awareness of the coming of Christ in those I prayed with today woke me up. (It might have been our singing at Mass too. I was told I was probably not good

enough to be in the Christmas concert:).) I guess sometimes I make it all too complicated. We celebrate Christmas to remember that the Light of Christ shatters the darkness of our lives. A baby breaking in is about much more than manager. It is about a change in life's meaning for "today a Savior has been born to us", especially if things are pretty tough for you or me. My friends at IGHL get it. By their example they told me, "Keep it simple, Fr. John. Jesus enters the world for you and me. We're going to be OK."

I hope you can come through this Christmas enlightened and excited. For God sent his only Son for you! He loves us so much that he would have it no other way. Now, it is up to you and to me to respond! Do we stay in the darkness or the apathy or the lack of caring or the selfishness? I hope not. Let love God and show that by loving our neighbor. Let's follow the message of Jesus, "As I have done, so you must also do" (John 13:15). Please take some time with this bulletin. There is a lot here for you to consider and possibly to share. Many have worked on this so you might consider the ways God is inviting you to respond.

I hope you know you have a place here at SJE! We are happy you are praying with us. So is Jesus!




Street Ministry—Clothes Sorting

Before you read about us, it is important to say that this ministry works very hard but you would never know it because the ladies in this group are always laughing! We need more hands- and you men out there- you are needed too!

The donations crew works behind the scenes in the Red Barn several days a week generally during the day though we get together at night some times too. Some volunteers come every week, some once in a while, and all come whenever they can. Although they usually meet together as a group on Thursdays from 1-3, Friday mornings, and another day as available, many also come individually whenever they have free time. The donation volunteers do several different activities including sorting through donation bags, folding and labeling clothing items, putting together wash and shave kits, and filling crates that are taken out every Thursday night by other volunteers. Throughout the year they also help collect items for outside organizations (like summer clothes for children sponsored to go to summer camp or dresses for young girls going to a formal dance), organize the advent tree donations, create Christmas gift bags for local women's and men's shelters and even collect damaged blankets for animal shelters.


During the holy season of Advent most of us are very busy with Christmas gifts, decorating, backing and myriad other tasks. For some it is also a period of fasting from food and/or drink. This is all well and good, but have we considered the ascetical aspects of preparation as Jesus did in his life? The critics of Jesus failed to see how his asceticism went far beyond food and drink. It included the very things that we should be doing and for the most part you are doing: things like forgiving wrongs, going the extra mile, donating food, visiting the homebound, helping those who are ill.

Jesus did not worry about his choice of friends. He chose fishermen to be his leaders, he associated with all kinds of sinners to show them how they can change. His breadth of relationships was endless. How about us? Do our spiritual practices flow from a loving heart? Does our fasting include things like fasting from gossip, from putting people down, from self-rightness? Are we trying to make clones of ourselves or do we try to expand our relationships? I can't imagine life if we were imagine same! However, I can 1ife if we a11 cared for the one another in a loving manner.

I can remember as a child really trying to be good because we were getting ready for the Birth of Christ. I'm sure that parents today are still doing that, but it is more important to SHOW the young (and the not -so-young) how to be more conscious of how Jesus would want us to be.

What will Senior Ministry be offering after Christmas? We will still have our "balancing" practice of T'ai Che, Cha, Sophia's Circle (a book study to help us as we age), Sunday Scripture preparation; and a new offer by one of our parishioners who is both a retired nurse and a cancer survivor, a Support Group for those who are cancer sufferers, cancer survivors, and caregivers; and a Bereavement Support Group. 12 p.m. Mass. We are



YOU GO TO FUNERALS?? WHO WANTS TO DO THAT??

WE DO. (Well...you know what we mean!) The Ministry of Consolation assists families at the death of a loved one. One of our members reaches out to the family to become their <u>contact and companion</u> at the funeral. She/ he assists them in the preparation for the funeral mass by meeting with the family to describe what to expect on the day of the funeral. We may help select the readings for the mass, suggesting scripture readings that are appropriate to the life of the deceased. The hymns for the funeral mass are also selected. This companion remains in contact for any questions that may arise. This is one way to get involved but there are others because...

...This funeral mass information is sent to a <u>booklet maker</u> (who can work from home) who prepares the beautiful worship aid that the congregation uses during the funeral. The companion attends the vigil or wake to offer additional support. One of our <u>bakers</u> (who works from home and does not need to go to the funeral) provides something for the family which they are surprised and grateful to receive.

On the day of the funeral, several members (greeters) and the companion greet the family at the doors of the church, giving all in attendance the funeral booklet, and assisting them for the duration of the funeral until they leave the church.

Families are very grateful for our support during this time and we are so very grateful that we can be there to assist. It is an extremely rewarding ministry.

We would be delighted to have you become part of our ministry in whatever capacity interests you: baker, booklet maker, greeter and companion are each very rewarding when you see how much the families appreciate our support.


