A Message from the Director of Family Ministries...

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, a feast that brings our Christmas season to a close and our lives as Christians to an amazing opening. This feast marks the beginning of Jesus' public ministry and reveals something profound about God's love for humanity. There are so many questions, both asked and answered this day. It's difficult to tease out where to begin.

Perhaps we should start with the most obvious question, "Why was Jesus baptized?" Initially, like John the Baptist, we may find ourselves speechless, confused, not understanding why the Son of God would be baptized in the Jordan River by his cousin. It just doesn't make sense. But let's take a few moments to think about what we know about our God and what happened that day. We know God's love for His people. We know Jesus...His selflessness, His obedience, His humility, His mission. We know the Scripture and what was prophesied. And in light of all that we know...this day had to happen. And honestly...it makes perfect sense.

When Jesus chose to step into the waters of the Jordan, He had no sins for which He had to repent. Yet, He chose to stand among sinners, entering fully into our human condition. This act was not about His need for cleansing, but about His desire to be with us—to share in our struggles, our hopes, and our journey toward God. It was an outward sign of His acceptance of God's will for His life and His obedience to be the fulfillment of Old Testament prophecy. It was the beginning of His public ministry. The beginning of His sacrifice for us.

But why did it happen that way?

At the moment, the heavens opened, the Spirit descended like a dove, and the Father's voice declared: "This is my beloved Son; with whom I am well pleased." And so, the Three Persons in the Holy Trinity were publicly revealed, as was Jesus' true identity, as the Son of God and His mission. And for many....new search for truth began.

But how does this beautiful Feast serve as an amazing beginning of our lives as Christians?

The Baptism of the Lord, not only reveals who Jesus is, but it also serves as a reminder of who we are through our own baptism—beloved children of God, called to live in His grace.

Through His Baptism, Jesus teaches us to live out our call to holiness with humility. Jesus lowered Himself to walk with us. He was baptized, though sinless, to show us the way that we can be freed of our sins. He demonstrates that humble service is true greatness.

Jesus demonstrates obedience. He does what He is required to do, without question or resistance, even if it doesn't seem to "make sense" to those around Him. He follows through so that "all righteousness can be fulfilled."

As we reflect on this feast, let us remember that our baptism is not just a past event—it is a living reality. Every day, we are invited to renew our "yes" to God, to live as His children, and to bring His light into the world. What a gift! What a privilege! What a challenge! But we can do it. Let's work together and pray each other through.

And while we're praying together, let us lift up all those who were baptized into our parish family during the past year! In January 2025, Deacon Ed and I were graciously asked to "revive" the Baptism Ministry here at St. John's. This once vibrant ministry, had been forced into a hiatus during covid, and the personal connections that had been the heart and soul of the SJE Baptism Ministry were reduced to online sacrament preparation and email communication with the families of those to be baptized.

We knew it was time to return to a more personal ministry. And so, with some experience, a small team of wonderful parishioners and the God-given burning desire to joyfully build up the Body of Christ, we set out to do what we could to renew the Baptism Program. With a year of growing pains under our belts, our team can gratefully report that we have spoken with countless couples, held more than 20 Baptism preparation classes, provided "Greeters" at almost every single Baptism, and since January 2025, have welcomed 155 babies and young children into our parish family. It is truly AMAZING!

As we join together in prayer, let us pray for these families and their children...that the Baptisms celebrated will begin their mission to live as the beloved children of God!

FYI: Next weekend we have invited those baptized in 2025 to come to the 10:00 Mass on Sunday 1/18, as a means by which to reunite all the young families and to connect them more closely to our parish family. Please welcome them with that second-to-none SJE love and joy! That's it for now!

Thank You Jesus for the gift of Your Baptism...and for the blessing of ours!

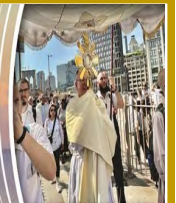

The Life Center is a pregnancy care center that consults with women and men who are experiencing an unplanned pregnancy. Do you know that they provide:

- ⇒ Free pregnancy test kits
- ⇒ Free Sonogram
- ⇒ Maternity housing with eligibility requirements referrals
- ⇒ Medical care referrals
- ⇒ Male advocates available to speak with fathers
- ⇒ Material aid including car seats, cribs, clothing, diapers, and many other baby needs

We are asking that you pick up a baby bottle in two weeks, fill it with your donations, and **return it the weekend of February 7 & 8**. Please make checks payable to the **Life Center of Long Island**.

More importantly, we are asking you to recite the prayer attached to the baby bottle. Prayer brings about something very powerful at the Life Center... *a change of a mother's heart!* We believe these prayers lead abortion-minded women to reach out to the Life Center in the beginning of their pregnancy.

Walden called the children up to witness the event and he conducted an intriguing conversation with each of the kings. Not only did the children learn why each of the kings followed the star, but they also learned that our Catholic faith is all over the world! Msgr. Walden asked each of the kings to reveal his true identity, and it was clear to everyone during those conversations, that the "wise men" of our parish still seek Jesus! Msgr. Walden reminded the children that THEY are the MOST PRECIOUS gifts for their parents... for all of us at St. John's ...and of course for Jesus! Then the children were sent "on mission"...to return to their families and give their parents a BIG HUG! It was a wonderful celebration of the Feast of the Epiphany!

