A Message from Fr. Patrick ...

Second Sunday of Advent

I hope you had a nice Thanksgiving with your family. This year my niece hosted Thanksgiving for our family. It is always wonderful when we get to spend time together as a family. For me, Thanksgiving is very special because it is a time for us to be extra grateful for the many blessings we have received from God, especially for the gift of Redemption; for the gift of our faith and our families; and for the gift of special friends. We are also grateful for the gift of freedom here in America so that we can enjoy these gifts freely with eternity and heaven in sight, and with Jesus close by our side!

It is hard to believe that we have already entered into a new Season of Advent. Advent gives us another opportunity to redirect our attention to the Lord. It helps us to draw our hearts closer to God. With our hearts and minds on the Lord, we will be better prepared to joyfully enter a new Christmas Season. In celebrating the birth of Jesus, we celebrate the gift of life eternal because Jesus came into our world to save us and set us free from darkness, and to restore us to new and everlasting life.

For me, Advent is a very special time of the year because it really prepares us for another Christmas celebration. It reminds us how important and how essential it is to keep Christ first in our lives because it is Jesus who enriches our lives and gives our lives purpose and meaning as we continue our journey of faith. It is Jesus who restores us to wholeness and who alone is the source of joy!

Even though the world, for the most part, does not celebrate Advent, does not mean that we must do the same. I always get a laugh when I see how much earlier Christmas is being celebrated each year. There was a cartoon I saw recently where Santa was laying on the ground and a big turkey standing next to him, with one foot on him, saying "wait your turn!" How true this is in our society today.

The truth is our life is one long Season of Advent because we never know the day nor the hour when the Lord will take us home for all of eternity. But because this season is so important for us in preparing ourselves for another Christmas Feast, as well as eternity itself, the Church designates four consecutive weeks during the year for us to prepare our hearts. In fact, we must always be prepared to encounter Christ who comes into our lives each day. It is Jesus who comes daily to fill us with His life and His blessings. It is Jesus who alone is the fulfillment of all of our hopes and longings!

If this Christmas Season is going to be extra meaningful for us and our families, then so must this new Season of Advent because Advent precedes and prepares us for Christmas, a season of joyful anticipation in the coming of the Lord who brings us new hope and glad tidings.

As a Christian tradition, the wreath holds the four Advent candles. The candles represent Jesus coming as the light in darkness. One candle is lit each Sunday until all four candles are lit. As Christmas draws nearer, each candle brings a little more light into the darkness. Sometimes a white candle is lit on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day to symbolize that Jesus is with us. This can be referred to as the "Christ candle."

Each of the candles lit before Christmas represent an aspect of preparation during the season of Advent <u>The First Week of Advent Represents</u>: **Hope** Candle Name: the *Prophecy Candle*

Candle Color: Purple

Purple is the primary color associated with Advent. Within the Catholic Church it symbolizes penance, preparation, and sacrifice. During the first week of Advent we remember the Old Testament prophets who foretold of Jesus' coming with hope and anticipation.

<u>The Second Week of Advent Represents:</u> **Peace and Preparation** Candle Name: *the Bethlehem Candle* Candle Color: **Purple**

During this second week of Advent, we reflect on our lives and work on becoming better-versions-of-ourselves in preparation for Jesus' coming. We remember the journey Joseph and Mary took from Nazareth to Bethlehem.

The Third Week of Advent Represents: Joy Candle Name: the Shepherd's Candle

Candle Color: Pink

This third candle is pink and symbolizes rejoicing. During the third week of Advent we are filled with joy for the near arrival of Jesus on Christmas day. This Sunday is often called "Gaudete Sunday" as we reflect on the joy the shepherd's felt at the birth of Jesus.

The Fourth Week of Advent Represents: Love Candle Name: the Angel's Candle

Candle Color: Purple

During this final week of Advent we rejoice in the endless love that God has for us, which is made apparent in the birth of his Son. We reflect on the good news of God's love brought to us from the angel Gabriel.

Lighting Your Advent Wreath During the Week

Each day during the second week of Advent, at the evening meal (or any time), light the first and second purple candles. The following prayers accompany the lighting of the candles.

All make the sign of the cross: **In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen**. Someone at table reads the Scripture assigned to the liturgy of the day (one or both of the readings may be used).

Go to www.usccb.org to find the readings of the day. Then the Leader continues:

Leader: Lift up your hearts.

All respond: We lift them up to the Lord.

The Leader prays: God, the Father of mercies, you willed your Son to take flesh, in order to give life back to us. Bless these your gifts with which we are about to nourish our bodies, so that, receiving new strength, we may wait in watchfulness for the glorious coming of Christ. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

After the meal, the Leader says: Let us live soberly, justly, and devoutly in this world as we wait in joyful hope for the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ. All respond: For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.

Did you know ...

The statue of the Blessed Mother, located in the front of the church, was donated in the early 1940's by Edith Masury Sturgis in memory of her grandson, Toby O'Connor, who died of leukemia shortly after joining the Army during World War II.

The statue was originally situated towards the northwest portion of the church property, but later relocated to its current location when the new church was constructed in 1999. It has served as a backdrop for many photographs such as First Holy Communions, Saint John's School graduating classes, Confirmation pictures with the Bishop and certainly many other celebrations.

Readings for Next Sunday Third Week of Advent

Please look over these readings and consider these reflection questions before coming to Mass next Sunday.

First Reading + Isaiah 35:1-6A, 10

Isaiah said God would give signs to tell the Israelites of their delivery from slavery. What were these signs? What similar signs of God's loving presence are there in your life? And what about in the fields of medicine, social justice and climate change?

Second Reading + James 5:7-10

What are some qualities that patience brings with it? What does impatience bring? St. James warns his community about complaining about one another. Is this a fault peculiar to James' community? How does it relate to patience?

Gospel + Matthew 11:2-11

Does God always come into your life the way you expect? John the Baptist might have expected a mighty one and was confused by the gentle, healing Jesus. Was he called to conversion? Can Advent be a time of conversion for us to recognize new or different ways Jesus comes into our lives?
