FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Advent 2017

SEEKING SILENCE

Dear Parish Family:

This year, these days are particularly unique. Today, December 3rd, is my sixth anniversary of Ordination to the Priesthood. Ordained on the Feast of St. Francis Xavier (which is not celebrated today because of the First Sunday of Advent this year), the past six years have been filled with graces and blessings I could never have imagined. In a special way, over the past year and a half, I have experienced two of the most traumatic and grace-filled moments of my life—the passing of my father last December 6th and the destruction of the Church building.

On the day after Thanksgiving, Cardinal Robert Sarah, the Prefect for the Congregation of Divine Worship and

Sacraments tweeted, "When the illness becomes incurable, speech no longer matters much. It is necessary to be able to keep silence, to be able to caress the suffering person affectionately so as to convey to him the closeness, warmth, and compassion of God" #ThePowerOfSilence @ndiat1. He included the picture to the right which I presume is him praying for and with a person who is ill.

That jarred me. It naturally brought me back to the experiences of my dad's suffering and passing and the stories I have had the privilege to listen to when others have spoken about similar situations. There is nothing to say. There is no more consolation to offer. Presence is all that is needed, a silent presence.



As my family and I go through a year of the "firsts" after the passing of a loved one, I find myself replaying a lot of the events of this time last year. (It's not necessarily as depressing as it sounds.) Remembering, often in silence. Some of the memories bring laughter, some tears, some consolation, some sadness. I think the picture and tweet grabbed me because I recall many moments of silence in those final hours and days. I vividly remember sitting next to my dad's bed quietly in the early morning of the day he passed. He was not necessarily able to speak and I'm not sure he knew I was even there (I bet he did). There was nothing to say. Nothing to do. No activity to undertake. Just simply the call to be quiet, to be present, to be silent.

I think of a different time, with a different spirit, six years ago. I remember leaving St. Ann's in Garden City and driving to Jones Beach before driving to St. Agnes Cathedral. In the midst of the excitement, energy, and enthusiasm (and even a little fear) of that day, I needed some time to be alone, to be quiet, to listen, to be.

Today, this December 3rd, we begin the Advent journey. It's a shorter one than other years. The Fourth Week of Advent is only about 16 or 18 hours long this year before we begin the celebration of the Vigil of Christmas. In these shortened days of light and this shortened season of Advent, there is a certain call to the quiet, a certain call to be present, a certain call just to be. So in the next few weeks, how about creating a space for silence?

Maybe...

- The radio and phone stay off a little longer in the car or in the places where they can be typically noisy.
- We can spend some time before the Blessed Sacrament during Exposition on Monday evenings or Thursday afternoons.
- We can pick up the Scriptures and quietly pray over the Word. (A friend of mine reads a chapter or two in the book of Isaiah each morning of Advent.)
- We can take some time in the quiet of the Seton Chapel during the day when we're so busy "on the road"
- We can work to just be in the presence of a loved one without the need for words
- We can visit with someone who is sick or suffering and just sit quietly by their side
- We can come to Mass a little earlier and sit quietly preparing ourselves for Mass
- And maybe some others way that will be better for you!

In the quiet, may we come to know the presence of the One who seeks to be present to us. Come Lord Jesus!

Then the Scripture, **Isaiah 9:** (lines 1-2 and 5-6) or **Isaiah**

<u>63</u> (lines 16-17 & 19) or <u>Isaiah 64</u> (lines 2-7) is read:

Reader: The Word of the Lord.

R/. Thanks be to God.

With hands joined, the leader says:

Lord our God,

we praise you for your Son, Jesus Christ:

he is Emmanuel, the hope of the peoples,

he is the wisdom that teaches and guides us,

he is the Savior of every nation.

Lord God,

let your blessing come upon us

as we light the candles of this wreath.

May the wreath and its light

be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation.

May he come quickly and not delay.

We ask this through Christ our Lord.

R/. Amen.

The blessing may conclude with a verse from "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel":

O come, desire of nations, bind in one the hearts of humankind;

bid ev'ry sad division cease

and be thyself our Prince of peace.

Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel

NEW LITURGICAL YEAR

Our new liturgical year begins this Sunday, the first Sunday of Advent. Let's review the following:

- Because we will not be in the Auditorium for more than a few months, God willing, we will NOT be getting new editions of *Breaking Bread*. This means that the readings and psalms will not be in the book.
- We have available editions of *Sunday's Word 2018*. You can pick them up and take them with you. **A free will offering of \$5.00 is requested but not required.** These books contain all of the Sunday readings as well as the psalm and antiphons for Daily Mass.
- We will need to listen well to our cantors for the Responsorial Psalm each week. If you look in the missalette you're going to be frustrated. Both the text and music will be different.
- This may be a good opportunity for each one of us, particularly as the sound is vastly improved in the Auditorium worship space. The Word is meant to be encountered as spoken! Think of it as God speaking to you. Let's work hard to listen in these weeks ahead.
- We will use a new music setting for Advent and Christmas. The *Mass of a Joyful Heart* is a little more spirited setting that has been used at our 9 a.m. and 5:30 p.m. Masses in the past. We're going to bring this to all of our liturgies in the next few seasons. We will return to the Chant settings at the beginning of Lent (February 2018).
- During the season of Advent, the Gloria is not said or sung. It creates a sense of anticipation. Store up your fervor for the Vigil of Christmas or Christmas Day.
- During the Christmas season, we will use a new Gloria that gives praise to God with a little spirit of season!

The Catechism Turns 25!!!!

10 Surprising Things in the Catechism

The Catechism of the Catholic Church was first promulgated by St. John Paul II 25 years ago, October 11, 1985. In honor of this silver anniversary, TJP would like to point out some surprising things about the Catechism. If you don't own a copy, it can be found on the Vatican website. Over the past few weeks, we have use excerpts from Bishop Barres' letter about the Catechism. This week and next, we'll take a look at this article from the Jesuit Post. I hope it surprises you and makes you smile too!

- 1. Renewing your driver's license soon? The Church encourages organ donation: "Organ donation after death is a noble and meritorious act and is to be encouraged as an expression of generous solidarity." CCC 2296
- 2. Think fake news is only a recent problem? The Catechism already condemns it: "Society has a right to information based on truth, freedom, justice, and solidarity: The proper exercise of this right demands that the content be true and within the limits set by justice and charity complete." CCC 2494
- **3.** The Catechism says we can talk of the motherhood of God: "God's parental tenderness can also be expressed by the image of motherhood, which emphasizes God's immanence, the intimacy between Creator and creature. The language of faith thus draws on the human experience of parents, who are in a way the first representatives of God for man."
- **4.** Thought lay people can't administer sacraments? In the Roman Church, the ministers of the sacrament of marriage are the couple [Footnote 2. Anyone can baptize in emergencies as well, per CCC 1256]: "According to the Latin tradition, the spouses as ministers of Christ's grace mutually confer upon each other the sacrament of Matrimony by expressing their consent before the Church." CCC 1623
- 5. The Catechism has a whole article (CCC 1928-1948) on social justice: "Society ensures social justice by providing the conditions that allow associations and individuals to obtain their due." CCC 1943

QUEREMOS BAUTIZAR A SU HIJO ... ¡¡Hoy !!!

Como católicos, creemos firmemente en la importancia y la necesidad del hermoso sacramento del Bautismo. Es realmente el fundamento de nuestra vida como cristianos. Debido a la gran importancia de este sacramento, nosotros como cristianos católicos estamos llamados a hacer todo lo que esté a nuestro alcance para asegurarnos de que a nuestros hijos no se les prive de los beneficios del Bautismo por más tiempo del que es absolutamente necesario. Hay una mentalidad entre algunos católicos de que el bautismo puede demorarse durante muchos meses o incluso años. Los motivos de esta línea de pensamiento son variados, pero todos pierden el punto fundamental de que un niño debe ser bautizado tan pronto como sea razonablemente posible. En realidad, retrasar el bautismo de un hijo durante meses o años puede ser una negligencia pecaminosa.

La Introducción al Rito del Bautismo de los Niños declara:

"En cuanto al momento del bautismo, la primera consideración es el bienestar del niño, que no puede ser privado del beneficio de el sacramento". "También dice:" Un bebé debe ser bautizado dentro de las primeras semanas después del Nacimiento."

Un cambio que debe notarse que es efectivo de inmediato en nuestra parroquia es que los niños que son traídos para el Bautismo que están por encima de la edad de la razón (7 años de edad), deberán inscribirse en el programa de dos años de educación religiosa siguiendo las pautas del Rito de iniciación cristiana (RCIA #256).
