To the People of God of the Diocese of Rockville Centre:

Merry Christmas to you and your families!

Last Christmas, we celebrated the 800th anniversary of that glorious and historic night when St. Francis of Assisi arranged the first Nativity creche scene in a small cave outside the Italian village of Greccio in Italy.

St. Francis was inspired to do this after visiting the historical place of Christ's birth on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land - the humble stable in a Bethlehem cave.

The large creche set in St. Peter's Square last year commemorated this 800th anniversary by having the figure of St. Francis of Assisi expressing adoration, awe and wonder across the Crib from Mary and

Last September, we celebrated the 800th Anniversary of St. Francis receiving the gift of the "stigmata" - the mystical wounds of Christ in his hands, feet and side. In 2026, we will celebrate the 800th anniversary of St. Francis' death.

There is always a powerful connection between the Manger Crib and the Golgotha Cross of our Savior. St. Francis of Assisi lived this connection so powerfully.

In Admirabile Signum, Pope Francis writes: "Indeed, the place where this first nativity scene was enacted expresses and evokes these sentiments... from the time of its Franciscan origins, the nativity scene has invited us to 'feel' and 'touch' the poverty that God's Son took upon himself in the Incarnation. Implicitly, it summons us to follow him along the path of humility, poverty and self-denial that leads from the manger of Bethlehem to the Cross. It asks us to meet him and serve him by showing mercy to those of our brothers and sisters in great need (cf. Matthew 25:31-46)." (3)

As we spiritually draw near to Bethlehem at the end of this year, we pray for those who suffer in the Holy Land and the Middle East, in Ukraine and all war-torn areas of the world.

We pray too for the persecuted Church around the world and we pray for religious liberty in our country and in all countries.

St. Francis of Assisi understood the problems of the world and more than 800 years later, after he created the first creche, he is still close to the Church and to the world.

Many of you have seen the bronze statue of Atlas directly across from St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York City.

It was created by the sculptor Lee Lawrie and installed in 1937. The sculpture portrays the mythical ancient Greek Titan Atlas holding the burden of the heavens on his shoulder.

St. Francis of Assisi is no myth, but at times he has been compared with Atlas in how, through the centuries, he carried the burdens of the Church on his shoulders with his radical and pure Gospel witness.

In fact, Pope Innocent III, after meeting St. Francis, had a dream that St. Francis was holding up St. John Lateran Basilica, the visible sign and symbol of the universal Church, amidst the storms and earthquakes of history and crisis.

Configured to Christ crucified and having lived daily with the stigmatic wounds of Christ, St. Francis helps to animate and inspire the mission of mercy of the Catholic Church through the centuries.

St. Francis of Assisi intercedes for each of us at every moment to help rebuild the Biblical and Eucharistic evangelizing mission of the Church that Jesus Himself founded on Long Island and beyond.

Merry Christmas and Happy New Year to you and your families!

May the Light and Love of the Christ Child animate and guide our global Catholic Missionary Spirit this Christmas and throughout the New Year.

A Message from Msgr. Walden...

Two of the most powerful forces in the world are truth and love. Jesus came into our world needing what we all need to live on this planet unconditional, life giving love. Twenty-one centuries after His birth, we see many sources of power in our world that did not exist at the time of His birth: power we have harnessed from the world of nature from rivers, atoms, oil, and coal. We see how we as human beings have made money in the form of paper, coins, and gold a source of success, comfort, and power. But still the ultimate source of peace, hope, joy, and unity lies in unconditional love and God's truth. Jesus in His own words said: "I am the way, the truth, and the life." (John 14:6) At times we can make outstanding sacrifices with pure love. Pure love, as we see in Jesus, does not count the cost but gives willingly, completely, and joyfully. The snags that get in the way are our own inner fears about not having enough for ourselves or a lack of appreciation for what we have received and what we can do with it.

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family and the readings for Mass in the A cycle are so simple and beautiful. Reading one from the book of Sirach (3:2-7, 12-14) has this beautiful line: "Take care of your father as long as he lives. Even if his mind fail, be considerate of him... Kindness to a father will not be forgotten." Of course this applies to our mothers as well. I had the privilege of living that out during the six months my father was on hospice before he died and my mother, who had to spend the last three months of her life in a nursing home. Our families are the seedbed of life and love. How good it is when we are wholly families with the same frame of mind and atmosphere as the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph.

It is in the family that these words from Psalm 139 come to life. Not only do they speak of God's knowledge and love for us, they speak of our love and knowledge of one another: "O Lord, you search me and you know me, you know my resting and my rising, you discern my purpose from afar. You mark when I walk or lie down, all my ways lie open to you." The love we experience through, with and for one another in our families gives us a glimpse of the pure, powerful, divine love of God for us. We begin to experience this love the first nine months of our existence in our mothers' wombs. That joy is infinitely increased as we are held, hugged, and cherished in our infancy. As we grow and mature we begin to experience the joy of loving in return. We go from the innocent joy of children to the wonder and awe of willingly sacrificing without counting the cost, seeking to love with all our heart, soul, mind,


and strength. That joy rises up when we are simply grateful to have the opportunity to give ourselves in love, simply grateful that the opportunity is there.



We are not earning our way to heaven, we are simply and sincerely putting our faith in God's love for us, sharing that love with our families and everyone in the path of our everyday lives.

Psalm 139

O Lord, you search me and you know me, you know my resting and my rising, you discern my purpose from afar. You mark when I walk or lie down, all my ways lie open to you. Before ever a word is on my tongue you know it, O Lord, through and through. Behind and before you besiege me, your hand ever laid upon me. Too wonderful for me this knowledge, too high, beyond my reach. O where can I go from your spirit, or where can I flee from your face? If I climb the heavens, you are there. If I lie in the grave, you are there. If I take the wings of the dawn and dwell at the sea's furthest end, even there your hand would lead me, your right hand would hold me fast. If I say: "Let the darkness hide me and the light around me be night," even darkness is not dark for you and the night is as clear as the day For it was you who created my being, knit me together in my mother's womb. I thank you for the wonder of my being, for the wonders of all your creation. Already you knew my soul my body held no secret from you when I was being fashioned in secret and molded in the depths of the earth. Your eyes saw all my actions, they were all of them written in your book; every one of my days was decreed before one of them came into being. To me, how mysterious your thoughts, the sum of them not to be numbered! If I count them, they are more than the sand; to finish, I must be eternal, like you. O search me, God, and know my heart. O test me and know my thoughts. See that I follow not the wrong path and lead me in the path of life eternal.

The Eucharistic Prayers are also included. It contains the assembly's responsorial psalm refrain for each



Sunday and major feast. Sunday's Word also contains the Order of Mass.

The weekday section includes the entrance antiphon, Psalm response, gospel verse, and communion antiphon for all feasts, memorials, and weekdays of the year. In addition, the Order of Mass texts (including both the Nicene Creed and the Apostle's Creed) are printed on the inside front cover for convenience.