A Message from Monsignor Walden...



When we hear the word baptism, we usually think of infants being brought to a church to receive that sacrament. Today, we celebrate the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Obviously, Jesus had no need to be baptized because he has been eternally the Son of God, the second person of the most Holy Trinity we invoke every time we bless ourselves in the name of the Father and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. As Jesus approached John the Baptist in today's Gospel (Matthew 3:13-17), John recognized that there is no need with these words: "I need to be baptized by you, and yet you are coming to me?" Obviously, Jesus knew people were going to John the Baptist with a hunger we all have - to come to know and experience the goodness and love of God and to live more closely in union with Him.

Jesus did not come to be baptized by John just to see what it was like or to see how people responded. Jesus did not come to watch, observe, criticize or direct us but to be one with us so we can truly be one with Him. Through the vision and gift of faith, we come to see and experience that Jesus came to encourage, enrich, enlighten, listen, forgive, proclaim and be the Good News of God's loving, life-giving presence. Living in union with Him as baptized members of God's family, we come to see and experience all we can do through, with, and in Him. To accept the invitation to live in union with Him and one another in that process is to accept to walk and think with Him and to allow Him to walk and think with us. He is not big brother who is watching. He is the Son of God who invites us to be an intimate part of who He is and, even more, to welcome Him to be intimate part of who we are.

After the four weeks of Advent and the two weeks and a few days of celebrating Christmas, the feast of the Holy Family, the Motherhood of Mary, Epiphany, and the Baptism of the Lord, tomorrow liturgically goes into the first week of Ordinary Time. Yet, the past days we

have been celebrating makes everyday far more than a day in ordinary time. Jesus is the gift of God Himself who opens minds and hearts to all that is truly good and life-giving in our lives with one another. There is a lot of information today about artificial intelligence. Our faith gives us a far greater gift - the very presence of God and His love, wisdom, mercy, truth, as we pray, receive the Sacraments, and read and reflect on the sacred words of Scripture. No one and nothing else will satisfy our inner longing for life, love, and meaning than Jesus Christ and all that He is and all that we can be through, with, and in Him personally and as His people.

I conclude with the Renew 2000 prayer which simply and beautifully puts our life with God and one another in perspective, a prayer I pray everyday.

Gracious God and Father,

We are your people embraced by your love.

We thank you for your presence with us
throughout all time.

As we celebrate the 2000 years since the birth of
Jesus, your Son: Create us anew.

Liberate us from all that keeps us from you.

Send your Holy Spirit, enabling us
to recreate our world and restore justice.

Heal us from every form of sin and violence.

Transform us to live your Word more
profoundly. Reconcile us so enemies, become
friends. Awaken us to the sacred;

Nurture our relationships;

Enliven our parishes; reunite our families. Fill
us with joy to celebrate the fullness of life.

Empower us to be a community of love
growing in your likeness by the
grace of Christ our Lord.

Amen.

The Baptism of the Lord

Is 42:1-4, 6-7 | Acts 10:34-38 | Mt 3:13-17

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

We hear in today's Gospel that at the moment of Jesus' baptism, "a voice came from the heavens, saying, 'This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased.'" We can hear these words as a simple proclamation of who Jesus is — the beloved Son of God — but also as a proclamation of who we are called to be: the beloved adopted sons and daughters of God. I sometimes forget that I am also called beloved. I mistakenly think that my value depends on my accomplishments or on my faithfulness, but the truth is that my status as beloved is due to being made in the image of my Creator. If I allow myself to absorb the full meaning of that, it will not only affect how I view myself but also how I relate to others. But Christ didn't come only to show us the truth about who we are. His coming also invites us to see one another as beloved. As Peter reminds us in our second reading, "God shows no partiality." May we strive to see the belovedness that God bestows on us and on all people.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Jesus entered fully into our humanity, including entering into communion with each of us through our common baptism, to allow for us to one day share in the perfect exchange of love of the Trinity. Our call is to take on Christ's mission of love here on earth — to speak and act in a way that proclaims the truth of who God is and who he has made us to be. How can we remind our families, our neighbors, and even our enemies of their nature as beloved children of God? And by recognizing our own nature as beloved, we allow God's grace to flow through us. We then trust that God will make himself known as the source of love itself.

REFLECT

Take time this week to reflect on what it means to be a beloved son or daughter of God. What would it be like to hear, "You are my beloved child, with whom I am well pleased"? Once we root ourselves in this truth we can ask ourselves, "What act of kindness, what consoling word might I offer, what goodness might I do for others around me to help them experience a glimpse of their own belovedness?" Then, do it!

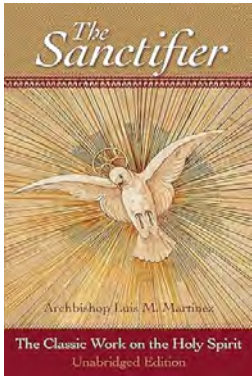

Our Baptism preparation program now includes the following components:
