Christmas 2022

To the People of God of the Diocese of Rockville Centre:

Merry Christmas to you and your families!

In union with our Holy Father Pope Francis, and in a non-judgmental spirit of mercy, humility and charity. I invite everyone who will be present at our Christmas Masses, or watching our Christmas Masses via the Catholic Faith Network or CBS, or not present at all: If your life has been far from the Catholic Mass and the Eucharist, I invite you with Pope Francis to return.

I invite you to experience the power and liberation of Christ's mercy and forgiveness in the Sacrament of Penance and to cross the bridge into the full practice of your Catholic Faith through a radical fidelity to the Sunday Mass and an ever-deepening love for the Holy Eucharist.

Perhaps you are not a Catholic and yet have some mysterious attraction to the Catholic Mass and the Eucharist.

You are not alone! Many saints – I think of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, the pioneering American Catholic educator and convert – had the same experience and were drawn to enter the Church through their intuitive experience of the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist in our parish churches! Be open to the Eucharistic movement of the Holy Spirit in your life!


Our celebration of Christmas 2022 occurs this year as every Catholic diocese, every Catholic parish, every Catholic hospital, university, and institution in the United States is engaged in an evangelizing Eucharistic Revival.

What do we mean by the phrase "Eucharistic Revival" and why is it so important for our celebration of Christmas?

What does a love for the Eucharist and an openness to being a 21st Century Eucharistic missionary have to do with our celebration of Christmas 2022?

Pope Francis points out the relationship between the Birth of Christ and the Holy Eucharist and the Mass. The very word Bethlehem means "house of Bread."

Pope Francis states: "Bethlehem is the turning point that alters the course of history. There God, in the house of bread, is born in a manger. It is as if he wanted to say: 'Here I am, as your food.' He does not take, but gives us to eat; he does not give us a mere thing, but his very self. In Bethlehem, we discover that God does not take life, but gives it. To us, who from birth are used to taking and eating, Jesus begins to say: 'Take and eat. This is my body.' (Matthew 26:26) The tiny body of the Child of Bethlehem speaks to us of a new way to live our lives: not by devouring and hoarding, but by sharing and giving. God makes himself small so that he can be our food. By feeding on him, the bread of life,



we can be reborn in love, and break the spiral of grasping and greed. From the 'house of bread,' Jesus brings us back home, so that we can become God's family, brothers and sisters to our neighbors. Standing before the manger, we understand that the food of life is not material riches but love, not gluttony but charity, not ostentation but simplicity. The Lord knows that we need to be fed daily. That is why he offered himself to us every day of his life: from the manger in Bethlehem to the Upper Room in Jerusalem. Today too, on the altar, he becomes bread broken for us; he knocks at our door, to enter and eat with us (cf. Revelation 3:20). At Christmas, we on earth receive Jesus, the bread from heaven. It is a bread that never grows stale, but enables us even now to have a foretaste of eternal life."

Eucharistic Revival, in the words of Pope St. John Paul II, is a rediscovery of "Eucharistic Amazement" and Eucharistic Devotion.

Eucharistic Revival means that we understand deeply that every Mass has a cosmic significance, and every Mass is celebrated on the Altar of the world - the Altar of Ukraine and every war torn and injustice-ridden area of our world.

Eucharistic Revival is an effective catechesis of the theology and spirituality of the Catholic Mass that moves the hearts, minds, souls and imaginations of the People of God.

Eucharistic Revival in our Catholic schools means the cultivation of a radical fidelity to the Sunday Catholic Mass on the part of our teachers, our staff and our families.

Eucharistic Revival is a rekindling of Pope Benedict XVI's insight that every period of Church reform and effective Catholic evangelization and mission throughout history can be traced to a rediscovery of the Real Presence of Jesus Christ, Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity in the Holy Eucharist.²

As we celebrate the birth of Christ and his rebirth in our hearts and families at Christmas, we pray for a renewal of our faith in Christ's Eucharistic presence.

We pray that each of us could be Divine Mercy instruments of bringing many, many people back to a full fidelity to the Eucharist and the Catholic Mass.

As we celebrate Christmas, we are being called to be intentional, compassionate, understanding and listening Eucharistic missionaries.

Merry Christmas to you and your families! May the love of the Christ child and the love of the Holy Family light your remaining steps on earth and light your path to Heaven and Eternal Life.





What We've Been up to...

- THANKS TO OUR VOLUNTEERS!: Thank you to our catechists, priests, volunteers and parish staff who've helped serve the more than 1,000 students in our Faith Formation program this past year! From going virtual to shifting back in-person, we are grateful for your flexibility and support! We're always looking for more volunteers to mentor our young people! - **REGISTRATION:** Our program begins when children enter 1st Grade. Registration for the 2023-24 Academic Year will run from June-August 2023—check the bulletin for future info!
- "FAMILY OF FAITH" (Grades 1-6) Our next sessions are January 3 & 5 at 5PM or 7PM in the Church. This program for our students in Grades 1-6 is a family catechesis model, where parents and students attend on-campus sessions once a month, then work at home with their children. This includes children preparing for First Communion, which is a two-year process.
- CONFIRMATION PREP (Grades 7 & Up): Our next sessions are January 9 (Level 8) and January 10 (Level 7) @ 7:15PM in the Church. Using a youth ministry model, our Confirmation prep is a two-and-a-half year process, typically beginning in 7th grade. We confirm in the Fall of 9th grade. We feature interactive, experiential learning and small group discussion.

St. John the Evangelist Parish

Did you know...

Let's pick up where we left off from the November 27th bulletin. A generous parishioner, Joseph McAleenan placed the winning bid at an auction for the recently vacated Center Moriches public school on

the north east corner of Brookfield Avenue & Main Street in 1925. Mr. McAleenan transferred that over to Fr. John Donlon, who was the Pastor of St. John's at that time. This property transfer, on Nov. 7, 1925 was the beginning of the community's first parochial school. This picturesque wood framed 4 classroom structure was erected in 1896.

The following was taken from Diamond Jubilee Celebration of 1973:

"On September 2, 1926, in a downpour of rain, Sister Mary Nazaretta Granahan, Assistant Mother, accompanied to Center Moriches the three Sisters assigned to the new mission on Long Island – Sister Miriam Patricia McGinty, superior and principal, Sister Rita Carmel Sheehan and Sister Marie Regina Baker. Eleven days, St. John's School opened with 64 children, grades 1 to 5; but before the first school year had ended, the number of students had increased by one hundred.


Father Donlon was transferred the following year, and was replaced by Father Thomas Scanlon. Then in January of 1928 Sister Miriam Bernard McNally came to St. John's, where she would hold the office of Superior, from 1928 until 1934; would return again in 1935 for another six year period,

and again in 1943 for two years.

Sister Miriam Bernard's kindness to the poor became a legend in Center Moriches. There was for instance, a Thanksgiving Day when, as the Sisters were about to sit down to a festive dinner, Sister Miriam Bernard returned from a visit to a sick woman of the parish. "The mother is going to die soon and there are seven children in the house without a bite to eat" she explained, as she absent mindedly took the entire dinner, tablecloth and all, from the table and packed it up to bring to the stricken family. This kind of ongoing charity, repeated in varying patterns, made the Sisters respected and loved in the Center Moriches community.

The school registration continued to increase, which forced Father Scanlon to secure in the public school bus for the parochial school children from several neighboring towns.

We'll interrupt the growth of our school and parish once more as our next installment will focus the origin and success of the Parish Thrift Shop.




