# A message from Deacon Ed Grieb...

2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Advent 'All people shall see the Salvation of God'

This week and next, our Gospel readings focus on John the Baptist's message to repent in preparation for God's promised coming. In Luke's Gospel, as well as the other Synoptic Gospels, we hear Jesus often speak about the coming of His Kingdom...the fulfillment of God's promise to save His people and bring salvation. Advent is a time when we step back and try to focus on what that gift of salvation really means.


It's the beginning of December, and our Advent (and Christmas) preparations are underway. At last week's Masses, we lit the first candle in the our Advent wreath(s); we've also had our parish Christmas tree lighting, and two weeks ago it was so wonderful to see all the families who came over to the auditorium on Sunday morning to make Advent wreaths.

The underlying message of Advent for us to focus on, as we prepare ourselves for Christmas, is HOPE and FAITH. Faith in a better future through the Hope we carry in our hearts to experience God's love first hand.

There is a lot going on in today's Gospel passage as John begins proclaiming Christ's coming. St. Luke throws us names, geographic locations and secular leaders that can all be sort of confusing at first glance. But it helps put in perspective where and when John is preaching, and importantly, a reminder that God is and has always been present for us in this world. Just as there is a lot going on in the Gospel, there always seems to be a lot going on in our own lives... our lives are busy and hectic and can feel overwhelming at times. But as the Gospel helps remind us, GOD IS PRESENT,

calling out and trying to reach out to us to be there for us.

John the Baptist's mission was to remind



And so we stay watchful, especially during this Advent season, as we are drawn to the Incarnation and God's coming to us through His Son at that first Christmas, but also drawn to the realization that we wait in Hope for His continuing coming.

With Hope in our hearts, we watch and listen for God's presence in our lives through others we meet, those who are bring and share His grace with us and especially those in need.

This week, we also celebrate our Blessed Mother's example of deep faith. Mary didn't waiver as she listened as the angel addressed her. Though troubled and overwhelmed, she maintained the Hope and Faith she had in her heart and willingly gave God her Yes. And so we celebrate Mary's special grace and favor from God from the moment of her conception, and the special part she played in God's plan.





Remembering one who has passed away at Mass is a most noble practice calling us to pray for one who has died at the most powerful prayer we know the celebration of the Eucharist.


#### Altar Bread and Wine

As a Christian tradition, the wreath holds the four Advent candles. The candles represent Jesus coming as the light in darkness. One candle is lit each Sunday until all four candles are lit. As Christmas draws nearer, each candle brings a little more light into the darkness. Sometimes a white candle is lit on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day to symbolize that Jesus is with us. This can be referred to as the "Christ candle."

Each of the candles lit before Christmas represent an aspect of preparation during the season of Advent.

#### The First Week of Advent Represents: Hope

Candle Name: the Prophecy Candle Candle Color: Purple

Purple is the primary color associated with Advent. Within the Catholic Church, it symbolizes penance, preparation, and sacrifice. During the first week of Advent, we remember the Old Testament prophets who foretold of Jesus' coming with hope and anticipation.

#### The Second Week of Advent Represents: Peace and Preparation

Candle Name: the Bethlehem Candle Candle Color: Purple

During this second week of Advent, we reflect on our lives and work on becoming better-versions-ofourselves in preparation for Jesus' coming. We remember the journey Joseph and Mary took from Nazareth to Bethlehem.

#### The Third Week of Advent Represents: Joy

Candle Name: the Shepherd's Candle Candle Color: Pink

This third candle is pink and symbolizes rejoicing. During the third week of Advent we are filled with joy for the near arrival of Jesus on Christmas day. This Sunday is often called "Gaudete Sunday" as we reflect on the joy the shepherd's felt at the birth of Jesus.

#### The Fourth Week of Advent Represents: Love

Candle Name: the Angel's Candle Candle Color: Purple

During this final week of Advent we rejoice in the endless love that God has for us, which is made apparent in the birth of his Son. We reflect on the good news of God's love brought to us from the angel Gabriel.

#### Lighting Your Advent Wreath During the Week

Each day during the Fourth week of Advent, at the evening meal (or any time), light the first and second purple candles and the pink candle. The following prayers accompany the lighting of the candles. All make the sign of the cross: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen. Someone at table reads the Scripture assigned to the liturgy of the day (one or both of the readings may be used). Go to www.usccb.org to find the readings of the day. Then the Leader continues:

Leader: Lift up your hearts.

All respond: We lift them up to the Lord.

The Leader prays: God, the Father of mercies, you willed your Son to take flesh, in order to give life back to us. Bless these your gifts with which we are about to nourish our bodies, so that, receiving new strength, we may wait in watchfulness for the glorious coming of Christ. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

After the meal, the Leader says: Let us live soberly, justly, and devoutly in this world as we wait in joyful hope for the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ.

All respond: For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.



# A Message from Msgr. Walden...

"They shall beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks; One nation shall not raise the sword against another, nor shall they train for war again." Those words are from the first reading at Mass this past Monday (Isaiah 2:1-5) and seem so out of touch with reality and the world situation we live in today. Are these words too good to be true? Are they too simple happen? The hope these prophetic words express are exactly what Jesus came into our world to accomplish. In the over 2000 years since he was born, and over 2700 years since Isaiah proclaimed these words with great hope, they are clearly not a reality. As much as Adam and Eve needed God's mercy and we need the forgiveness of God today, God has never stopped offering these words of hope. As long as they fall on deaf ears and unbelieving hearts, we are doomed to see the discord, anger, violence, hatred, and distrust that is reported in the news media everyday.

Where is the answer to the above prophecy of Isaiah? Jesus came to bring us salvation from all that separates us from God and one another. He did not do it by preaching doom and gloom but goodness, love, mercy, and reconciliation. We celebrate Christmas in our homes by putting up manager scenes. That is good see, but what do they really portray? Two conflicting messages! Jesus was born in a stable because there was no room for him in the inn. The most powerful person who ever walked the face of the earth did so because He loves us more than we could ever believe and hope for. Just like today, the message is "not wanted" but needed more than ever. The challenge we face and opportunity that is

right in front of us everyday is the same challenge and opportunity that has




been present since He came into our world to be our savior, brother, and hope for life in this world and in the world to come when we die. His words on the cross need to be taken to heart as much as they were when He uttered them lovingly in some of His last words on the cross: "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do." (Luke 23:34)

Peace and hope come when we are open and willing to love each other as God loves includes That love patience, understanding and a deep desire to resolve differences with humility, God's truth, and open hearts. That is exactly why Jesus is our Savior. Yes, we are human and have a rough road to walk together at times, but the gift of Jesus in our hearts illumines the path to peace, reconciliation, and unity with God and one another. The more we see the true meaning of Christmas in our everyday lives and all year long, the more real, meaningful, hopeful, grateful, and joyful our personal Christmas celebrations are. 
