## **RESTORATION UPDATES**

We are continuing to make great progress in the restoration of our Church building:

- Our HVAC installation work continued and is nearing completed in the Church.
- We met with our sound company and will have a new and VERY IMPROVED sound system in the restored Church.
- We began the process of preparing designs for the tile work necessary in the restored Church.
- Our floor company met with the other contractors and will begin work during the first week of February.
- Our pews and chairs are in the process of being constructed and ready for installation in mid-March.
- The installation of our fire prevention systems should be completed in the next few weeks.
- Wiring and installation of our new lighting systems is continuing.

Look for some displays in the next few weeks as we seek your input for the choice of colors and some

other designs in the restored Church building.









## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Gratitude. Eucharist.

## "Thank you for saying the Mass."



Last Saturday, we celebrated the Funeral Mass for Ruth Grammas in the OLQA Auditorium (picture to the left). To be honest, I've been a little sad ever since. Ruth, and her beloved husband, John are two of the pillars here at SJE. Married for over 73 years, they pray with (and for) us every day. They are generous beyond measure. They are witnesses to what it is to be a Catholic people of faith like few others. I cannot say I knew Ruth very well but over the past year and a half I have come to know a pretty incredible person.

I had the privilege and honor to preach and preside at the Mass. I talked about one of Ruth's every day lines, or mottos, a line that all priests here could attest to – "Thank you for

saying the Mass." Each day, as Ruth left daily Mass, she would say that line to the Presider, both affirming us and the privilege we had to pray together.

Gratitude. Eucharist. They were hallmarks of Ruth Grammas' life. Every day – almost without exception – she and John would be at daily Mass and praying with us on Saturday evenings or Sunday mornings. They did not take the celebration of the Mass for granted. Over the past few months, they helped us to get a ramp up quickly to Seton Chapel and strongly encouraged us to get the ramp up in the Auditorium. Why? Because she did not want to be far from the celebration of the Eucharist, the coming together of the Body of Christ.

Gratitude. Eucharist. They should be hallmarks of our lives too. I fear sometimes they're not. I am going to speak for myself but I am going to bet you can relate to some of these too.

I recognize that I do not always offer thanks to God for the many gifts he has given me. I'm too busy, too caught up in myself. I forget. I think God really had nothing to do with this gift or that one. I take all that God has given me for granted.

The truth is that same attitude can permeate our celebration of the Mass. I'm too busy to prepare or come early. Too caught up in myself and all I must do, that coming to offer worship and praise to God with the community of faith is going to take more time than I can afford. I forget the gift of the Eucharist – the risen and glorified Christ – I am privileged to receive at Mass. I forget what is before me. I forget who is before me. I take the Eucharist for granted.

It is not often blatant. It is often much subtler. That's generally the way evil and darkness work. Here's a simple example. We start coming late to Mass and then a little later. Then we fail to come on one Sunday or another and so on. During

Mass, we get distracted by our phones or the million thoughts that are racing through our mind. We're looking to "get it over with". We tell ourselves, "Well I can try and go next week."

Or we fail to see our own role in the liturgy – our call to participate. I come to watch the priest. Or I come to listen to a certain music group. I fail to see my role in "praying the Mass". I get distracted by this liturgical preference or that one. I don't like this liturgical space or that one. I don't try to get there early and am content with getting there when I can. I fail to read the readings ahead of time. And so on...

Can you see how it happens? We start to take the gift of the Eucharist for granted. Maybe you see some of these things or others creeping in. I know I do at times and have to work to correct them. As we begin this season of Ordinary Time, maybe it is a good time to renew our awareness and celebration of the Eucharist. There is nothing ordinary about it. Perhaps look at one area for you that needs improvement and start that process.



Recently, Pope Francis has given some beautiful audiences (talks) on Wednesdays in Rome about the Mass. I'm going to start publishing parts of them each week. Take some time to read them. I think you might smile and it might help you – as it has me – to catch any steps that I might be taking the Eucharist for granted. They're easy to enter into so maybe consider sharing it with a family member or friend who has been away from the Church for a while.

Thank God for the gift of Ruth Grammas. She and so many others call us to be grateful...grateful to God for the many gifts in our lives, most especially the gift of the Eucharist.

and 1 to 8:00 p.m.


Friday – Sunday: 9:30 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.


