Night and Light

SCORE ONE FOR THE SHEPHERDS!

Dear Parish Family:



Merry Christmas! A word of great welcome for those who may be returning to church today, particularly after time away due the impact of COVID-19. You are most welcome here!

As I write this letter, we are just wrapping up the school Christmas Pageant. Each year, the school pageant at the Catholic School in Center Moriches brings great excitement and energy as our 8th graders take the lead in telling part of the story of Christmas. They're assisted by the other students in the Mission (our middle school academy) and some of the younger students as well....and even some other live guests as well.

Depending on the Mass you attend, as you listen to the Gospel, the shepherds play a big role in the Gospel of Luke. There is some discussion about the role of the shepherds. Some say they would have been in the "lower classes" of the time and looked down upon. Others say the role of shepherd was always significant for the Jewish people in the Old Testament (think David, the psalms and others). I sort of find both descriptions encouraging. God works through those unlikely characters to tell great messages. He relies on those who seek to care for others. Doesn't this sound a little like you and me? Maybe Christmas is a good time to remember our role?

At various times and moments have we become maybe a little too self-possessed, maybe a little too dependent on the things of this world? Many of our divisions and disagreements (pick your place: world, country, church, family, community, etc.) either come from a place or can lead us to a place of arrogance and self-righteousness. We can find ourselves filled with judgment, condemnation, and disdain for another with whom we disagree or struggle. This is not shepherd-like behavior! We're called to compassion, a compassion that inspires to reach out to the lost. We are never to give up or write off.

Then, listen to what the shepherds do! They are the ones greeted at night by the angels while guarding their flocks. They encounter angels. They go to Jesus, Mary and Joseph and tell them all they were told about Jesus! (See Luke 2:8-20). Doesn't this sound like our mission? Perhaps Christmas is a good reminder of this, too!

Here's how it might work. In the darker moments of our lives, we can so easily feel lost or tempted to fall into despair. Yet for so many in the spiritual life the darkness is where the Light of Christ shines brightest! We know those times of darkness. We might be in the midst of one of them right now. Don't despair....look around!

This leads to the second step. Pay attention to the angels! They may not appear with wings and halos like they did in the pageant. They are there, though. They might be a kind gesture of a friend or stranger. It

might be a feeling of reassurance and peace in the midst of a struggle. It might be that you walked through the door and entered the church for the first time in a while. The shepherds saw the signs of the angels and were able to take the next steps. So can you and I! (This bulletin is filled with many opportunities for each of us to take the next steps here at SJE!)

Finally, they go to Jesus! This, too, is our work. With everyone that we face in this life—good and bad, successes and struggles, fears and worries, victories and vices—we are called to bring it to Jesus. We do this through our prayer at Mass, our private prayer, our time for supportive conversation and counsel, our moments of outreach to others, and more.




We find Jesus in all of these places. He's waiting for us like he was for the shepherds. What are we waiting for? Like the shepherds, let's move in haste!



- **THANKS TO OUR VOLUNTEERS!:** Thank you to our catechists, priests, volunteers and parish staff who've helped serve the nearly 1,200 students in our Faith Formation program this past year! From going virtual to shifting back in-person, we are grateful for your flexibility and support! We're always looking for more volunteers to mentor our young people! - **REGISTRATION:** Our program begins when children enter 1st Grade. Registration for the 2022-23 Academic Year will run from June-August 2022—check the bulletin for future info!
- "FAMILY OF FAITH" (Grades 1-6) This program for our students in Grades 1-6 is a family catechesis model, where parents and students attend on-campus sessions once a month, then work at home with their children. This includes children preparing for First Communion, ,which is a two-year process.
- **CONFIRMATION PREP (Grades 7 & Up):** Using a youth ministry model, our Confirmation prep is a two and a half year process, typically beginning in 7th grade. We confirm in the Fall of 9th grade. We feature interactive, experiential learning and small group discussion.

Office of Family Ministry







LITURGICAL PRACTICES, GOOD HEALTH AND COMMON SENSE

As we come to celebrate Mass together each week during these winter days, it's a good time to review some common-sense liturgical practices and issues, to help everyone stay healthy and to care for one another.

MASKS ARE NOW REQUIRED IN ALL BUILDINGS, INCLUDING THE
CHURCH. I have requested this over teh past few weeks and it now mandatory. This week, we were advised by the Diocese of Rockville Centre that as we do not check for vaccination status, all who enter the church building and other buildings must wear a mask.

As I wrote last week, I respect and honor that there are many opinions about this. I do not wish to get into any debates or stoke anyone's ire. For me, particularly, I hear more of our parishioners becoming more anxious about the risk of sickness to themselves and others, I believe it offers another layer of protection and another layer of care and concern for the other. If it is going to even offer the tiniest amount of protection or comfort for another, is there a reason I would not do it? (I do understand there are medical reasons that some cannot wear a mask. If this is the case, please do your best to keep a safe social distance from others.)

Thank you for wearing a mask at Sunday Mass and at other parish liturgies and events.

