FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Do Whatever He Tells You!

STONE JARS

Dear Parish Family:

In my room, I have a painted tile from Assisi of the Wedding Feast at Cana. I tried to take a picture of it. I hope it came out well. I'm not exactly an art critic so I cannot speak to the various aspect of the piece. Two things, related to one another, struck me and continue to strike me each morning when I begin the day and look at this image—the way Mary stands out and the significance of those stone jars.



Those stone jars were the jugs used for the Jewish ceremonial washings. They would have been filled with the water that had been used to remove filth

and dirt - perhaps spiritual but likely material too. Even if the water in those stone jars had been changed the remnant of filth would have remained. Yet, where does the best wine of the wedding come from? From those jars that represented the places in need of cleansing comes the best of wine!

This is true with us if we admit it. I will be the first to say I'm not always so thrilled about acknowledging this truth. I don't want to go through this tough time, admit this fault, acknowledge this sin...avoid, deflect, blame, excuse this is the easier way. That is so often our path, no? In today's Gospel, we are lead right there.

From the old water of impurity comes the new wine, the best wine. It is an offer of hope to us, no? In the places of darkness and pain, sin and suffering, humiliation and self-hatred comes the potential, if we are willing, for God to do amazing and incredible things. There can be many such miracles if we are open.

I think of that tonight as I write from the group home where I volunteer. Having just celebrated Mass with those who have long histories of addiction, abuse, violence, and more who live here, I never fail to be humbled in the ways they are trying to take what has been impure and bring the best from it with God's help. They inspire to be real about the struggles and battles in my own journey.

The house is empty right now as I type because many are at 12-step meetings joining others will filled stone jars of impurity working together to find recovery, healing and dependence on God—the best. What we can do for one another from our brokenness is...miraculous!

To whom shall we turn? We turn to the one who see the problem (no wine) and brings it to her Son. She sees in it us too. Like any mother, she knows! I think of the times when I get a text from my own Mom, "Just thinking of you. Haven't heard from you. Hope things are OK!" I often shake my head saying to myself, "How did she know?" It is the same with Mary. She already knows about the filth and the dirt and brokenness and the pain. She sees it. She sees, too, what it can become when we "do whatever he tells us."

If you're reading this letter (and made it this far) and you're not turning to Mary, maybe today is the day. Find a simple way to begin - a Hail Mary before you go to bed, maybe a decade of the Rosary in the car or after daily Mass, lighting a candle in the Marian shrine, just holding rosary beads without saying anything (sometimes a good idea as we sleep) and more. Find some way to draw closer to Mary who also brings us to her Son She also, as we pray with the Gospel brings her Son to us.

This weekend, too, I want to take a moment to thank our Cana Care Crew. This gospel and this line from Mary is what inspired the name. Over the past near year and a half, they have cleaned, welcomed, purified, assisted, guided, put up with some tough moments, and adapted to change after change. They continue now by helping us to bring gifts to the altar and to the poor and so much more. How blessed is our parish for those in the Cana Care Crew. (And a special shout out to the ushers who have joined the Cana Care Crew!).

Let us not run away from the dirt and filth of our lives. Rather's let try to bring it to Jesus and never be afraid to ask Mary for help.

Please, if you can, say a prayer for me.

LITURGICAL PRACTICES, GOOD HEALTH AND COMMON SENSE

As we come to celebrate Mass together each week during these winter days, it's a good time to review some common-sense liturgical practices and issues, to help everyone stay healthy and to care for one another.

• MASKS ARE NOW REQUIRED IN ALL BUILDINGS, INCLUDING THE CHURCH.

As I wrote a few weeks ago, I respect and honor that there are many opinions about this. I do not wish to get into any debates or stoke anyone's ire. For me, particularly, as I hear more of our parishioners becoming more anxious about the risk of sickness to themselves and others, I believe it offers another layer of protection and another layer of care and concern for the other. If it is going to even offer the tiniest amount of protection or comfort for another, is there a reason I would not do it? (I do understand there are medical reasons that some cannot wear a mask. If this is the case, please do your best to keep a safe social distance from others.)

Thank you for wearing a mask at Sunday Mass and at other parish liturgies and events.

- <u>Not feeling great</u>, <u>STAY HOME!</u> Please do not take any chances for your sake or anyone else's! Join us via social media or watch Mass on the Catholic Faith Network. The risks are too great for you and for others in these days. There is no obligation to attend Mass if you are not well; it is not a sin to miss Mass for this reason. (Also, there is no need to go to Confession if you miss Mass because you are sick.)
- Entering the Church: You must enter through the main fellowship doors with your mask on. Please sanitize your hands, take a worship aid and enter the church. Remember, you may leave your gifts for the offertory as you enter and as you leave.
- <u>Holy Communion</u>: Priests, deacons and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion wash and sanitize their hands before Mass begins and immediately before distribution of Holy Communion. When Extraordinary Ministers go to their station, they place the vessel on the small table near that station and sanitize their hands before distributing Holy Communion.
- Communion from the Chalice: The distribution of the Precious Blood remains suspended at this time.
- <u>Greeting of Peace</u>: The greeting of peace has been reinstituted. You do NOT need to shake hands to exchange the sign of peace if you are not comfortable.


End of Year Tax Statements