- <u>Not feeling great</u>, <u>STAY HOME!</u> Please do not take any chances for your sake or anyone else's! Join us via social media or watch Mass on the Catholic Faith Network. The risks are too great for you and for others in these days. There is no obligation to attend Mass if you are not well; it is not a sin to miss Mass for this reason. (Also, there is no need to go to Confession if you miss Mass because you are sick.)
- Entering the Church: You must enter through the main fellowship doors with your mask on. Please sanitize your hands, take a worship aid and enter the church. Remember, you may leave your gifts for the offertory as you enter and as you leave.
- <u>Holy Communion</u>: Priests, deacons and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion wash and sanitize their hands before Mass begins and immediately before distribution of Holy Communion. When Extraordinary Ministers go to their station, they place the vessel on the small table near that station and sanitize their hands before distributing Holy Communion.
- Communion from the Chalice: The distribution of the Precious Blood remains suspended at this time.
- <u>Greeting of Peace:</u> The greeting of peace has been reinstituted. You do NOT need to shake hands to exchange the sign of peace if you are not comfortable.

What is the Community Meal Ministry?

We are amazing! The Community Meal is a monthly opportunity to share the gift of time, service, love



and food. The Community Meal Ministry invites EVERYONE to join us at our table once a month. Once a month we gather in the gymnasium of OLQA, each member bringing an item they prepared to the table. You can choose to prepare an item, stay to serve and clean up, or you can be a "drop and run"! We give a theme each month, such as Birthday Meal or Backyard BBQ, provide a sign up with suggestions and our volunteers sign up to bring food items, supplies or help. We ask hot items are brought in hot, and we'll keep it hot with sternos. We need everything – vegetables, salads, fruit, drinks, breads, hot entrees, starches, desserts-

and if you're not a confident cook then we need your hands to serve or drop supplies like napkins, plates, and flatware. There is a role for everyone! The goal is to provide a hot meal, prepared with love, served with kindness and a warm welcome to anyone that attends. CHRISTMAS LETTER FROM BISHOP BARRES

To the People of God of the Diocese of Rockville Centre:

On December 1, 2019, Our Holy Father Pope Francis issued Admirabile Signum, an Apostolic Letter On the Meaning and Importance of the Nativity Scene. It is a beautiful reflection that I draw on every Christmas season and one which I urge you to read and pray.

In it, the Holy Father reminds us that the simple act of arranging our Nativity set links us to the past, opens questions for the present, and orients the future. It is an act that has an existential impact.

Pope Francis says: "Setting up the Christmas creche in our homes helps us to relive the history of what took place in Bethlehem. Naturally, the Gospels remain our source for understanding and reflecting on the event. At the same time, its portrayal in the creche helps us to imagine the scene. It touches our hearts and makes us enter into salvation history as contemporaries of an event that is living and real in a broad gamut of historical and cultural contexts."

The beautiful scene of parents and grandparents setting up creches together with children and grandchildren is a powerful multi-dimensional experience of catechesis – the teaching and passing on of our Catholic faith and our belief in the Incarnation of Jesus Christ to the next generation.

Parents and grandparents have that wisdom of teaching children and grandchildren how to assemble and situate the creche, but at the same time, they also have the catechetical and relational sensitivity to let children and grandchildren make choices about where the shepherds, the sheep, the three kings are to be placed.

Children are encouraged to place the Holy Family – Mary, Joseph and the Prince of Peace – with their own hands into the center of the creche. How often children then enjoy, sometimes on their own and sometimes with brothers and sisters and family members, moving and interacting with the figurines. How often their biblical imaginations and souls are set on fire with God's love as they play with their family Nativity sets.

The Holy Father continues: "I would like now to reflect on the various elements of the nativity scene in order to appreciate their deeper meaning. First, there is the background of a starry sky wrapped in the darkness and silence of night. We represent this not only out of fidelity to the Gospel accounts, but also for its symbolic value. We can think of all those times in our lives when we have experienced the darkness of night. Yet even then, God does not abandon us, but is there to answer our crucial questions about the meaning of life. Who am I? Where do I come from? Why was I born at this time in history? Why do I love? Why do I suffer? Why will I die? It was to answer these questions that God became man. His closeness brings light where there is darkness and shows the way to those dwelling in the shadow of suffering (cf. Luke 1:79)."

We can drift through life dodging and repressing these critical existential questions of life. We can live blindly and superficially.

Our Catholic belief in the unity of the Nativity and the Crucifixion, the Creche and the Cross, Bethlehem and Golgotha keeps our lives centered and focused on the things that really count in our short time on earth – the Last Things (Death, Judgment, Heaven and Hell) and a belief in the Eternal Joy of Heaven, our true home.

The Holy Father continues to press the existential questions: "The presence of the poor and the lowly in the nativity scene remind us that God became man for the sake of those who feel most in need of his love and who ask him to draw near to them. Jesus, 'gentle and humble in heart' (Matthew 11:29), was born in poverty and led a simple life in order to teach us to recognize what is essential and to act accordingly. The nativity scene clearly teaches that we cannot let ourselves be fooled by wealth and fleeting promises of happiness. We see Herod's palace in the background, closed and deaf to the tidings of joy. By being born in a manger, God himself launches the only true revolution that can give hope and dignity to the disinherited and the outcast: the revolution of love, the revolution of tenderness. From the manger, Jesus proclaims, in a meek yet powerful way, the need for sharing with the poor as the path to a more human and fraternal world in which no one is excluded or marginalized."

May our prayer, silent contemplation and creative family catechesis of the Nativity scene help us to be instruments of a Gospel revolution of humility, charity, mercy, tenderness, and solidarity with the sick, the poor and the suffering.

May our commitment to "holiness and mission" bless our contemplative Synodal listening and our Eucharistic Revival and Evangelization. Merry Christmas and Happy New Year to you and your families!


